### The Breton Brothers Adventures in Alberta Chapter 2

My first article about the Breton Brothers, in last weeks Booster, left off with Douglas Breton accompanying his parents back to England due to the poor health of his father. Inspector General Breton would pass away within a few months of their return to England. Basil Breton and his wife continued to run the Telfordville store, while Laurence and Billie Breton often worked on surveying crews. I also mentioned, there were darkening clouds starting to brew on the world's horizon that would further separate the Breton's. In August 1914, England declared war against Germany and for the next four years WWI would embroil much of the world.

Douglas, still in England, received a commission in the 6th Hampshire Regiment and served in India and Afghanistan during the war. In the fall of 1915, on returning from their time on a survey crew in the Peace River region, both Laurence and Billie Breton enlisted in the 1st Canadian Pioneer Battalion. Within a month Basil would enlist in the CEF 138th Battalion. At some point Basil was transferred to the Indian Army and received a commission. Basil would serve in a Camel Corp in Persia, now modern-day Iran, for the remainder of the war.

Laurence was wounded in France and sent to a military hospital in England. While in hospital he would meet his future wife Marie, a nurse in the hospital. Later the army would transfer him to Halifax, where he served until the end of the war.

The Breton brothers, and their cousin Billie, returned to Telfordville in about 1920. By this time both Douglas and Laurence had married. Basil and his family returned, but only for a short period of time. They would soon move to Vancouver Island where they ran a hotel until 1939. Basil then moved to the West Indies and started the first tourist hotel on the island of Antigua.

The three remaining Breton's joined forces in running the Telfordville store for a period of time. Eventually, Billie would take over operation of the store, Laurence would move back to the farm, and Douglas was starting to become involved in local politics.

During the previous decade the need for a railroad, through the area, had become a priority to the settlers of the area. Douglas and his involvement with the United Farmers of Alberta organization, was one of the major orators in lobbying for the railway for the next several years. In 1921, the United Farmers of Alberta, formed the provincial government and the lobbying intensified for the extension of the railroad.

A group of individual farmers from Lacombe had started a railroad circa 1909, and by 1917 it had reached Bentley. However, by this time they were in financial trouble and the Alberta government became involved, extending the line to Rimbey, taking over the operation of the railroad and renaming it the Lacombe North Western.

That brings me to the close of the second part of the Breton Brother's story. Look for the final chapter in next week's Booster.



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



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# Lifelong Resident Running for Re-election to Brazeau Couny

Sara Wheale is hoping to represent Brazeau County residents on Council by running for reelection in October's municipal election.

Having lived in the County her entire life, Ms. Wheale has always considered it home. Her desire to see future generations thrive in the area has driven her to step up and run again for Council. Having observed local politics for some time, Ms. Wheale has concerns over the direction the County has been going over the past few years and feels her commitment to its citizens make her an excellent choice as a representative. Rooted in the belief that elected officials are elected by the people and therefore should be serving those same people, Ms. Wheale does not approach sitting on Council as an opportunity to earn a free ride. Rather, she wants to continue working hard to ensure that Brazeau County residents' needs are met.

Ms. Wheale sees the County facing numerous challenges, particularly when it comes to finances. The downloading of costs by the provincial government and the decline of the economy in recent years has created a situation wherein Brazeau has both increasing costs and declining revenues. In Ms. Wheale's view, newly-elected Councillors will need to take a very careful look at the County's finances to ensure that reserve savings are not being used to prop up the day-to-day operational costs of the municipality.

Additionally, she feels that infrastructure needs to be prioritized to ensure that residents see their tax dollars being used appropriately. Her experience in construction led Ms. Wheale to fight hard for better maintenance of infrastructure while being critical about their costs. She has found the standards are simply not acceptable and result in further decay of the County's roads - Council needs to see this and do better for residents. During her time on Council,

Ms. Wheale has also worked to bring forward changes to the Land Use Bylaw and Municipal Development Plan to help expedite development and reduce approval times for permits and approvals.

