To the Editor:

On August 6, 2021, a public meeting was held at the Breton Fire Hall concerning a proposed hydrocarbon separation process to be located somewhere in the County of Brazeau. Fiscal Energy Corporation is making the proposal.

A "sister" company (Greenit Cleanit) made a similar proposal to the County of Leduc for a facility near Thorsby. It was rejected by residents near (within 2 miles) of the proposed site based on noise and odor, and the company withdrew it's application.

My information source confirmed that there were 6 or 7 public meetings held concerning this proposal in Leduc County, including a Town Hall with TV coverage.

The sister company discussed above has/had (Google info) a facility near Edmonton, which may be shut down over its odor issues. This was not addressed at the Breton public meeting

Some things were either not discussed or inadequately so at the meeting. No consideration was given to the potential noise and inconvenience to residents of the considerable trucking that would be involved, nor the cost(s) of road maintenance and who would pay for it.

In addition, at no time was ground water contamination addressed. As this facility will be handling hazardous materials, this is a legitimate concern.

One observer emailed this writer the possibility

of Fiscal Energy disappearing and the County left with the clean-up and that the County could be a dumping ground for the province's environmental problems.

It was stated by the company that they were in contact with Brazeau County 18 months ago. Why are we only now hearing about this? Why have council discussions only been in camera?

One can only hope the County does due diligence on this matter given the potential negative effects. This County's record re "due diligence" is not good (cf) corporate review Farmer about 4 years ago.

Ross - Beard Lumber Company From Allan Goddard

From the mid 1920's until the early 1950's numerous lumbering companies, both large and small, operated in the Breton area. The museum over the years has frequently documented the history of the D.R. Fraser Lumber Co. and Anthony Lumber Company, but there were others that contributed to the local economy. One of these was the Ross-Beard Lumber Company owned by Joe Ross and Charles Beard. The Ross-Beard Lumber Co. moved to Antross the winter of 1925-1926. Their mill was located about 23 kms west of Antross, and north of Buck Mountain. As there was no road to the mill location, they first had to build a road from Antross.

To begin with, horses were used for all phases of the operation, and for the first few years they planned the lumber green at the mill site and then hauled the lumber to the railway siding at Antross. This required four teams each comprising of 4 horses hauling the finished lumber by sleigh to the railway siding.

As the Depression years of the 1930's descended on the lumber company, lumber demand and prices decreased, to sell the lumber they had to dry pile the lumber during the winter before planing it the following summer. To accommodate this, they built a large planer mill at Antross. With increased mill production and the larger planer operation a faster method to transport the lumber from the sawmill was needed.


The use of horses was replaced first by small gas Cat's, then Republic trucks called "Yellow Bellies" with hard rubber tires. Neither of these methods proved adequate. The company then purchased a Linn Tractor unit. The Linn was similar to the Steam Hauler but on a smaller

scale, and was powered by a gas engine. The tractor unit was loaded with lumber and four loaded sleighs were pulled by the tractor. The Linn could haul up to fifty thousand board feet of lumber per train. Like the Steam Hauler the route had to be on fairly level ground. They would use hay to brake on the small hills and rough locks on the sleigh runners on steeper hills. Cliff Ross writes in the Ladder of Time that he was the night driver on the Linn in 1933 and 1934, which leads me to think that they ran the Linn in shifts. To handle the work load, Ross Beard owned 48 heavy sleighs for use in their logging operation. The sleighs had ten-footwide bunks with runners seven feet in length, all made by the company's blacksmith Andy Olsen, with the woodworking done by Archie Collins.

In 1936, a forest fire burnt the sawmill and a significant amount of lumber. After the mill burnt, Hale Ross, Joe's brother took over the planing mill at Antross and had other smaller mills supplying him with rough lumber. Cliff Ross writes that after they were notified that the sawmill had burnt, he walked the 23kms to assess the damage, it was total. What stuck in his mind was that the caretaker had saved himself by remaining down a water well as the fire swept past. The only other living thing was the caretaker's milk cow who had suffered significant burns but survived.

The planing mill continued to operate until circa 1942 when Hale Ross finished the operation at Antross. The operation was then moved to the Grande Prairie area.

Warburg Local Aims High and Wins Big By Amissa Jablonski

Warburg local Dianne Hunter has turned a love of the outdoors into a full-time hobby that has put her on top of the province. A lifelong, avid hunter, Dianne took up archery as a way to further challenge herself. Soon, she was pulling the bow for more than just sustenance and is finding success on the Alberta Archery circuit.

As Dianne began to introduce her kids to the world of hunting, she wanted to show them the challenges of hunting for food over sport alone so she took up bow hunting. As she learned the ins and outs of this method of hunting, she developed the opinion that it is a more ethical and natural way of harvesting wild game. Soon archery for utility morphed into a love for the sport and Dianne began training in earnest.

