FEDERAL-PROVINCIAL CHILD CARE AGREEMENT

The Alberta Government has successfully negotiated an agreement with the federal government that will support the expansion of accessible, affordable and high-quality child care that gives families the choice they need. This made-in-Alberta plan also reduces fees for parents of 0 to kindergarten-aged children by an average of half next year, and provides an average of \$10 per day child care by 2026.

Through the agreement, \$3.8 billion will be invested in child care for children aged 0 to Kindergarten over the next 5 years:

\$2.865 billion to lower child care fees for Alberta parents

\$240.64 million to increase the number of child care spaces

\$202.6 million to develop and fund child care options to support vulnerable and diverse populations, as well as children with extra needs

\$306.16 million to support licensed programs and certified educators in offering high-quality support for families in their communities.

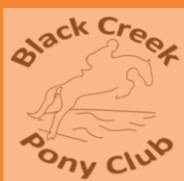

FAMILY AND COMMUNITY SUPPORT SERVICES ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Acts in an advisory capacity to Council and to the director of community services. The committee is responsible for overseeing the development and operation of the program, and ensuring the FCSS Act and regulations are adhered to.

The committee is comprised of the following:

- one council representative from each participating municipality of Calmar, Thorsby and Warburg
- two representatives from Leduc County Council
- two members at large – county residents, with one representing rural east and one representing rural west
- **Position available:** one; representing rural east
- **Term:** two years ending Dec. 31, 2023
- **Meeting frequency:** five times per year (February, April, June, September and November) commencing at 5 p.m.

LEDUC COUNTY LIBRARY BOARD

Manages, regulates and controls municipal library services. The committee is comprised of six members of the New Sarepta library region and two Leduc County Council members.

- **Positions available:** two
- **Term:** three years ending Dec. 31, 2024
- **Meeting frequency:** four times per year on Mondays commencing at 6:30 p.m.

This is a voluntary position; no per diem or mileage is provided.

PARKS AND RECREATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE

INTERMUNICIPAL SUBDIVISION AND DEVELOPMENT APPEAL BOARD

This is a quasi-judicial board comprised of council members and residents from Leduc County and the Village of Warburg. The board acts independently and makes decisions on subdivision, development permit and stop order appeals.

The ISDAB makes its decision using fact-based evidence, then applies legal rules as per legislation and planning documents such as the Municipal Development Plan and the Leduc County Land Use Bylaw. When the ISDAB makes its decision, it's final and cannot be overturned unless the ISDAB makes a law or jurisdictional error. All board members must successfully complete a training program set or approved by the Minister of Municipal Affairs.

- **Term:** three years ending Dec. 31, 2024
- **Meeting frequency:** as needed upon receipt of an appeal; generally held on Thursday or Friday commencing at 9 a.m.

Pioneer Branch No. 144**

Remembrance Day 2021 is certainly a day to remember. Terrible Covid-19 really screwed up plans for our service again this year. HOWEVER, because we had our service outside at the Cenotaph uptown, we were very appreciative of the perfect November Day. The sun shone bright and early, the wind blew elsewhere and the temperature was a comfortable "0" degrees. Along with the good weather, came the faithful families who have been supporting us for years. Besides our many locals, we had Joan Erickson, and son Brent from Drayton Valley; Grant & Corinne Johnson from Vasa Lodge, Ordan Kisser and son Jeff from Spruce Grove; Grant & Connie Nystrom from Edmonton and Edward & Brandon Sulz from Wetaskiwin.

We were very thankful to have Lieutenant-Colonel (Retired) Al Bratland as our MC again this year, as well as Chaplain Scott Brown and Pastor Glen McBride who have served us well for many years.

This November 11 was a special time for us, to celebrate the 100th anniversary of our red Poppy. The first writing about this tenacious wildflower that flourished in the Battlefields in Belgium in 1915, was by LCol John Macrae, who wrote the poem "In Flanders Fields" after his friend was killed, and he conducted an impromptu funeral for him.

In 1921, two women, Anna Guerin and Moina Michael organized a Poppy Campaign to help wounded soldiers. As a result, the Poppy became very popular and still is today. Poppy donations throughout Canada are huge and our local fund received \$1,770.35 from boxes put in most businesses, well done.

Also a huge thank you to our dignitaries who took the time to be available to lay wreaths and poppies on the Cenotaph. They were Thorsby's Corporal Robert Gillies - Govt of Canada; Mrs Wendy Snow - MLA rep for Drayton Valley-

Devon; Councillor Ray Scobie - County of Leduc; Mayor Darryl Hostyn - Town of Thorsby; Comrade Rod Blair - Canadian Forces and Comrade Elaine Blair - RCL Thorsby Pioneer Branch 144.

What this means for parents.

Parents will see reduced fees starting in early 2022 and for the next 2 years. While additional information will be shared soon, families can expect to pay an average of:

\$10 per day if they earn up to \$119,999

\$11 to \$17 per day if they earn between \$120,000 and \$179,999

\$22.19 per day if they earn \$180,000 and above

For example, a family earning \$120,000 with an infant attending a licensed facility-based centre full-time currently pays on average \$1172 per month. By year 2022, this family can expect to pay an average of \$284 per month.

