LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Dear Editor

At a recent budget meeting, County Council passed the spending of about \$150,000 for an engineering report to extend Highway 616, one mile west of current paving. As usual, no data was presented or provided to justify this expenditure. Usually paving follows such a report (approximately \$1.5 million per mile).

A look at a county map (circa 2014) shows some revealing data.

a. Few owners live along this mile (one of which already has pavement on one side);

b. A land owner near this mile is B. Guyon;

c. My information is that a sub-division permit has been applied for on a Guyon parcel;

d. The road itself basically goes nowhere (how many of these do we need?).

Have we seen this game before?

How does this meet the concept of the "greatest good'? Any driver can attest to roads in his/her division that need grading. \$1.5 million would go a long way to making many roads safe, rather than providing pavement to two or three residents.

This raises some serious questions.


Since Mr. Guyon is a primary beneficiary of this proposal, did he declare a pecuniary interest and remove himself from the debate and voting on the matter?

It appears this Council (like those in the past) do not understand the difference between need and want. We all need a road to our residence; few need pavement. It is a luxury and must have guidelines for its application, such as a traffic count of 1500 vehicles/day and other significant factors, before it is considered. Guidelines have been published as early as 2005 that suggested "developing a system-wide improvement strategy to prioritize works." If such a system is in place and followed, competition among/between divisions would be limited. Again, think NEED.

It seems to be time to be thinking about the next Reeve and Council!

Village of Breton Bylaw 20-06 Sidewalk Maintenance Bylaw

The Village of Breton Sidewalk Maintenance Bylaw was updated at the November 12th, 2020 Council Meeting. The Bylaw in its entirety is on the village webpage at www.breton.ca. Portions of the bylaw read as.

Section 2 Definitions

a) "Sidewalk" - means that part of a highway especially adapted to the use of, or ordinarily used by pedestrians, and includes that part of a highway between the curb line (or the edge of the roadway, where there is no curb line) and the adjacent property line, whether or not paved or improved;

Section 3 Sidewalk Maintenance

a) All Persons owning or occupying property within the Village shall remove and clear away all snow, ice, dirt or any other obstruction from the Sidewalks situated on land adjacent to the property owned or occupied by them within **forty-eight (48) hours** after every occurrence. The aforementioned forty-eight (48) hours shall mean all days except Sunday.

b) No Person shall place, or permit to be placed, snow, ice or any other obstruction, onto any Roadway or Sidewalk.

Section 4 Violations and Penalties

a) That failure to comply with any section of this Bylaw shall constitute an offence, the penalty for which shall be a fine of \$100.00 payable to the Village of Breton.
b) That in the event of any person failing to comply with Section 3, the Village may take whatever action or measure necessary to remedy the contravention of this bylaw in accordance with sections 545 and 549 of the Municipal Government Act.

c) The expenses and costs of any action or measure taken by the Village is an amount owing to the Village of Breton by the person who contravened Section 3 of this bylaw and in accordance with Sections 545 and 549 of the *Municipal Government Act*, the Village will have costs charged to the owner of the property.

d) An Enforcement Officer is hereby authorized and empowered to issue a Violation Tag to any person, who the Enforcement Officer has reasonable and probable grounds to believe has contravened any provision of this bylaw.

The cost of counselling can be a barrier for many individuals and families. This subsidy is available to those who do not have access to coverage through health benefits or employee benefits, such as an Employee Assistance Plan (EAP), and whose family income is less than \$75,000 per year. Fees are determined according to a sliding scale based on income and family size. Fees range from \$15 per session to \$50 per session. Counselling services are provided through a partnership with Karunia Counselling from Leduc. If you can not financially afford the fees, please contact our office to discuss your individual situation.


Is Seeing Believing?
