

## Black Gold School Division Releases 2021-2022 School Entry Plan

Nisku, Alberta (August 18, 2021) - Black Gold School Division today released its 2021-2022 School Entry Plan, focused on practices that support safety and the physical, emotional and mental wellbeing of students and staff, as well as the parent/guardian choice of learning.

"We have followed the science, and the advice and guidance from Alberta Health Services and the Chief Medical Officer of Health since the public health emergency began and it served us well, with almost zero transmissions in our schools last year, and we trust that it will continue to do so this year," said Superintendent of Schools Bill Romanchuk.

To reduce the risk of transmission of COVID-19 and other respiratory illnesses, schools will not only incorporate all Alberta Health Services (AHS) recommendations but will exceed them by providing enhanced cleaning measures by custodial staff. "Additionally, our teachers will continue to work hard to promote good hand hygiene and sanitary practices, encourage physical distancing, and cohort students in the younger grades where practical," said Superintendent Romanchuk.

Assemblies and large group gatherings of students will not occur at this time. However,

schools will begin to offer in-person extracurricular activities, performances, work experience, and celebrations while maintaining good public health practices.

Masking is mandatory (with a few exceptions) for all students and staff on school buses; however, masks are optional in schools. The decision to wear a mask is a personal choice based upon an individual's personal health and well-being. Students, staff, and visitors will be supported in their choice to wear a mask or not when at school.

For a safer return to school, Alberta Health Services is encouraging staff, eligible students and family members to get vaccinated with both doses before the school year begins. The decision to be vaccinated is a personal choice and staff will respect the health privacy of students, including their vaccination status.

A variety of resources and supports to help address mental, social and emotional health concerns will be available for students, staff and families. Black Gold's Mental Health at Home website has a number of strategies and resources to support positive mental health for our students.

If parents/guardians want to change their children's choice of learning, they have until noon on Saturday, August 21 to do so. Information on making this change was emailed to families on August 3.





## Estate plans can help you answer questions about the future

The word "estate" conjures images of great wealth, which may be one of the reasons so many people don't develop estate plans – after all, they're not rich, so why make the effort? In reality, though, if you have a family, you can probably benefit from estate planning, irrespective of your asset level. You may well find that a comprehensive estate strategy can help you answer some questions you may find unsettling – or even worrisome.

## Here are a few of these questions:

What will happen to my children? With luck, you (and your co-parent, if you have one) will be alive and well at least until your children reach the age of majority (either 18 or 19, depending on where you live). Nonetheless, you don't want to take any chances, so, as part of your estate strategy, you may want to name a guardian to take care of your children if you are not around. You also might want to name a Trustee – sometimes called a "guardian of the estate" – to manage any assets your minor children might inherit.

**Will there be a fight over my assets?** Without a solid estate strategy in place, your assets could be subject to the time-consuming, expensive – and very public – probate process. During probate, your relatives and creditors can gain access to your records, and possibly even challenge your will. But with proper planning, you can maintain your privacy. As one possible element of an estate plan, a living trust generally allows your property to avoid probate and pass quickly to the beneficiaries you've named.


Who will oversee my finances and my living situation if I become incapacitated? You can build various forms of protection into your estate planning, such as an enduring power of attorney, which allows you to designate someone to manage your financial affairs if you become physically or mentally incapacitated. You could also create a power of attorney for personal care, which allows someone to handle health care decisions on your behalf if you become unable to do so yourself.

Will I shortchange my family if I leave significant assets to charities? Unless you have unlimited resources, you'll have to make some choices about charitable gifts and money for your family. But as part of your estate strategy, you do have some appealing options. For example, you could establish a trust, which provides financial support to your chosen charities for a period of time, with the remaining assets eventually going to your family members. A charitable remainder trust, by contrast, can provide a stream of income for your family members for the term of the trust, before the remaining assets are transferred to one or more charitable organizations.

As you can see, careful estate planning can help you answer many of the questions that may be worrying you. Be aware, though, that certain aspects of estate planning, especially those related to living trusts and charitable trusts, can be complex, so you should consult your estateplanning lawyer or qualified tax professional about your situation. Once you've got your strategy in place, you should be able to face the future with greater clarity and confidence.

## **Titanic Salad with Iceberg Lettuce**

The traditional version of this popular salad is drowning in as much as 40 grams of fat per serving - a boatload of fat on a crash course to your hips! ## Dressing

 1 Tbsp freshly squeezed lemon juice
 1/4 tsp salt

## Salad

large head iceberg lettuce
 1/2 cups thinly sliced baby carrots
 1/2 cups thinly sliced celery
 1/2 cups diced red bell pepper
 cup frozen peas
 cup crumbled cooked bacon
 cups cooked chopped chicken breast

3/4 cup packed shredded light, medium or old (sharp) cheddar cheese (3 oz/85 g) 1/4 cup chopped green onions

To make the dressing, whisk together all dressing ingredients in a medium bowl. Cover and refrigerate until ready to use.


To assemble salad, tear (don't chop) the letuuce into bite-sized pieces and spread evenly in serving dish. (Use a dish that's about  $9 \times 12$ inches in size, and at least  $3 \times 1/2$  inches deep a standard glass lasagna dish is too shallow.) To lettuce with carrots, celery, red pepper, peas. bacon, and chicken, in that order.

Spread dressing evenly over chicken layer and spread to edges like you're icing a cake. Sprinkle cheese over dressing and top with green onions.

Cover and refrigerate overnight. Serve cold.
