

Breton Soil Plots 92 Years of Soil Research

Situated 3kms southeast of the Village of Breton is the home of the Breton Soil Plots. The story of the Breton Plots dates back to 1929 when Dr. F.A. Wyatt and Dr. J.D. Newton, of the Department of Soils Science department at the University of Alberta, started to look for a piece of land in which to conduct research on the effects of fertilizers and crop rotation on the vast acres of grey wooded soils common to the forest belt in western Canada.


By the early 1920's, much of the more productive prairie land in Alberta had been settled. As settlement advanced into the forest belt of Alberta the settlers found the soils were very different from the black loam of the prairies. Although the land was covered with a lush growth of trees and adequate moisture, the homesteaders soon found cropping practices which worked on the rich prairie soil did not work on these types of soils. After the back breaking work of clearing the land of trees, they found that after only a few years the crops yields dropped significantly. The practice of growing wheat one year, summer fallowing the next and then another crop just wasn't working. Many farmers in the area were barely surviving trying to farm.

It was with this in mind that Dr. Wyatt and Dr. Newton started to look for a small plot of land to carry out their research. They were looking for a piece of land that had no commercial fertilizers applied. Their search led them to Breton and the farm of

Ben Flesher. There is a story... that when they approached Mr. Flesher with their proposal, he indicated that he was growing legumes and didn't need to use fertilizer. As they talked, the Drs. indicated that they didn't see much for legumes growing. It is said that Ben invited them to "take the whole d**n farm, it was no good anyway". However, an agreement was reached for the University to lease a plot of land from the Flesher family, and so began a 92-year relationship with the Flesher family.

Shortly after the establishment of the plots in 1930, the University began to hold annual field days to disseminate the knowledge they were learning from their research. One Winfield farmer who attended the early Field Days was Lou Hendrigan. Like many farmers, Mr. Hendrigan was becoming discouraged with trying to make a living with traditional practices. From the knowledge he learned by attending the Field days, he came to the conclusion that much of the grey wooded soils were better suited to forages and cattle production. Over the years he developed a system of continuous forage and grazing that worked for his farm. Like the Flesher family, Lou Hendrigan was a staunch supporter of the research carried out at the Breton Plots. In 1980, the Hendrigan Plots, a new set of plots was developed based on the experience and the knowledge of Lou Hendrigan. In 1987 Lou Hendrigan was inducted into the Alberta Agriculture Hall of Fame.

While agriculture has changed significantly in the last century some of that change can be attributed to the work carried out at the Breton plots.





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
