Free Counselling Subsidies Coming to an End

From Breton FCSS

Fully paid subsidies until March 31. Breton and Area FCSS is pleased to offer Counselling Subsidies. A subsidy is available for individuals, couples and/or families who are struggling with common, everyday issues to access short-term preventative counselling services. The goal is to:

- o Improve relationships with better communication and conflict resolution skills:
- o Improve mood with anger management and emotional support;
- o Enhance personal growth with creativity, spirituality, self-esteem, self-awareness, goal setting:
- o Improve parenting skills by focusing on attachment;
- o Reduce stress with life balance; and/or
- o Learn new skills and behaviors

The cost of counselling can be a barrier for many individuals and families. This subsidy is available to those who do not have access to coverage through health benefits or employee benefits, such as an Employee Assistance Plan (EAP), and whose family income is less than \$75,000 per year. Fees are determined according to a sliding scale based on income and family size. Fees normally range from \$15 per session to \$50 per session but all fees will be covered for appointments held before March 31. The maximum number of sessions available is seven for individuals and nine for couples or families. Counselling services are provided through a partnership with Karunia Counselling from Leduc.

We know that in this current environment many may have additional stress and anxiety. We also know that transportation may be an added barrier. These sessions can be arranged to be in person in the Karunia offices in Leduc, over the phone in your own safe environment or virtually on your computer.

To apply for the subsidy services, application forms are available through the Breton FCSS Office at 4916 50th Avenue or by contacting them at fcss@breton.ca or calling 780-696-3636. ALL APPLICATIONS ARE STRICTLY CONFIDENTIAL.

Breton and Area FCSS will be doing the intake of the applications. Counselling services are provided by Karunia Counselling by Registered Psychologists, Registered Provisional Psychologists, Canadian Certified Counsellors and Masters or PhD level student interns under the supervision of a qualified psychologist. All applications will be kept in strict confidence. This program is being made available through funding from the Government of Canada's Emergency Support Fund, the Drayton Valley Community Foundation and Breton and Area FCSS.

To the Editor:

The following letter is being sent to Council for the next regular meeting. I have not included the article by Phoenix Stonechild here due to its length. It is available on Facebook.

We realize from the minutes of the last meeting that you have agreed to write the Provincial Government concerning the opening up of the coal mines. We also understand that your letter encourages the Government to have public consultation about this situation.

We are of the belief that your voice should be much stronger. There are at least five heavy metals that will go into this water, thereby damaging the ecological system. Furthermore, the coal industry requires a vast amount of water to produce the product—water that is already in short supply. Anyone knows that agriculture is dependent upon on water supply—this coal industry will take away a precious source.

Tell the Government that the citizens of Alberta have a right to fresh, unpolluted water, not only the citizens of Alberta, but all the citizens that live down river of these mines; that they have a right to water for our agriculture industry to flourish; that they have a right to expect the fish to survive without mutation; that they want the flora and fauna of the wilderness to thrive; and that they want our citizens and the world to see and enjoy the beauty of our natural resources through the tourism industry.

Surely all of this is worth much more that the \$3.50 per hectare or the 1% royalty that we will receive. Is it not abundantly clear that millions of dollars will leave this province and we will be left with not only the cleanup but the dire effects.

We encourage you to join the many counties and protest loudly to stop the coal mine project. It would be better to pay out the contracts than to

continue. People are worth more.

We have attached an analysis and time line that was developed by Phoenix Stonechild. You may have seen it. It is worth a second read.

Some months ago, you passed a resolution that no potable water would be used by the oil industry to go down bore holes (fracking). Is this situation not just as serious?

Again, we urge your action. This government does not consult. Just look what they are doing to education and healthcare and various pension funds and pipelines and anything else that they touch.

Community Volunteer Income Tax Program – FREE INCOME TAX PREPERATION - For Low Income Persons, Families, seniors and students. We will begin taking information for tax season on March 1.

Although this is something, that most of us would like to avoid thinking about and doing, I am afraid that this is unavoidable. You need to file your income tax each year, even if you have no income to report. By doing this you may receive benefits that you did not know you were eligible for. Also, in the event of the death of your spouse, benefits can easily be transferred to you, if you have filled a return for the last calendar year. If you did not file a tax return in 2020 you may not be receiving benefits from the government that you are eligible for. The focus of the Community Volunteer Tax Program is to assist those individuals who have limited income. This includes seniors, families and students. If your income was in one of the following categories you may qualify for assistance.

