Online Inventory Sale for Breton Agriculture Society





Museum's Seniors Week Trivia Answers From Allan Goddard

The museum thanks all who attended the drive-in senior's tea on June 11, and picked up our trivia contest, here are the answers to the ten questions asked.

1. In what year did Breton become a Village? Answer: Breton was Incorporated as a Village on January 1, 1957. The first Council consisted of Tom Burkholder Mayor, Nick Raczuk Deputy Mayor, and Cleve Carson Councillor.

2. What was the community named before the name was changed to Breton?

Answer: The general area which has become the Breton community was called Keystone. Named by the early African American families who settle the area. To date there has been no definitive answer as to the reasons why they named it Keystone, but there are a number of theories.

3. How many community halls did Breton have between the 1930s and the 1950s? Answer: There were two community halls in Breton. The Community Hall located near the present Breton Hotel. The second hall was Nelson's Hall owned by Sanford Nelson an early settler from the Yeoford area.

4. At the Ball club windup in 1938, what was the combined price for the supper and dance? Answer: The combined cost was \$0.85.

5. When the Museum building was constructed as a school in the late 1940s, what was the budget for the project?

Answer: According to the newspaper article from the Edmonton Journal the budget was \$16,000.00. That did not include any electrical or plumbing costs, those upgrades would come later.

6. Name one of the 2 schools that children attended before there was a school established in Breton?

Answer: The 2 area schools that had been established before the Breton school was built in 1927 was the Funnell School, built circa 1912 and the Modeste Valley School circa 1913 located in Wenham Valley.

7. What is the name of the local history book for Breton & District?

Answer: The Ladder of Time, released in 1980 in conjunction with the 75th anniversary of Alberta becoming a Province.

8. In what year was the railway extended from Lacombe to Breton?

Answer: The Lacombe Northwestern Railway was extended from Hoadley in 1926. With the extension put into use in December 1926.

9. What was the economic driver in the Breton area prior to agriculture?

Answer: Even prior to the railway there was logging activity in the area with the logs floated down the creeks to the North Saskatchewan River and on to the mills in Edmonton. Once the railway arrived, several lumbering operations moved to the Breton area, and the lumbering industry became the primary source of employment.

10. Whose original homestead is most of the Village of Breton situated on?

Answer: Sam Hooks, and his wife Neoma, homesteaded the SE2-48-4-W5. The Hooks family came to Canada in 1911 from Sharpes, Oklahoma settling in Edmonton for a few years. In 1915 he filed a homestead at Keystone. When the railway was built, and Breton established, land was purchased from Mr. Hooks for the railway right of way and for the first survey of Breton.



Alberta RCMP Advise Water Safety Precautions For Summer

With summer here, people are now spending more time outdoors and planning recreational activity at lakes and rivers throughout Alberta. Alongside the fun and health benefits of these activities, the Alberta RCMP reminds Albertans that there is also always a risk of injury, accidents, and drownings.

Whether operating a boat, canoe, watercraft, or participating in activities like tubing or swimming, it is important to keep water safety top of mind in the months ahead. Since 2016, a total of 89 people have drowned in Alberta, with 80% of the drowning fatalities having occurred in a lake or river.

The Alberta RCMP recommends essential safety practices on the water:

Clarity is safety - Never operate a boat while under the influence of drugs or alcohol, which is illegal and punishable under the Criminal Code. Impairment will also affect a person's motor ability, judgement, and reaction time.

Check the weather - Always check the weather forecasts and reports before going on or in the water. Changing weather conditions can be extremely dangerous while on the water. Continue to monitor weather conditions for the duration of your water activity.

Share your plans - Know the area you will be in and share your itinerary with someone, so that if there is an emergency you can be located quickly.

Dress to protect - Boaters, tubers, and swimmers should wear life jackets or personal flotation devices when on the water. Tubers should wear a helmet. Wearing a life jacket

or PFD is the best defense for surviving coldwater shock and hypothermia. Dress appropriately for cool weather or extreme sun which can cause fatigue and disorientation.

• Prepare your boat - Before heading out on the water, boaters should make sure their boat is equipped with mandatory boat safety equipment such as life jackets, signalling devices, and bailing containers. Always bring emergency supplies like extra food, water, clothes, and a cell phone.

Know your limits – Be self-aware and don't push your physical limits when playing or engaging in water. Many drowning instances we have seen over the years have been as a result of fatigue and being too far from shore. If you cannot swim, stay out of the water and seek the shade instead.

Public safety is a top priority for Alberta RCMP and water safety is a shared responsibility. By practicing safe boating and swimming, Albertans can help reduce the number of fatalities caused by drowning this summer. MLA REPORT from The Office of MLA Mark Smith, Member of the Legislative Assembly for Drayton Valley - Devon

For decades, Albertans have watched as their hard-earned tax dollars were seized by Ottawa and redistributed among other provinces under a system of Equalization that has siphoned wealth from our job creators and our provincial treasury. In 2019, Albertans elected a United Conservative government to put an end to the Trudeau-Notley alliance and fight for a fair deal for Alberta. Over the course of the government's mandate legislation the Alberta Parole Board has replaced a federally controlled parole board. Once the details of an agreement are finished Alberta, not Ottawa, will appoint a Chief Firearms Officer and Albertans will soon have the opportunity to start addressing the issue of equalization.

Canada's system of Equalization is fundamentally unfair to Alberta, pulling billions of dollars out of our province – even during times of economic recession – and funneling that money into provinces with strong, even booming economies. This includes provinces run by anti-oil politicians who benefit from Alberta's generosity while attacking our economic interests and implementing policies detrimental to our province and our people.

This is why Premier Jason Kenney recently introduced a motion in the Alberta Legislature seeking approval to hold a referendum on whether Albertans think the principle of making Equalization payments should be removed from Canada's Constitution. The motion was debated and passed and areferendum will be held along with the municipal and Senate elections this upcoming fall.

The question facing Albertans in the proposed referendum will be: should section 36(2) of the Constitution Act, 1982—Parliament and the government of Canada's commitment to the principle of making Equalization payments—be removed from the constitution?

If the majority of responses support removing

equalization payments, the Alberta government will move forward with pursuing renewed negotiations with the federal government to get a fairer deal for Albertans. In order to make a change to the Constitution, the proposed change must be approved by the federal House of Commons and Senate, and by the legislative assemblies of at least seven provinces, representing at least 50 per cent of the population of all provinces.

Quebec's ability to monopolize the national spotlight and command attention from Ottawa after they held contentious referendums in 1980 and 1995 has demonstrated what can be achieved when people, not politicians, are given the power to decide their future. A referendum on Equalization will be an opportunity for Albertans to be heard and to make a strong statement to Ottawa that Equalization does not work for Alberta.

Albertans are proud of the role our province has played within confederation. With an energy industry that forms the bedrock of our national economy and a competitive business environment unmatched by any other province, we have served as our county's economic engine and a beacon of hope for ambitious Canadians from every region.


