

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

To the Editor:

Some random thoughts on the 30% tax reduction for county residents recently passed. Keep in mind the following;

County revenues have declined recently due to reduction in the linear tax, the downloading of costs for RCMP services, and grant reductions for capital projects. Combine that with the reduction of our reserves from about \$40 million to \$20 million in the last 3 years or so and we have a problem. Is this tax reduction desirable, as counties operate from tax revenue.

Given that our Reeve is a primary beneficiary of this tax reduction, one has to ask whether he should have declared a pecuniary interest and refrained from both the discussion and voting on the issue. Apparently, he did neither.

Did any of the rest of Council question his possible pecuniary interest?

Had Council limited the number of quarters to which the reduction applies, the idea might be more palatable.

When one also considers legal advice provided about the validity of the action (not followed), there is room for voter consternation. If you own the land, pay the tax.

Also, it might be noted that they are still going ahead with modified paving to benefit (according to my map) very few residents, a direct gift to receiving residents. Again, should anyone on Council have declared a pecuniary interest on this issue? The rationale for this expenditure is still unknown.



NOTICE Roadside Vegetation Control Program

Brazeau County Agricultural Services Division will be carrying out roadside spraying of prohibited noxious, noxious weeds and woody vegetation (brush) throughout the County from May to October. For public safety, a buffer zone will be maintained between these roadside spray areas and county residences/yard sites.

As per our Vegetation Management policy, spraying on roadsides is done under the authority of Alberta's Weed Control Act. Brazeau County is required to control the weeds in the roadside just like any other landowner is on privately owned land. As well, in the public interest of safety, brush control is performed to increase the sightlines on roadways and intersections. As a result, costs of maintaining these open roadways are reduced where brush and trees are managed properly as it makes snow removal easier and allows roads to dry out quicker after precipitation falls.

The following programs related to herbicide use are available to residents:

- Hawkweed Program (County staff will treat up to 5 acres infested with Hawkweed on private land at no cost)
- Herbicide Rebate Program (the County will reimburse landowners 50% of the cost of herbicide used on the landowner's property)
- No Spray Agreement (the County will not use herbicides in the ditch adjacent to a landowner's property; responsibility for weed control is assumed by the landowner)

2021 No Spray Program

Brazeau County property owners who do not wish to have roadside spraying performed adjacent to their property must enter into a No Spray agreement. In the agreement, the landowner consents to maintain the adjacent municipal right of way themselves, for the purpose of weed and brush control without herbicides, in compliance with the Alberta Weed Control Act. For highway right of ways, the landowners must contact Alberta Transportation if they do not want herbicides applied to the area adjacent to their property.

To enter into a No Spray agreement with the County, please fill out an application form by visiting the Brazeau County office or visiting www.brazeau.ab.ca. Agreements must be renewed annually.

Deadline to apply for the program is May 1st, 2021. No late agreements will be accepted.

Musings from the East End Scriptorium by Elizabeth Emond eemond.phd@gmail.com

In "Locksley Hall," Tennyson wrote, "in the spring, a young man's fancy lightly turns to thoughts of love." Well, doesn't everyone's fancy do that? It's in the air all around; the land itself is getting ready for its annual torrid summer romance with the sun. There are faint flushes of green in spots, and fresh songs by returning birds. All of Nature is urging us to join the pageant.

But don't rush into anything. Take a warning from Theodore Dreiser's An American Tragedy. It was written in 1925, but it's an old, old story. It's about a young man raised by street-corner evangelists, but who has no strong moral compass. He meets and becomes involved with a poor factory girl, then meets a rich, beautiful girl. (It was made into a movie, A Place in the Sun (1951), in which Shelley Winters plays the poor girl and Elizabeth Taylor the rich one.) I won't tell you how it turns out, but the title should provide a clue. Many readers contend that the main character is a murderer, but I personally think that he's too spineless even for that. Let me know your opinion.

After that, cheer yourself up by reading a story of strong, deep, abiding love, Far From the Madding Crowd, by Thomas Hardy. That's "Madding Crowd," not "Maddening Crowd," though the two mean essentially the same thing. It's a quotation from a poem by Thomas Gray, "Elegy Written in a Country Churchyard," in which the poet reflects on how many folks are buried in relative obscurity, when they had in them the makings of great heroes, and villains as well:

Some mute inglorious Milton here may rest, Some Cromwell guiltless of his country's blood.

The main female character in Far From the

Madding Crowd is one Bathsheba Everdene, the Helen of Troy of the small farming community where she lives. She's loved by her farm foreman (bailiff) from the moment he sees her, through thick and thin --which includes her getting married to a flashy young rake, Sergeant Troy. The course of true love does not run smooth, but things wind up satisfactorily, which is not typical of a Thomas Hardy novel. Maybe it was springtime when he wrote it, and his thoughts were lighter than usual.




