


And now we are content that our life was worthwhile. Knowing, as we passed along the way, we made somebody smile.

### FIRE RESTRICTION Village of Breton/Brazeau County



Due to extremely dry weather conditions, the Drayton Valley/Brazeau County Fire Services is issuing a **Partial Fire Ban** for the area of Brazeau County and the Town of Drayton Valley **EFFECTIVE April 7th, 2021.** 

A partial fire ban occurs when the fire hazard in the area is high to very high. Wildfires can start easily from most causes especially unattended campfires, cooking fires. ### LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

To the Editor:

On April 14, the Wild Rose School Board held a Zoom meeting to propose closing the Breton Elementary School. This presentation was available to the public.

During that presentation, a whole lot of time was spent justifying the proposal on the basis of efficiency. Very little concern was expressed on

- (a) the effect/benefit on students to be in a Grade 1 12 institution;
- (b) the effect/benefit to the community; and
- (c) the effect/benefit to society.

Google was unable to help clarify (a) above as there are very few examples of 1-12 schools around. This writer's memory does not recall any research on the subject (back in the day). Certainly, the Board quoted none. My education specialist contacts could provide none either.

One effect on the community (b) above is the disposal/use of the school building no longer used as the school reverts to the Town (in this case) to be dealt with.

As to the benefit to society (c) above, one need only ask the question "Will the graduates of a 1-12 school be any better served/prepared by this 1-12 school or keep the split 1-6, 7-12 situation?

As to the multiple references to efficiency, it should be noted that the Conservative government of the past allowed several situations (that I am aware of) where public and separate schools were built in the same area, neither operating to capacity.

The same applies to the millions given to private schools by the current government.

There were no numbers provided during the meeting to reflect the economic benefits (if any) either. If by chance there is a cost saving, where will the money go? Would this be another case where the

smaller centre gives up in order to benefit a larger one? (for example, Lindale?)

Given that big bucks would need to be spent to "accommodate" the elementary students at the High School, efficiency appears to be a non-starter.

It was a little surprising that the Senior PAC group did not include the subject on their agenda that evening.

It should also be noted that only 3 provinces in Canada still support from [public funds) separate schools (cf. Google) only 5 provinces publicly support private schools.

### **NOTICE** Roadside Vegetation Control Program

Brazeau County Agricultural Services Division will be carrying out roadside spraying of prohibited noxious, noxious weeds and woody vegetation (brush) throughout the County from May to October. For public safety, a buffer zone will be maintained between these roadside spray areas and county residences/yard sites.

As per our Vegetation Management policy, spraying on roadsides is done under the authority of Alberta's Weed Control Act. Brazeau County is required to control the weeds in the roadside just like any other landowner is on privately owned land. As well, in the public interest of safety, brush control is performed to increase the sightlines on roadways and intersections. As a result, costs of maintaining these open roadways are reduced where brush and trees are managed properly as it makes snow removal easier and allows roads to dry out quicker after precipitation falls.

The following programs related to herbicide use are available to residents:

- Hawkweed Program (County staff will treat up to 5 acres infested with Hawkweed on private land at no cost)
- Herbicide Rebate Program (the County will reimburse landowners 50% of the cost of herbicide used on the landowner's property)
- No Spray Agreement (the County will not use herbicides in the ditch adjacent to a landowner's property; responsibility for weed control is assumed by the landowner)

#### 2021 No Spray Program

Brazeau County property owners who do not wish to have roadside spraying performed adjacent to their property must enter into a No Spray agreement. In the agreement, the landowner consents to maintain the adjacent municipal right of way themselves, for the purpose of weed and brush control without herbicides, in compliance with the Alberta Weed Control Act. For highway right of ways, the landowners must contact Alberta Transportation if they do not want herbicides applied to the area adjacent to their property.

To enter into a No Spray agreement with the County, please fill out an application form by visiting the Brazeau County office or visiting www.brazeau.ab.ca. Agreements must be renewed annually.

Deadline to apply for the program is May 1st, 2021. No late agreements will be accepted.



### Estate plans can help you answer questions about the future

The word "estate" conjures images of great wealth, which may be one of the reasons so many people don't develop estate plans — after all, they're not rich, so why make the effort? In reality, though, if you have a family, you can probably benefit from estate planning, irrespective of your asset level. You may well find that a comprehensive estate strategy can help you answer some questions you may find unsettling — or even worrisome.

### Here are a few of these questions:

What will happen to my children? With luck, you (and your co-parent, if you have one) will be alive and well at least until your children reach the age of majority (either 18 or 19, depending on where you live). Nonetheless, you don't want to take any chances, so, as part of your estate strategy, you may want to name a guardian to take care of your children if you are not around. You also might want to name a Trustee – sometimes called a "guardian of the estate" – to manage any assets your minor children might inherit.

Will there be a fight over my assets? Without a solid estate strategy in place, your assets could be subject to the time-consuming, expensive – and very public – probate process. During probate, your relatives and creditors can gain access to your records, and possibly even challenge your will. But with proper planning, you can maintain your privacy. As one possible element of an estate plan, a living trust generally allows your property to avoid probate and pass quickly to the beneficiaries you've named.

Who will oversee my finances and my living situation if I become incapacitated? You can

build various forms of protection into your estate planning, such as an enduring power of attorney, which allows you to designate someone to manage your financial affairs if you become physically or mentally incapacitated. You could also create a power of attorney for personal care, which allows someone to handle health care decisions on your behalf if you become unable to do so yourself.

Will I shortchange my family if I leave significant assets to charities? Unless you have unlimited resources, you'll have to make some choices about charitable gifts and money for your family. But as part of your estate strategy, you do have some appealing options. For example, you could establish a trust, which provides financial support to your chosen charities for a period of time, with the remaining assets eventually going to your family members. A charitable remainder trust, by contrast, can provide a stream of income for your family members for the term of the trust, before the remaining assets are transferred to one or more charitable organizations.

As you can see, careful estate planning can help you answer many of the questions that may be worrying you. Be aware, though, that certain aspects of estate planning, especially those related to living trusts and charitable trusts, can be complex, so you should consult your estate-planning lawyer or qualified tax professional about your situation. Once you've got your strategy in place, you should be able to face the future with greater clarity and confidence.






