

We Are Working On A Garden Project!

Well, it has been a little while since we have updated you on what is happening with the Legion!

The Warburg Legion has received a grant from the Senior Horizons Grant Program. This grant entails two projects and the one we are working on now is The Garden Project for the Cloverleaf Manor!

To date, the residents and staff have been busy planting so they could start their gardens this spring. They have been a big part of how this garden project will work for them. This project started in 2019 -2020 but we received extension for another year due to Covid protocols. They will be receiving a greenhouse, planter gardens and barrels as well as plants for them to enjoy and enhance their existing gardens. Part of this grant requires volunteer time with the community, (all ages) so we are hoping to set up some work bees to help set up these gardens so the residents can enjoy the foliage, vegetables and working with it all. Family members are welcome to join. Work bees must be small groups as per Protocols with Covid plan. We are focusing on supporting local businesses and groups to help with this project. Masks must be worn and social distancing will be followed.

The work that needs to be done:

Help set up barrels with dirt mixture, peat moss and soil to put into their greenhouse. Fill garden planters which are barrels, so they can have gardens to plant vegetables and flowers. This is where a bobcat could be of assistance. There are 4 garden boxes where the dirt is old and needs to be dug out,

replaced with a new mixture of soil so plants will be available to be put in these garden boxes. Help with any pruning as needed. We will be replacing some bushes to improve some gardens with new foliage and dirt buildup and some landscaping. Hanging baskets when weather turns for the better.

So, we are reaching out to groups & businesses who can be of assistance to us. Can you share your talent with this project? We are looking for approx. 4 hrs of time for a bobcat to move dirt to the planters and move some barrels around. This is volunteer time. If you can spare 2 or 3 hours here or there, please contact Deb Mellafont at 780-848-2923 or Allan Gruninger at 780-848-7756 to set up a work bee to complete this project. Acknowledgement will be recognized for all who participate.



Gordon William Schnick July 5, 1938 – April 27, 2021



Gordie always said, "When it's time, I don't want to linger. If I'm lying there drooling, get out the ball peen hammer and finish me off." He complained little but we knew he hated it when creaky bones limited his range, his time in the saddle, his hours on the chainsaw, the extent of his travels and his nights at the crib table. He wanted to go out at the top of his game, with all his faculties intact, on his own terms, without suffering, and without fanfare.

And he did – except for a bit of fanfare. Sorry dad, we can't let you off that easy.

Gord and his brother Wilf inherited Warburg Lumber and turned it into a going concern. They worked hard to serve customers from Calmar to Drayton Valley, from Pigeon Lake to the North Saskatchewan River. But besides the staples that make a good business, Warburg Lumber had personality – where else could you get a good deal and a B.S. session at closing time, and then almost get run over by an underaged forklift driver? The annual Christmas parties quite often ran a whole week, a customer appreciation event adorned with kubasa and Crown Royal.

Gord worked hard and played hard in those days. It was curling, hockey, snowmobiling, camping, canoeing and socializing that occupied his down time – oh, and raising a family. Dad was instrumental in starting the 1st minor hockey program in Warburg, a key figure in getting the arena built, and Papa Grizz to the 1st men's beer-league team, an honour that lasted 30 years or more. After selling the lumber yard in 1993 was able to really indulge in his favorite hobbies. He started driving horses, kept raising a few head of cattle, dabbled black-smithing and timber supply, read non-fiction voraciously, worked the curling circuit, made the local morning coffee rounds and travelled extensively with Phyllis, including their annual pilgrimage to their hacienda in Maricopa, AZ..

In those years, 'dad' became more 'Gordie' to us children. It was truly a gift to hang out with him as a buddy, like all his many other buddies. He didn't like emotional baggage, so if there was something to criticize about our choices, he never judged. He strove for the moment – no regrets, no agenda, just the purity of whatever engagement it was. He hated taking life too seriously, and to take sport too seriously was just idiotic. If there is one endearing memory of all the kids he coached in hockey, it is "joke-time" in intermission. He loathed the pressure put on youngsters – life was too short not to have a laugh and enjoy yourself. You just might win.

I still can't believe he is gone – and I'm sure it's the same with many of us. He was able to live the way he wanted to the end so it kind of surprised us. He made a unique impression, mostly good, occasionally bad, on everyone he met. He and my mom made many life-long friends, true got-your-back folks, who they helped, who now help us. He loved his family; he stood up for us; he forgave us for our sins without really having to say much. Dad's view on life is fresh in our minds, it was hard not to pick up on it. He let loose on hypocrites and had little time for buffoons. He was sharp, and could speak fluently on many subjects. But most of all, I still hear his outrageous hyena laugh, which brought tears to his eyes and whatever he was drinking came out his nostrils.

To know someone who lived as he did is to have them live an eternity your heart.

Regrettably, a traditional funeral was not possible but Gordie was not much for them anyways. He always said, "you know, I expect a few tears when I go but what I really want is a big party with lots of good laughs and stories". A celebration of life befitting his wishes is planned for late August. In lieu of flowers, donations can be made to Warburg Union Cemetery or STARS Ambulance.

He is survived by his wife of 58 years Phyllis, sons Derek (Shawna) and Danny (Alina), granddaughter Jordyn, brother Wilfred (Sylvia), sisters Eleanor and Carolyn (Ken) and numerous kin. He was predeceased by his son Roddy (1983), granddaughter Camryn (2003), sister Linda (2013) and brother-in-laws Kurt (2016) and Keith (2019).

When I was young (around the time of the American Civil War), I used to enjoy science fiction, but now that I'm actually living in the 21st century, I find that The Future is both more wonderful and more mundane than anyone imagined. Pigeon Lake Environment Gets A Boost From Technology

May 2021 - The Pigeon Lake Watershed Management Plan, an innovative environmental strategy and 2021 Emerald Award nominee, will soon get a significant boost from technology.

A "smart buoy" with satellite communication capabilities will be able to provide information every 15 minutes about key air and water column conditions like air temperature, barometric pressure, wind speed and direction, and water dissolved oxygen levels, temperature, clarity and total algae using a weather station mounted above the water, and sensors that measure variables below the water all the way down to the bottom of the lake. With the Pigeon Lake smart buoy providing essential data to understand lake health, the lake community can not only apply targeted measures to help Pigeon Lake, but the information could help all Alberta lakes.

The buoy project is the result of the collaborative work to implement the Pigeon Lake Watershed Management Plan, in particular the "In-lake technical committee" of the Alliance of Pigeon Lake Municipalities (APLM). The initiative is being funded by the Summer Village of Crystal Springs through a Community Partnership Grant from Alberta Municipal Affairs.

The buoy is the latest innovation in an aggressive program by area residents to implement the landmark 2019 report that contained some 46 science-based recommendations to improve conditions in the lake and watershed.


Alberta Municipal Affairs Minister Ric McIver said, "Albertans treasure their environment and so does their government. We're proud to work with the community by providing technical advice and \$200,000 in funding. This smart buoy will help us be even better stewards of our land so that residents can continue to enjoy places

like Pigeon Lake for generations to come."

Crystal Springs Mayor and project lead Ian Rawlinson said the buoy initiative "should indeed have potential value to every Alberta lake, but it is also another significant step in Pigeon Lake's drive to become Alberta's premier recreational lake". "The project speaks to the potential of technology in understanding lake health and the value in community/government partnerships."