Ms. Hunter began competing and was soon seeing success. Archery requires a large amount of physical strength so Dianne trains whenever she can, especially because she chooses to pull to the maximum for her category. She even built a shooting range on her property in order to keep in shape. This became particularly advantageous during COVID as opportunities to shoot with others all but disappeared and those opportunities that did occur were smaller so as to respond to COVID protocols. Luckily, the World Archery Federation began posting weekly challenges to help keep athletes' skills honed and Dianne took full advantage of these.

This pandemic practice helped net Dianne a gold in target FITA double 720 and a silver in field target at the 2021 Alberta Archery Outdoor Provincial 3D, Target and Field competition held July 31-August 1 in Lac La Biche. She is particularly proud of her gold medal as she ended up shooting with the fibre optic sight pin missing from her bow! Ms. Hunter was also heartened to see the large number of archers at the competition given how hard it is to come by coaches in Alberta and, frankly, across the country. It was also a grueling shoot given the high temperatures necessitating many equipment checks and constant hydration.

Dianne finds archery to be a sport that is accessible to all ages. Competitions include categories for children, youth, adult (18-50), and masters and include the disciplines of 3D (shooting at stuffed animal targets), double 720, and field target so there is truly something for every archer. Shoots take place all over the province and athletes typically compete on their own dime, making it a labour of love. Now that she has placed so well in Provincials, Ms. Hunter has Worlds in her sights. She focuses on competing for herself and has found this strategy to be fruitful demonstrating that archery is just as much of a mind sport as it is one of strength.

In addition to her competitive aspirations, Dianne wants to get more people involved in the sport. She coaches kids at her personal range and gifts equipment to her students. Additionally, she teaches and mentors at the Alberta Hunter Education Instructors Association (AHE-IA). On August 7 and 8, she taught six classes at AHE-IA's Outdoor Women's Program at Alford Lake showing women how to shoot. She also hopes to be teaching at AHEIA's Outdoor Youth Program August 21-22 at Alford Lake and is willing to help anyone interested in learning more about the sport.

Ultimately, Dianne wants people to know that archery is a pastime that welcomes all ages and abilities. Many start out struggling with the sport but with a little time and practice can become quite skilled. She believes that women, in particular, can benefit from learning the sport and cites increasing numbers of licences being issued by Alberta Conservation to women as proof of archery's growing popularity within the demographic. 

Rural Transit Solutions Fund

OTTAWA: Gerald Soroka Member of Parliament for Yellowhead would like to inform constituents of the Rural Transit Solutions Fund in the amount of \$250 million. This funding is available over five years beginning in 2021 and will support the development of locally driven and transit solutions by helping people living in rural communities get to work, school, appointments, and visit loved ones.

From on-demand services, to publicly owned, ride shares, and volunteer community carpooling, funding will help rural, remote, Northern and Indigenous communities and eligible organizations across Canada develop and offer new public transit options to their residents.

Eligible applicants can seek grants of up to \$50,000 in support of project planning; up to \$3 million to help cover capital costs (the purchase of a vehicle or digital platforms); and up to \$5 million to support zero-emission transit solutions (for the purchase of a zero-emission vehicle(s)).

A minimum of 10% of the total \$250 million funding envelope for Rural Transit Solutions Fund will be allocated to Indigenous projects being led by and for Indigenous populations and communities.

As part of the first call for applications from August 6, 2021 to October 8, 2021, eligible applicants can seek up to \$50,000 in support for project planning grants.

Canada Student Financial Assistance Program (CSFA)

OTTAWA: Gerald Soroka Member of Parliament for Yellowhead wishes to advise that students under the new Canada Student Financial Assistance Program (CSFA),will have access to direct financial support through the form of Canada Student Grants (CSG), Canada Student Loans and Canada Apprentice Loans, making it easier for them – as well as recent graduates – to pay off their student debt.

As of August 1, 2021, the Government is extending the doubling of CSG for an additional two years. This means that the maximum amount available for CSG will be up to \$6,000 for full-time students and \$10,000 for students with disabilities until July 31, 2023. The flexibility for students to use their current year's income when applying for the CSG will be permanent so those in financial need will not have their previous workforce participation count against them.

Also, the waiver of interest accrual on student and apprentice loans has been extended to March 31, 2023.

Disability supports under the CSFA Program will be extended beyond recipients with lifelong disabilities to recipients whose disabilities are persistent and prolonged. This will allow access up to \$22,000 in grants, in-study supports, and specialized repayment assistance on their loans.

As well, the Repayment Assistance Plan will be enhanced so that no one with an income of \$40,000 or less will have to make payments on their student loans.