To help achieve this, Ms. Wheale would push Council to build sustainable plans with business and industry while taking a close look at spending. The municipality needs to be clear on what expenses are their responsibility to take on so that money is not wasted on items outside its jurisdiction. Brazeau County has been fortunate to be in a good fiscal position in the past but now is the opportune time to take a fresh look at the balance sheet and focus on what the County needs over what it might simply want. Ms. Wheale's experience with the Breton Library Board has given her a model to refer to for needs-based budgeting. The Board was creative in finding solutions to budgetary pressures and highly responsible with their finances so she feels she can extend those lessons at the County level.

When considering how best to work with neighbouring municipalities, Ms. Wheale believes that a collaboration which results in mutual support without being greedy is the best approach. Municipalities need to make sure they are not taking advantage of each other while working hard to ensure cost-sharing agreements are fair and equitable. In her opinion, Brazeau County needs to put infrastructure first and then prioritize other expenses from there.

If re-elected, Ms. Wheale intends to put citizens first as she is not running for personal gain - she genuinely loves helping people to get results. She believes she is ready to continue being an advocate for citizens through this difficult time to help set up the County for future, long-term success. On a lighter note, Ms. Wheale loves leftovers for breakfast, especially mashed potatoes with gravy and green peas. 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### **Preacher's Point**

Theologian J.I. Packer once said; Scripture views the glorifying of God as a six-fold activity: praising God for all that He is and all His achievements; thanking Him for His gifts and His goodness to us; asking Him to meet our own and others' needs; offering Him our gifts, our service, and ourselves; learning of Him from his word, read and preached, and obeying His voice; telling others of His worth, both by public confession and testimony to what He has done for us. Thus we might say that the basic formulas of worship are these: "Lord, you are wonderful"; "Thank you, Lord"; "Please Lord"; "Take this, Lord"; "Yes, Lord"; "Listen everybody!"

This then is worship in its largest sense: petition as well as praise, preaching as well as prayer, hearing as well as speaking, actions as well as words, obeying as well as offering, loving people as well as loving God. However, the primary acts of worship are those which focus on God directly -- and we must not imagine that work for God in the world is a substitute for direct fellowship with Him in praise and prayer and devotion.

"O Worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness; bow down before Him, His glory proclaim; with gold of obedience, and incense of lowliness, kneel and adore Him: The Lord is His Name!"

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

### **Titanic Salad with Iceberg Lettuce**

The traditional version of this popular salad is drowning in as much as 40 grams of fat per serving - a boatload of fat on a crash course to your hips! You can avoid that sinking feeling with our slimmed down, nutrient-packed version. Our hearts will go on...beating, that is, since we haven't gone overboard with fatty ingredients.

#### **Dressing**

1 1/2 cups light mayo (not fat-free)

1/2 cup light sour cream

1 1/2 Tbsp sugar

1 Tbsp freshly squeezed lemon juice

1/4 tsp salt

#### Salad

1 large head iceberg lettuce

1 1/2 cups thinly sliced baby carrots

1 1/2 cups thinly sliced celery

1 1/2 cups diced red bell pepper

1 cup frozen peas

1/2 cup crumbled cooked bacon

3 cups cooked chopped chicken breast

3/4 cup packed shredded light, medium or old (sharp) cheddar cheese (3 oz/85 g) 1/4 cup chopped green onions

To make the dressing, whisk together all dressing ingredients in a medium bowl. Cover and refrigerate until ready to use.

To assemble salad, tear (don't chop) the letuuce into bite-sized pieces and spread evenly in serving dish. (Use a dish that's about 9 x 12 inches in size, and at least 3 1/2 inches deep a standard glass lasagna dish is too shallow.) To lettuce with carrots, celery, red pepper, peas. bacon, and chicken, in that order.

Spread dressing evenly over chicken layer and spread to edges like you're icing a cake. Sprinkle cheese over dressing and top with green onions.

Cover and refrigerate overnight. Serve cold.



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