Remembrance Day Thank you Presentation from November 11, 2015

written by Fred De Boer

Thank you Canada for sending your troops to free Holland from 5 years tyranny, oppression and terror in 1945. Today we commemorate this event from 70 years ago.

Good day Lieutenant Colonel, Army officials and Cadets, Government officials and other Remembrance Day participants and incumbents. I am Fred De Boer and have served in the Dutch Army with the Koninklijke Marechaussee, which is the Royal Queen's Guard and Traffic Division after the war.

As a Grade 4 student we went on a school trip to the Zoo. But prior to that we got to see the Grebbeberg a small mountain in Holland where in May 1940 heavy fighting between the Dutch and the Germans took place. Then we visited Margraten, a war cemetery where many Canadians are buried. This made a huge impression on us to see all these white crosses and to know each cross represented a war soldier. We learned to respect life in a hurry! I still have this picture in mind today and I know how ugly war is, its devastations and unhappiness.

De Boer family

My father worked for the farmer and one day the Germans demanded they brought in all their horses. The Germans would pick the horse they needed and the unwanted horses you could take home again. The farmer knew they also could take the person delivering the horse (for Forced Labor) and did not want to go nor did he want to send his son, so they send the hired hand: my dad. The farmer instructed my dad to pep talk the not so good listening horse as not to loose the good horse. However the Germans took the good horse and did not want the other so they sent my dad home again and take that bad horse out of here! That saved my dad of being sent to Germany for Forced Labor! He still did have a difficult time getting the horse back to the farm! He did, but now he had to hide and change jobs. THIS WAS THE ONLY WAY OF NOT GETTING CAUGHT. There have been more close calls!

One day the Germans visited the farm and removed my grandparents and the youngest daughter out of the house. Since she had dark hair and jewish features the Germans accused my grandfather of hiding a jewish girl. NO he said this is my daughter. The Germans took her again

and said Jude!! Nein he said THAT IS MINE!! And she shook herself loose and ran to her dad screaming HEITIE! which means daddy! They were going to shoot my grandfather as they pointed the revolver in his direction. But luckily they did not shoot and left.

Elzinga family

My mother's family had a German in the house. It was the German's leader idea to have a perfect Germanic race so he wanted the young Germans to marry Dutch girls. So the Germans placed a German soldier with families who had daughters, whether you liked or not! The soldier arrived at night for supper time, had breakfast in the morning and left for the start of day at the local school in the morning. He jumped into my grandparents bedstee (bed) at which my grandfather protested. He said you go sleep somewhere else! They rearranged the sleeping areas with the kids and slept with them. At first the soldier was friendly but as time passed, he started misbehaving himself. This happened just about every day until one day he did not show up. You were not allowed to go out at night after dark. So my grandfather waited till the next morning to report it as this is mandatory at the local school. Here he was held captive for two days for questioning. They accused him of killing the German soldier, and wanted all detail of what he knew. Later the German soldier was found drowned in a nearby canal and a gin bottle. They figured my grandfather had drowned him and accused him again and were going to shoot him and his son. Somehow my grandfather convinced them that they had not killed him!

Roeleveld family

My mother-in-law was high pregnant towards the end of the war. Their third baby was due soon. However she wanted to spare the other two children aged 6 and 3 from having to see any birth. She talked with grandpa and he was going to take his grandchildren outside in the street for a large walk and as it was May 5th 1945 and the Canadians will be soon in town! When they returned home the 6 year old said: Mam you are wrong the Canadians are coming next week! Upon which she answered: Look in the crib there is your new baby sister! She got named after the three royal Dutch princesses Margriet, Irene and Beatrix.

Van der Toorn family

Grand mother shared her brother who was a baker had starved himself to death during the

cold winter of 1944 - 1945.

In the extremely cold winter of 1944 – 1945 many Dutch citizens died of hunger. In the cities there was no fuel or food. You were not allowed outside after dark, but people risked their lives cutting down trees in the streets for keeping themselves warm. They went with bicycles without tires great distances to trade for food at a farmer. My father-in-law who lives near the sea trapped in the dunes, but even there animals became scarce. One time with his brother-in-law they saw a cat and were able to kill it. Not wanting to upset their wives they skinned and gutted it. When they got home they presented it as a hare and did it ever taste good!!!

Through the Underground my in-laws heard that the Allied Forces were closing in on the Dutch borders. They kept track by marking their progress on maps. Oh how they remembered the first Canadians rolling into the city! They remember the smiles on the soldier's faces! Some young women got a ride on the tanks or motor cycles! Everybody was excited, freedom! Finally Free! People danced and shouted for joy!

From my parents, my wife's parents and the Dutch nation I want to sincerely thank the Allied Forces including Canadians, Americans, Brits, Poles and others for the offers they brought for my freedom and our families. But also look back at how many lives it took and many Canadian families who suffered not seeing their loved ones come home. In the Netherlands also known as Holland 7600 Canadians rest in war cemeteries like Arnhem Oosterbeek (1678), Groesbeek (2339), Bergen op Zoom (971), Holten (1355), Overloon (279), Venray (679) and others.
