

Pre-K Programming at BES

As we look to start planning for the next school year, Breton Elementary is wanting to expand its Pre-K program. While this year was successful, in consulting with other schools in our division and looking at research, we **feel a separate Pre-K program would be more beneficial for students.**

Should there be enough interest, our Pre-K program would **run separately from the Kindergarten program. It would run 4 days a week** (Monday to Thursday) from approximately 8:30 - 11:45 and the Pre-K would have it's own classroom, as well as its own certified teacher. Much like other community pre- or play-school programs, we would **need to charge a monthly fee in order to make this happen.** The fee would be \$100 per month (Fees may be reduced to \$50 per month for children with delays or academic enrichment needs).

While that may seem like a lot, it is not significantly more than similar community programs, and it **allows children to have the following benefits**:

- quality instruction and play based programming implemented by a certified teacher
- 4 days a week allows for more consistent exposure to a language rich, play-based learning environment
- this programming will enhance your child's social, emotional, motor, and early literacy skills
- the richness of this program will help develop independence, problem solving skills as well as foster a sense of belonging and well being in your child
- a professional screening is completed to ensure that adequate support is provided in speech, language and motor skills
- children will have access to programming support from qualified Speech and Language Pathologist, as well as an Occupational Therapist (for motor skill support).

In order for this program to be able to stay at Breton Elementary **we would need 18 students enrolled.** This program is open to children who are 4 years of age by December 31. If you are interested in enrolling your child, or finding out more, we will be hosting a "virtual open house" in March (date to be determined) to allow parents to ask questions and get a better idea of what the program is about.

My Letter to Jason Kenney. Office of the Premier

Dear Albertans,

Re: The Alberta School Curriculum

From October to November 2016, Albertans were invited by the NDP government to participate in a Provincial Kindergarten to Grade 12 (K–12) Curriculum Survey. Results from a closed-ended survey of Albertans in 2016 indicated strong support for much of the content in the then-current curriculum across all subjects.

However, recently the UCP decided to review the curriculum once more. Recently a leaked document outlining proposed changes to the Alberta K to 12 curriculum came to my attention. The proposed changes are regressive, racist, not backed up by research and vastly out of step with education in most of North America. Since it is apparent that most Albertans were happy with the current school curriculum why is our government revising it?

One reason seems to be that the government wants religion back in the schools, not just any religion but the particular narrow school of thought known as Dominion Theology that many of the UCP ministers and supporters believe they have been "called" to champion and spread. However, Alberta is a liberal democracy that accepts and protects freedom of religion (and freedom from religion), supported by a political divide between the spiritual and temporal.

Since the UCP is being paid by the citizens of Alberta why are they implementing policies which clearly do not represent the views of most Albertans? Why are we paying for a curriculum review that is not needed and that we don't want? Why are non-Albertans being paid to review our curriculum when Alberta Education already has an excellent program of studies which is respected around the world and is the program of choice for international schools?

Albertans deserve a government that respects democracy, public education and freedom of religion, a government that represents Albertans. They need to focus on the very critical issues facing our province rather than on their secretive, authoritarian I urge you to challenge your premier and your MLAs to preserve our excellent curriculum and our strong public education system.



Community Volunteer Income Tax Program – FREE INCOME TAX PREPERATION - For Low Income Persons, Families, seniors and students. We will begin taking information for tax season on March 1. Although this is something, that most of us would like to avoid thinking about and doing, I am afraid that this is unavoidable. You need to file your income tax each year, even if you have no income to report. By doing this you may receive benefits that you did not know you were eligible for. Also, in the event of the death of your spouse, benefits can easily be transferred to you, if you have filled a return for the last calendar year. If you did not file a tax return in 2020 you may not be receiving benefits from the government that you are eligible for. The focus of the Community Volunteer Tax Program is to assist those individuals who have limited income. This includes seniors, families and students. If your income was in one of the following categories you may qualify for assistance.

1 person	30,000
2 person family	37,000
3 person family	40,500
4 person family	43,500

We are not able to complete returns with income from the following sources:

Capital Gains or Losses, Farming Income, Rental Income, Self-Employment, Interest exceeding \$1, 000, Bankruptcies, Deceased Persons

This service is FREE to those who qualify. If you require this service, please gather your information and bring it to the Village of Breton office Monday to Thursday between 8:30 - 4:00. Clients will be notified when your return is completed. The program will run from March 1 - April 30, 2021

We require the following information in order to complete your return:

Counselling Subsidies – Fully paid subsidies until March 31. Breton and Area FCSS is pleased to offer Counselling Subsidies.

A subsidy is available for individuals, couples and/or families who are struggling with common, everyday issues to access short-term preventative counselling services. The goal is to:

o Improve relationships with better communication and conflict resolution skills;

o Improve mood with anger management and emotional support;

o Enhance personal growth with creativity, spirituality, self-esteem, self-awareness, goal setting;

o Improve parenting skills by focusing on attachment;

o Reduce stress with life balance; and/or

Learn new skills and behaviors

The cost of counselling can be a barrier for many individuals and families. This subsidy is available to those who do not have access to coverage through health benefits or employee benefits, such as an Employee Assistance Plan (EAP), and whose family income is less than \$75,000 per year. Fees are determined according to a sliding scale based on income and family size. Fees normally range from \$15 per session to \$50 per session but all fees will be covered for appointments held before March 31. The maximum number of sessions available is seven for individuals and nine for couples or families. Counselling services are provided through a partnership with Karunia Counselling from Leduc.

We know that in this current environment many may have additional stress and anxiety. We also know that transportation may be an added barrier. These sessions can be arranged to be in person in the Karunia offices in Leduc, over the phone in your own safe environment or virtually on your computer.

To apply for the subsidy services, application forms are available through the Breton FCSS Office at 4916 50th Avenue or by contacting them at fcss@breton.ca or calling 780-696-3636. ALL APPLICATIONS ARE STRICT-LY CONFIDENTIAL.

Breton and Area FCSS will be doing the intake of the applications. Counselling services are provided by Karunia Counselling by Registered Psychologists, Registered Provisional Psychologists, Canadian Certified Counsellors and Masters or PhD level student interns under the supervision of a qualified psychologist. All applications will be kept in strict confidence. This program is being made available through funding from the Government of Canada's Emergency Support Fund, the Drayton Valley Community Foundation and Breton and Area FCSS.
