## "Take Me Out to the Ball Park" Batter Up...Play Ball! From Allan Goddard

In bygone years, with the waning of a long winter and the coming of spring, the Breton community's attention turned to baseball. Most rural communities and towns had a ball team of which they were very proud. Each community believed their team was the best, as they competed against a neighboring community.

The ball diamonds were not the diamonds of today, with a shale infield and manicured outfield. Some fields were just a backstop and a couple of benches round out the ball diamond.

Some of the men's baseball teams from the early 1930's included: Breton, Antross, Wenham Valley, Lindale, Tomahawk, Warburg, and Genesee. On a Sunday, teams would travel to a neighboring community to compete as these games provided a break from the week's work on the farms or in the lumber mills, and a chance to visit with neighbors.

While the men of the community played baseball the women of the community had their own teams, playing softball.

Multi team tournaments were held as an integral part of the local Sports Days. A program from a Breton Stampede, found in the community history book, The Ladder of Time, advertises a two - day event, including a Ball Tournament, Stampede, Horse Races, and a Midway. Admission was just 50 cents for adults and 25 cents for children, and to round the day off there was dance each evening. But wait there's more, there was a dance each evening in both the Breton Community Hall and the Nelson Hall on Main Street. Yes, Breton had two halls but that is a story for another day.



## Gordon William Schnick



The family, friends and community of Warburg are deeply saddened by the loss of a legendary character in Gordon William Schnick, who died of cardiac arrest on April 27th at age 82.

Gordie was incredibly loved for his generosity, honesty, sense of humour, and unbridled zest for life. He was a pillar of the business and sports community, a loyal friend, and an immensely cherished family man. He was a constant positive influence on everyone and his laughter echoes forever in our hearts. He is survived by his wife of 58 years Phyllis, sons Derek (Shawna) and Danny (Alina), granddaughter Jordyn, brother Wilfred (Sylvia), sisters Eleanor (Kurt) and Carolyn (Ken) and numerous kin. He was predeceased by his son Roddy (1983), granddaughter Camryn (2003) and sister Linda (2013) and brother-in-law Kurt (2016).

Gordie had friends all across the communities and farms from Leduc west, having met as a Warburg Lumber customer, a horse event, or just a random meeting. He made friends everywhere and left an indelible impression. He was instrumental in getting minor hockey going in Warburg, and spent many hours building up the arena, coaching and riding wing as an elite sniper for the Warburg Grizzlies. (It is well-known that he also had an elite slash that involved a 360 degree wind-up). Gordie and his brother Wilf sold the lumber yard in 1992 and took an early retirement. He was able to hobby ranch, mountain ride with the Fern Crik Social Club, travel extensively with Phyllis from Inuvik to Arizona, get together with family, take every opportunity to play crib and have a beer with all comers, and amble about with his trusty dog Boots, taking coffee and shooting the breeze with anyone who would have him. There is no doubt Gordie will be dearly missed by everyone who knew him.

Regrettably, a traditional funeral is not possible but Gordie was not much for them anyways. He always said, "you know, I expect a few tears when I go but what I really want is a big party with lots of good laughs and stories".

A celebration of life befitting his wishes is planned for late August. In lieu of flowers, donations can be made to Warburg Union Cemetery or STARS ambulance.

### **Preacher's Point**

The Prussian king Frederick the Great was widely known as an agnostic. By contrast, General Von Zealand, one of his most trusted officers, was a devout Christian. #### Pigeon Lake Environment Gets A Boost From Technology

May 2021 - The Pigeon Lake Watershed Management Plan, an innovative environmental strategy and 2021 Emerald Award nominee, will soon get a significant boost from technology.

A "smart buoy" with satellite communication capabilities will be able to provide information every 15 minutes about key air and water col-

umn conditions like air temperature, barometric pressure, wind speed and direction, and water dissolved oxygen levels, temperature, clarity and total algae using a weather station mounted above the water, and sensors that measure variables below the water all the way down to the bottom of the lake. With the Pigeon Lake smart buoy providing essential data to understand lake health, the lake community can not only apply targeted measures to help Pigeon Lake, but the information could help all Alberta lakes.

The buoy project is the result of the collaborative work to implement the Pigeon Lake Watershed Management Plan, in particular the "In-lake technical committee" of the Alliance of Pigeon Lake Municipalities (APLM). The initiative is being funded by the Summer Village of Crystal Springs through a Community Partnership Grant from Alberta Municipal Affairs.

The buoy is the latest innovation in an aggressive program by area residents to implement the landmark 2019 report that contained some 46 science-based recommendations to improve conditions in the lake and watershed.

Alberta Municipal Affairs Minister Ric McIver said, "Albertans treasure their environment and so does their government. We're proud to work with the community by providing technical advice and \$200,000 in funding. This smart buoy will help us be even better stewards of our land so that residents can continue to enjoy places like Pigeon Lake for generations to come."

Crystal Springs Mayor and project lead Ian Rawlinson said the buoy initiative "should indeed have potential value to every Alberta lake, but it is also another significant step in Pigeon Lake's drive to become Alberta's premier recreational lake". "The project speaks to the potential of technology in understanding lake health and the value in community/government partnerships."


