Celebrating Senior's Week Helen Beam A Long Road Travelled From Allan Goddard

To celebrate Senior's Week last year the museum profiled former Breton senior Edith Shave, in the Breton Booster. This year the museum would like to highlight another former senior from the Breton community, whose life story starts in Gonda India, moves to Scotland then to Canada, as a war bride, and ending in Breton.

Helen Lawson was born September 7, 1908 to William James Lawson and Thomasina (Carruthers) in the small Village of Gonda, India. Gonda is located in northern India at a junction of several roads and railways, and is a major agricultural area. Helen's parents had been married in Scotland, and shortly after their marriage William was transferred to India as an inspector of railways. His position as an inspector gave the Lawson family a comfortable lifestyle. The family employed house servants to care for the children and provide domestic services. At age five Helen started school, and at age nine she was sent to the Wellesly Girls School, a private school, which was located in the hills above the Village of Gonda. The students were carried up to the school in baskets on a pole carried by men.

Tragedy struck the Lawson family in 1920 with the sudden death of her father William. The shock of his death also took a toll on her mother, suffering a serious mental breakdown, hospitalizing her for an extended period of time. The death of her father ended the ability to attend private school and the stability of the family. Helen was twelve years of age at the time of her father's death. The family consisted of two boys and four girls, with Helen being the eldest.

With the death of her father, and the poor health of her mother, family friends decided the children should be sent back to Scotland, to be taken in by various family members. The children ranged in age from twelve years down to fifteen months. In July 1921 the children left India for Scotland. It was a journey taking them six weeks to complete. Various family members took the children in, with Helen being sent to a paternal Aunt to live. It truly separated the family. Helen's mother did rejoin the family about a year later.

In 1924, at age fifteen, Helen went to work as a domestic servant in the homes of prominent families as a maid. Her pay was eighteen shillings a month which would convert to five dollars Canadian at the time. In 1943 Helen's mother passed away, Helen continued to

work and look after her younger siblings who were still

Helen met Allan Beam, a Canadian soldier, while he was stationed in Scotland during the Second World War. In the fall of 1945 Helen and Allan were married, and shortly after their marriage, Allan was discharged from the army returning to Canada. Helen followed a few months later as a War bride. She left Scotland in July of 1946 and travelled to Medicine Hat, Alberta. Allan and Helen lived in Enderby and Kettle Valley, BC before returning to Alberta to farm in the Bearberry area for ten years. They moved to Breton in 1959 buying a small house. Allan Passed away in July of 1973. Allan and Helen had no children of their own. Helen continued to reside in Breton for the remainder of her life, passing away in February 2000. For many years she provided childcare services to a number of families in the community. As she wrote in the Ladder of Time ... "I have taken care of many children in the twenty years I have been here. I see some of them today, fine looking young folks, and I feel proud of "my" children."

When the museum started in 1988 the first donation of items for the museum was from Helen Beam. It included her wedding dress, her passport documents from India and a number of photographs. As we celebrate Senior's Week take time to listen to the stories of the seniors from the community, I am sure they all have interesting stories to relate.

Breton RCMP Investigate Fatal House Fire

Breton, Alta.—On June 2, 2021, at approximately 11 a.m., the RCMP Central Alberta District (CAD) Crime Reduction Unit (CRU) were conducting an unrelated investigation in the area of Buck Lake when the investigation led to a residence where there was a house fire in the area of Township 465 and Range Road 630.

RCMP officers notified Fire services and upon gaining entry to the yard and residence, were told that there were two children trapped inside. RCMP officers attempted to rescue the children; however, due to the extent of the fire re-entry to the residence was not possible.

Breton and Thorsby RCMP attended the scene along with multiple volunteer Fire Services who worked to extinguish the fire.

A search of the structure once the fire was extinguished resulted in locating the two missing children, a 1-year-old male and 4-year-old female—both from Drayton Valley, Alta.

Alberta RCMP Major Crimes Unit, Alberta RCMP General Investigation Section from Alberta RCMP Serious Crimes Branch, RCMP Forensic Identification Section, along with a Fire Investigator attended the scene to assist with this investigation.

The RCMP continue to wait for an official report from the fire investigator from the Alberta Office of the Fire Commission.

Breton RCMP's investigation into this fatal fire continues.

Further updates will be provided when more information is available.


