

We want to remind residents that the Town had no choice in temporarily closing the Recreation Center. This not only negatively impacts users of the facility, both county and town residents, but also includes the Family Community Support Services (FCSS) Office. We know closing the Rec Center has severely impacted not only our five employees, but both the Tiny Tots Playschool and the Pucks and Poutine Concession, as well. As soon as the Province's restrictions are lifted, we will reopen what we can as soon as possible like every municipality in the Province.

With the closure, the FCSS Department is being moved to the Town Municipal Offices to ensure the safety of our coordinator once hired. With COVID -19 guidelines in effect we encourage phone meetings as much as possible when not practical to attend in person. A private space for meetings is available with AHS guidelines, and controls will be in place to protect the confidentiality of any client. The FCSS Coordinator will be available for two days a week moving forward, as determined by the Provincial Government and Leduc County FCSS. The Village of Warburg is also on the same schedule, the Town of Calmar receives coverage three days a week.

The destructive Rant and Rave a few weeks ago created anxiety among residents and town staff and such practices will not be tolerated. We will continue to monitor Facebook rants and pass them on to the Town's Legal Team. The practice of posting misinformation and rumors can have a lasting effect on staff and the reputation of this community.

Under our current term on council, we will not have any nepotism, we will not interfere with the CAO's ability to manage as per the Municipal Government Act and we will hold everyone accountable for their actions. The town residents, every four years, have the option of electing officials they feel will do the best job for this community. Under the current MGA, which came into effect in 2017, elected officials have clearly defined roles and responsibilities.

We can assure all residents that this council will not overstep its role or shy away from its responsibilities.

We want to thank administration and public works staff who provide service every day, without complaint. We wish to extend our thanks to water plant and bylaw contractors, as well.

We wish to thank our FCSS Coordinator, who resigned last week, for all they have done for this community over the last 6 ½ years. They will be missed, and we on council wish them only the best in their future endeavors. We can assure FCSS clients that all services continue to remain in effect currently through Leduc County. The CAO has been working with Leduc County to ensure someone comes to meet clients when it's needed. We will keep everyone informed as to the next steps of hiring our new FCSS coordinator.

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MLA REPORT

from The Office of MLA Mark Smith, Member of the Legislative Assembly for Drayton Valley - Devon

Supporting responsible resource development and protecting the environment

As you may know, on June 1, 2020, the Government of Alberta rescinded the 1976 Coal Policy. The old policy had become outdated and new environmental policies and land use planning have taken its place to better protect our air, water, land and wild species. Stronger regulation and modern protections include the Environmental Enhancement Act, the Eastern Slopes Policy, Integrated Resource Plans, regional plans and sub-regional plans.

While there are many important discussions to be had on coal and the future of the industry in our province, it is critical that we have factual debates in order to get the best possible outcomes for Albertans. For instance, Alberta isn't just on pace to phase out emissions from coal used for heating purposes by 2030, we are ahead of schedule. While there is movement away from coal used for heating purposes it is a fact that the world relies heavily on metallurgical coal as a primary component in the production of steel, which is used to build everything from buildings to bridges. Alberta has significant coal resources that provide thousands of jobs in several communities across Alberta.

Recently in the news some would have you believe lands that used to be protected are now open to development, when in fact coal development continues to be restricted in former Category 1 public lands, many of which are automatically protected because they are national parks, provincial parks or other protected areas.

Some people think that recent coal policy changes means an end to restrictions on Category 2 and 3 lands, when in fact responsible coal development was always permitted on these lands, subject to environmental considerations. The Alberta Energy Regulator is a world-class organization, and will continue to work tirelessly to ensure our air, water (including our headwaters) land and wild species are protected from harm. Responsible coal development will not change our mountain landscapes as companies must adhere to strict rules around land reclamation and environmental effects: and the Piikani nation, whose people have been stewarding the eastern slopes for a millenia, recently offered their full endorsement for the Grassy Mountain Coal project, which has been under review since 2015.

We know this is an important issue to Albertans. To ensure Albertans are heard, Alberta's government has cancelled 11 leases issued in December 2020. I strongly encourage you to visit CoalHardFacts.ca to find out the facts on coal, share your thoughts and concerns, and learn more about coal and its role in our province

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Building a Bird House - FOR THE BIRDS!

This is an excellent project during COVID-19 restrictions.


The Thorsby and District Fish and Game Association, under Lumir Mottl's guidance as President and Board Chairman, starting in 1980, began this wide spread program.

Lumir held workshops at his home, at Warburg School and anywhere that community people could get together. It was like a sewing bee, but instead of needles and thread, the members brought scrap boards (3/4") nails, screws, saws, hammers and screw drivers. This project continued well into the '90's and early 2000's. Together the club became interested in recycling cardboard and paper to raise funds for the wild game reflectors on Highway 622. As you drove around the Thorsby, Sunnybrook and Warburg areas, bird house trails were very visible along highways and country roads.

In 1997, Russ and I moved to the Morrowdale farm, where he spent days in his heated workshop building bird houses for bluebirds, swallows, wrens and a few other species. At one point he cleaned, repaired and documented one hundred and fifty houses every fall. It brought him great pleasure, and the added bonus was that we did not have any mosquitos in our yard - a pleasure to enjoy in the summer.

Russ passed away in 2014, I have been looking after the remaining houses but each year there seems to be less activity. It would be great if community members could build one or two houses a year, put them up facing East along open fence lines (5 - 6 posts apart), and enjoy seeing the results each year, as they come back to the same box. Their main food source is mosquitos, a definate plus. Heavily wooded areas are not advisable, as these birds need an open area for take off and landing into the nest. I found wrens liked the nests closer to a yard site or buildings (lone trees).