1 person	30,000
2 person family	37,000
3 person family	40,500
4 person family	43,500

We are not able to complete returns with income from the following sources:

Capital Gains or Losses, Farming Income, Rental Income, Self-Employment, Interest exceeding \$1, 000, Bankruptcies, Deceased Persons

This service is FREE to those who qualify. If you require this service, please gather your information and bring it to the Village of Breton office Monday to Thursday between 8:30 – 4:00. Clients will be notified when your return is completed. The program will run from March 1 – April 30, 2021

We require the following information in order to complete your return:

Personal Information (Social Insurance Number, Birth date, Marital Status, Address)

Dependant's information – spouse/ children's names, birthdates.

All "T" Slips (T4's, T4A, OAS ect.)

All Forms, Schedules, and Labels you have received from Revenue Canada.

Receipts for any expenses such as medical, moving, tuition, sporting activities. Printouts from your pharmacist are available for those with numerous prescriptions.

Jesus said I am the resurrection and the life! Desire Him and discover everlasting life!



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

MP Gerald Soroka Comments on Bill C-7

OTTAWA: Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead commented on Bill C-7 'An Act to amend the Criminal Code (medical assistance in dying) after the votes were tallied.

"Tonight, MPs voted on Bill C-7 in the House of Commons. I have received many questions via email as to how I voted from both those in favour of the Bill and those against.

Prior to voting on Bill C-7 Conservatives tried to introduce an amendment to remove the expansion of MAID eligibility to those with mental illness. I supported this amendment in an effort to ensure we are not putting our most vulnerable at risk. Unfortunately, this amendment was defeated by the Liberals and the Bloc.

On Bill C-7 itself I thoroughly examined the legislation and thought about the different perspectives constituents raised with me on this issue. However, without safeguards to protect those that are mentally ill I could not in good conscience support this Bill.

I believe in extreme circumstances when someone is in pain and all other options have been exhausted, we must allow people access to MAID. This Bill however is too wide reaching and puts vulnerable populations at risk. I was disappointed to see this legislation passed."

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
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Financial moves for the recently divorced

Divorce is common in our society, but that doesn't make it any easier to navigate. If you've recently finalized a divorce, you've likely been coping with uncertainty and tension, but you can still avoid turning an already difficult situation into one that's even more challenging. How? By making the right financial and investment moves, including the following:

Establish your separate financial presence

Even when you were married, you and your spouse might have maintained some separate accounts. But if you only had joint accounts, now is the time to open your own chequing, savings and credit accounts.

Update your budget

It's likely your budget needs updating. Your household income may be lower or may need to be adjusted for alimony or child support (paid or received). Additionally, your living expenses may have shifted, either higher because you're no longer splitting expenses such as housing or utilities, or possibly lower because you're no longer supporting your ex's spending habits. Understanding your new budget will help you feel better informed about your financials options and more in control of your new situation.

Prioritize emergency savings

Divorce is expensive and may have depleted your savings. To get back on your feet, you may want to build an easily accessible source of funds for unexpected drops in income and/or spikes in expenses. If you're not retired, you may want to keep three to six months' worth of expenses in emergency savings, although even much smaller amounts can boost your feelings of financial security.

Evaluate your retirement plan contributions

When you were married, you may have been counting on sharing resources and expenses with your spouse in retirement. But now, you may be solely responsible for your retirement, so if you can afford it, you may want to ramp up your retirement plan contributions. You may want to consult a financial professional about setting and achieving new goals.

Think about Canada Pension Plan (CPP)

Your divorce could play a role in the benefits you can receive. The CPP contributions you and your spouse or common law partner made during the time you lived together can be divided after a separation or divorce. To request a "credit split" you or your legal representative will need to complete and submit the required documentation to the Service Canada. Since rules can be complicated, look for additional information at www. sevicecanada.gc.ca to better understand your situation, and keep a record of your ex's Social Insurance number.

Review your beneficiary designations and legal documents

You'll likely need to revise the beneficiary designations on your retirement accounts and life insurance policies. These designations carry a lot of weight and can even supersede the instructions in your will. And, speaking of your will, you'll likely need to revise it too, along with other legal documents, such as a Power of Attorney for Property. Consult with your legal professional to make these revisions.

It can feel like a long road to stability after a divorce – but by following the above suggestions, you may be able to make the trip a little less bumpy – and hopefully shorter – as well.

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
