

# Thorsby Taylor Park Committee Successful in Securing Funding From Carol Rempel

A huge thank you to Leduc Parks & Recreation for accepting our grant request of \$500 for the planning and development of Taylor Park. This demonstrates the importance and strength of regional cooperation.

In the spring of 2019, a wonderful gift was given to the community by Bob Taylor who donated land towards the development of an arts and cultural park in the downtown area. The vision is to provide exceptional opportunities for both cultural and community gatherings, markets, and festivals (Post COVID).

"We are pleased to support the plans for the development of land to be known as Taylor Park, which through the efforts of local community groups will become a genuine asset and focal point for our community for many years to come, and a true community park in all aspects" was written in a letter of support from our previous CAO. It was also "Moved by Councillor Gilbert that Council support the notion of development of Taylor Park in principal based on the understanding there is no cost to the town" At the July 23, 2019 council meeting. Therefore, the Taylor Park committee was formed. Our first fundraiser called "the Spirit of Thorsby" was originally going to be the "Taste of Thorsby" but according to Deepak "this is not just about food this is about everybody, we should call this event 'Spirit of Thorsby'" and we all agreed. This successful event on September 21, 2019 raised \$9,251.45 towards our park. "The Spirit of Thorsby was one pure effort which was made to lay a solid foundation of Taylor Park's Journey"

Public engagement opportunities were offered at this event as well as on our FB Page. Carol Rempel, our chair, also went door to door to many local businesses for their input. A draft plan was drawn up by Nicolas Moffat from Leduc County Parks & Recreation and was presented to council.


Proposed Phase 1 were all in-kind donations (Fall of 2019) - a gazebo (Arctic Spas), power pole & labour (Nuline & Bascik Electric) and a custom fire pit (Westower), all elements needed for Thorsby's annual Christmas in the Village. Proposed Phase 2 (Spring of 2020) a stage, shrubs, flowers, and a mural partially donated by a talented local artist Janine Macintosh. Some other recommendations were solar lighting, brick walkways, statue of Thor, park benches, picnic tables, a BBQ pad and a water feature.

In October 2019, our planning and fundraising committee was put on hold by the Thorsby Town Council but once we are approved to move forward, we are excited to work with our new CAO, Lawson Consulting, Thorsby Mayor and Council and our community partner Communities in Bloom. Our hope is to inspire and ignite the hearts and minds of our community through the power of arts and culture. In working together, we are building a strong, more engaged community for all... where people want to live, work and play.

# Whom Should We Obey?

It appears as though believers in The Lord Jesus Christ are in a difficult situation. We are now restricted, by government orders, from obeying the commandments of The Lord Jesus Christ. The government says: No gathering together, no home meetings, only very small church services. The Word of God says: Hebrews 10:22-25 Let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience, and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering; (for he is faithful that promised;) And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works: Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching. The bible is very specific in that last sentence; "Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together". The word of God tells us that we must get together to help each other, and encourage one another in our faith in Him. Jesus also told us to go into all the world and preach the gospel. Mark 16:15 And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. Matthew 28:18-20 And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen. It is not possible to preach the gospel and train up new believers without gathering together. We can't obey government orders and The Creator of The Heaven and Earth at the same time. The government says stay 2 meters apart. Jesus says lay hands on the sick and they shall recover. Mark 16:17-18 And these signs shall follow them that believe; In my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues; They shall take up serpents; and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them; they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover. We can't lay hands on the sick from 2 meters away. It appears as though the government is requiring believers to obey them rather than our Creator. Who then should we obey?

The twelve disciples had similar problems, perhaps we can learn from them, after all they did write much of the New Testament. The rulers of the day locked them in jail for peaching the gospel, as recorded here in Acts. Acts 5:16-20 There came also a multitude out of the cities round about unto Jerusalem, bringing sick folks, and them which were vexed with unclean spirits: and they were healed every one. Then the high priest rose up, and all they that were with him, (which is the sect of the Sadducees,) and were filled with indignation, And laid their hands on the apostles, and put them in the common prison. But the angel of the Lord by night opened the prison doors, and brought them forth, and said, Go, stand and speak in the temple to the people all the words of this life. The angel of The Lord released them from prison, and commanded them to go and preach, and that is exactly what they did. As you can imagine the rulers were not impressed, and had them arrested again. Here is what happened next.

#### Acts 5:27-32

And when they had brought them, they set them before the council: and the high priest asked them, [28] Saying, Did not we straitly command you that ye should not teach in this name? and, behold, ye have filled Jerusalem with your doctrine, and intend to bring this man's blood upon us. [29] Then Peter and the other apostles answered and said, We ought to obey God rather than men. [30] The God of our fathers raised up Jesus, whom ye slew and hanged on a tree. [31] Him hath God exalted with his right hand to be a Prince and a Saviour, for to give repentance to Israel, and forgiveness of sins. [32] And we are his witnesses of these things; and so is also the Holy Ghost, whom God hath given to them that obey him. So there it is as spoken by Peter. "We ought to obey God rather than men." But what about Romans chapter 13?

Well, I am glad you asked. In Romans chapter 13 we are instructed to be subject to the higher powers, and that includes the government.

Romans 13:1-7

Let every soul be subject unto the higher powers. For there is no power but of God: the powers that be are ordained of God. [2] Whosoever therefore resisteth the power, resisteth the ordinance of God: and they that resist shall receive to themselves damnation. [3] For rulers are not a terror to good works, but to the evil. Wilt thou then not be afraid of the power? do that which is good, and thou shalt have praise of the same: [4] For he is the minister of God to thee for good. But if thou do that which is evil, be afraid; for he beareth not the sword in vain: for he is the minister of God, a revenger to execute wrath upon him that doeth evil. [5] Wherefore ye must needs be subject, not only for wrath, but also for conscience sake. [6] For for this cause pay ye tribute also: for they are God's ministers, attending continually upon this very thing. [7] Render therefore to all their dues: tribute to whom tribute is due; custom to whom custom; fear to whom fear; honour to whom honour. As mentioned in verse 3, the rulers referred to in this passage are rulers that are enforcing good laws, and punishing evil works. Verse 4 tells us that the ruler is the minister of God to us for good, and that we should be afraid of the ruler if we are doing evil. Whose idea of good, do you think God is talking about? That would be God's idea of good, of course. So the higher powers in Romans 13 are powers that are implementing and enforcing law that is good in God's opinion, such law would have to be in agreement with The Word of God. God can not ask us to obey a law that is contrary to his own laws and commandments. Clearly Romans chapter 13 is telling us to obey government law that is in alignment with his own law.

As believers in The Lord Jesus Christ we are definitely in a difficult position. However the answer to the question: "Whom should we obey" should be an easy one. I think Peter said it best: "We ought to obey God rather than men".


