

Deck the Halls

As the new Community Hall nears completion, the Breton Museum felt we should take some time to look back and reflect on the halls which have served this community.

I mentioned in last week's article that during the 1940s Breton held a two-day Stampede and Ball tournament with a dance each evening in both the Community Hall and Nelson's Hall. That is right, Breton had two halls from the 1930s through to the late 1950s.

I will start with Nelson's Hall, which was located on the north side of Main Street. It was owned by Stanford Nelson who was an early settler from the Yeoford area. From what little is written, it appears that he started the hall within a couple of years of Breton being established in 1926. For the next twenty years or so, the hall had a steady stream of movies, dances, and other social events.

One interesting event, that was carried out at the Nelsons Hall was the Travelling Clinic. In the 1930s, the Provincial Government began sending out Travelling Clinics to rural communities for the purpose of removing tonsils, adenoids, and extracting teeth. As Mark Hooks describes in the Keystone Legacy, "The clinics would move into town and set up their chamber of horrors. The kids needing their tonsils or adenoids out were herded into the recreation hall. In Breton that was Nelson's Hall". You can read Mark's whole ordeal in the Keystone Legacy, available at the Breton Museum.

Ted Gryzb related some of his memories about the Nelson Hall to the Breton Museum. He indicated that the Nelson Hall was larger than the Community Hall of the time, "the roof leaked like a sieve", it was none too warm when it was cold, and at dances the single men would line up at the back of the hall in a "stag line".

On to the "Old" Community Hall. One of the artifacts in the Breton Museum collection is the minute book from the Breton Community Club from 1937-1959. While many of the entries in the book are about routine operation, every so often there are interesting entries. In October 1938 the ball club had a wind-up banquet where supper had cost 35 cents and the dance 50 cents.


The Community Hall was located next to the Breton Hotel, well in fact the hotel now covers the lot on which the hall was located. The building was the cookhouse purchased from the Breton Lumber Company, which had a

lumber planning operation on the west side of the railway in the late 1920s and had ceased operations. The building was converted to a community hall in the early 1930s, and also hosted movies, dances, public meetings, banquet's etc. Provincial Court was held in the hall and continued in the present hall until the Courthouse was built.

This hall served Breton until the late 1950s when the Village needed a "New and Bigger" Hall to serve the community. There were years of discussion surrounding the new hall, but in July 1958 the hall was closed and construction of the new hall began at its present location. The records indicate numerous Board meetings and changes made to the plans, with the hall opening in 1960. For the past 60 years the hall served the Breton community, and over the years there were additions to hall, including a three-sheet curling rink. Many memories have taken place in the current hall both happy and sad. But as the Breton community gets ready to say good bye to the current Community Centre, praise needs to go out to all the people who worked so diligently over the past number of years to bring to fruition a beautiful facility that will serve the needs of the community for many decades to come.

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We Are Working On A Garden Project!

Well, it has been a little while since we have updated you on what is happening with the Legion!

The Warburg Legion has received a grant from the Senior Horizons Grant Program. This grant entails two projects and the one we are working on now is The Garden Project for the Cloverleaf Manor!

To date, the residents and staff have been busy planting so they could start their gardens this spring. They have been a big part of how this garden project will work for them. This project started in 2019 -2020 but we received extension for another year due to Covid protocols. They will be receiving a greenhouse, planter gardens and barrels as well as plants for them to enjoy and enhance their existing gardens. Part of this grant requires volunteer time with the community, (all ages) so we are hoping to set up some work bees to help set up these gardens so the residents can enjoy the foliage, vegetables and working with it all. Family members are welcome to join. Work bees must be small groups as per Protocols with Covid plan. We are focusing on supporting local businesses and groups to help with this project. Masks must be worn and social distancing will be followed.

The work that needs to be done:

Help set up barrels with dirt mixture, peat moss and soil to put into their greenhouse. Fill garden planters which are barrels, so they can have gardens to plant vegetables and flowers. This is where a bobcat could be of assistance. There are 4 garden boxes where the dirt is old and needs to be dug out, replaced with a new mixture of soil so plants will be available to be put in these garden boxes. Help with any pruning as needed. We will be replacing some bushes to improve some gardens with new foliage and dirt buildup and some land-scaping. Hanging baskets when weather turns for the better.

So, we are reaching out to groups & businesses who can be of assistance to us. Can you share your talent with this project? We are looking for approx. 4 hrs of time for a bobcat to move dirt to the planters and move some barrels around. This is volunteer time.
