



Now that the holiday kerfuffle is over with, and we wait while the sun comes back, it's a good time to snuggle into your favourite chair and read something to take your mind completely off COVID-19. King Solomon is said to have observed that "of making many books there is no end" --and that was well before printing-presses --so finding something to read is no problem. However, you might, like me, be tired of contemporary novels in which two feuding characters end up in a passionate embrace wherein one's back arches involuntarily while a moan (again involuntary) escapes his/her lips. Big deal. Such light reading is best for summer. In winter, I personally prefer literature with less intellectual sugar and more fibre.

I'm partial to the 19th century, but there was some good stuff written in the 20th. (The 21st is too fresh to tell.) In the past, I've recommended A Confederacy of Dunces, by John Kennedy Toole, and I do still. It's a delightful comedy; you'll love it.

Still in the comedic mode, William Faulkner's tale of a stolen car in The Rievers is great fun to read. It takes place in the very early 20th century, when cars were first appearing on the roads, and it begins and ends in a small town, so the narrative is very cozy.

For Canadian content, there's the Deptford Trilogy by Canadian author Robertson Davies: Fifth Business The Manticore, and World of Wonders. The overall story follows the lives of three boys from a small town in Ontario, and the far-reaching consequences that ensue from a malicious prank. We're taken over topics that range from Medieval saints to the geek show at a circus. Strap yourself in. By the way, you must read the novels in order!


So wrap yourself in a shawl, equip yourself with a cup of tea, and go for it.

Facility-Based Continuing Care Review Engagement - The Province of Alberta is undertaking a review of the facility-based continuing care system. This Review will identify opportunities for changing and improving facility-based continuing care (designated supportive living and long-term care) in Alberta in order to improve the lives of continuing care residents and their families and better support staff and operators. Further, the Review will consider how best to prevent and manage episodes of transmittable illnesses that affect residents such as influenzas, the annual flu season and pandemics.

In addition to the Facility-Based Continuing Care Review, Government is also developing a new Continuing Care Act that will streamline and consolidate the many pieces of legislation that currently oversee the whole system, not just facility-based continuing care. Government will use findings from the Review engagement to inform the new Act, as well as doing small-scale targeted engagement with key stakeholders.

There is a survey for organizations and individuals involved with continuing care to share their thoughts on the facility-based continuing care system. 
