
ANOTHER BIG CRASH INTO A WARBURG BUSINESS

A significant amount of damage has been done to now 2 local Warburg Businesses. On Dec 6, an SUV was entering the wash bay but didn't stop and drove right through the wall into the store/laundromat/office area at the Warburg Car/Truck Wash & Bottle Depot. This follows the incident of the loader being driven through Direct Line Insurance/ATB on November 28.

Fortunately, Shannon Flad, an employee who was working at the time of the crash was not in the affected area but had stepped out when someone had been knocking on the back door. "Thanks to the gentleman that was banging on the back door this morning. I left the front area to come let you in. Some things really do happen for a reason. Forever grateful for that annoying knock" says Shannon on a Facebook post.

It is unclear what happened and why the vehicle was going so fast entering the wash bay but was deemed an accident by co-owner of the Car/Truck Wash Cory Babcook. The driver was not hurt. The Thorsby/Breton RCMP have not announced any charges.

Currently the 2 car bays will be closed temporarily but patrons can still use the Truck Bay which is open from 8am - 8pm. The Propane and Purolator will continue to be available from 9am - 5pm and the Bottle Depot will continue to be open from 9am - 4:30pm,



LETTER TO THE EDITOR

To the Editor:

Brazeau County Council has come up with a Code of Conduct document as required by Municipal Affairs.

The first section (A) deals with the Code with reference to actual behavior and accountabilities to each other and to the public. The second section (B) deals with Pecuniary Interest. The third section (C) deals with Compliance.

My reading of this document suggests it is a good one up to section three (C) Compliance. It must be noted that Compliance is "... self-regulated by Councillor and Council...."

To this writer, it means there is NO compulsion to honour its requirements (even if it becomes Bylaw rather than Policy).

The second issue of penalty is more problematic—there are NO penalties for contravention. Until there is a mechanism for compliance (e.g., an arm's length public board with authority) and appropriate penalties for contravention, the proposal is moot.

It might be of value for members of the public to read this document (available from the County) and see for themselves how well Council adheres to it.

In The Chronicles of Narnia, an allegory by C.S. Lewis, the author has two girls, Susan and Lucy, getting ready to meet Aslan the lion, who represents Christ. Two talking animals, Mr. and Mrs. Beaver, prepare the children for the encounter. "Ooh," said Susan, "I though He was a man. Is He quite safe? I shall feel rather nervous about meeting a lion." "That you will, dearie." said Mrs. Beaver. "And make no mistake, if there's anyone who can appear before Aslan without their knee's knocking, they're either braver than most or else just silly."

"Then isn't He safe?" said Lucy. "Safe?" said Mr. Beaver. "Don't you hear what Mrs. Beaver tells you? Who said anything about safe? Of course He isn't safe. But He's good. He's the king, I tell you!"

The Bible reminds us in Proverbs chapter 9 verse 10, "that the fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom, and the knowledge of the Holy One is understanding." Sadly, many will look at this verse as a negative, the word fear being the negative. With that, they quickly disregard the importance of a holy fear. The verse is speaking to the incomparable glory and awe of God. That He far exceeds the reaches of our minds or hearts, and yet came to us as a baby, helpless and weak. 
