

Musings from the East End Scriptorium

In "Locksley Hall," Tennyson wrote, "in the spring, a young man's fancy lightly turns to thoughts of love." Well, doesn't everyone's fancy do that? It's in the air all around; the land itself is getting ready for its annual torrid summer romance with the sun. There are faint flushes of green in spots, and fresh songs by returning birds. All of Nature is urging us to join the pageant.

But don't rush into anything. Take a warning from Theodore Dreiser's An American Tragedy. It was written in 1925, but it's an old, old story. It's about a young man raised by street-corner evangelists, but who has no strong moral compass. He meets and becomes involved with a poor factory girl, then meets a rich, beautiful girl. (It was made into a movie, A Place in the Sun (1951), in which Shelley Winters plays the poor girl and Elizabeth Taylor the rich one.) I won't tell you how it turns out, but the title should provide a clue. Many readers contend that the main character is a murderer, but I personally think that he's too spineless even for that. Let me know your opinion.

After that, cheer yourself up by reading a story of strong, deep, abiding love, Far From the Madding Crowd, by Thomas Hardy. That's "Madding Crowd," not "Maddening Crowd," though the two mean essentially the same thing. It's a quotation from a poem by Thomas Gray, "Elegy Written in a Country Churchyard," in which the poet reflects

on how many folks are buried in relative obscurity, when they had in them the makings of great heroes, and villains as well:

Some mute inglorious Milton here may rest, Some Cromwell guiltless of his country's blood.

The main female character in Far From the Madding Crowd is one Bathsheba Everdene, the Helen of Troy of the small farming community where she lives. She's loved by her farm foreman (bailiff) from the moment he sees her, through thick and thin --which includes her getting married to a flashy young rake, Sergeant Troy. The course of true love does not run smooth, but things wind up satisfactorily, which is not typical of a Thomas Hardy novel. Maybe it was springtime when he wrote it, and his thoughts were lighter than usual.



2021 Dust Suppression Program

Application deadline: Saturday, May 15



Leduc County is currently accepting applications for our 2021 dust control program. There are two product choices available:

1. Calcium chloride

- Calcium chloride is a top shoot dust control product that is applied by spraying over the gravel surface.
- Two applications of the product will be done for every residence applying for this type of dust control. The second application will be automatically applied approximately six to eight weeks following the first application (weather permitting).
- Residents desiring a calcium chloride dust control product on the county road adjacent to their residence will be required to complete an application form and to prepay a fee of \$374.50 for the first 122 metres (400 feet). Dust control requested beyond 122 metres (400 feet) will be charged \$8.77per metre.

2. Incorporated DL10

- Incorporated DL10 is a petroleum-based product that is applied to the road surface and mixed in and packed by graders.
- It is warrantied for one year from date of application.
- Residents desiring an incorporated dust control product on the county road adjacent to their residence will be required to complete an
 - application form and to prepay a fee of **\$2,934.50** for the first 122 metres (400 feet). Dust control beyond 122 metress (400 feet) will be charged \$29.75 per metre.

Other information

- GST will be added to all prices listed above.
- The prices listed are after receiving a Leduc County subsidy of \$695.50 per strip.
- This subsidy is provided to county residents living in permanent residences along a county gravel road.
- Businesses paying for residential strips will be charged the full rate without subsidy.
- The dust control program will begin as soon as possible after seasonal road bans have been lifted.
- Application forms are available from our Road Operations department at 1103 5 St. in Nisku or at www. leduc-county.com/dust-suppression.
- Applications with payment can be mailed to County Centre at 1101 5 St., Nisku, AB T9E 2X3 or delivered to our Services Building located at 1103 – 5th Street in Nisku.

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

The proposed Community Standards Bylaw helps address unsightly premises in Leduc County. The purpose of the bylaw is to prevent unsightly premises from developing by outlining clear expectations and standards to citizens, and to provide an enforcement mechanism to address them when they occur.

The proposed bylaw applies to properties in hamlets, subdivisions and other identified areas. The proposed bylaw **does not** apply to agricultural, farming, commercial or industrial lands.

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

MLA REPORT

from The Office of MLA Mark Smith, Member of the Legislative Assembly for Drayton Valley - Devon

On March 24, 2021, the Canada Venture Capital and Private Equity Association released their annual report. It affirmed what Alberta's government has said for months: that for venture capital in Alberta, 2020 was a record-shattering year. Notably, 2020 saw significant investments in Edmonton and Calgary, in particular.

This is excellent news for the province of Alberta, especially when compared to the rest of the country. Nationwide, Canada's venture capital investment was down 29 per cent in 2020. In comparison, Alberta's venture capital investment doubled, with \$455,000,000 in deals.

This investment is extremely positive for Alberta's economy. Jobber, Symend and Neo Financial, all Alberta-based companies, have announced that they raised record amounts of funds this past year. These significant levels of venture capital investment demonstrate the momentum of growth in our province's tech and innovation sector, helping get Albertans back to work as we continue to respond to the economic challenges associated with the COVID-19 pandemic.

Alberta Enterprise Corporation played an important role in the majority of the venture capital investments made last year. These investments, coupled with recent announcements from companies such as mCloud and Infosys stating that they are moving their operations to Alberta, means technology companies and innovators are starting to notice that Alberta is a good place to invest and run their operations.
