





Genesee Battery Energy Storage System

Capital Power is sharing information about plans to develop a battery energy storage system ("BESS") at the Genesee Generating Station. We will be seeking regulatory approval from the Alberta Utility Commission in early 2022.

The BESS will be used to store, and later deploy, up to 210 MW of energy, using lithium-ion batteries. The project will use best-in-class battery storage technology and be amongst the first large-scale storage projects in Alberta.

Located entirely within the existing footprint of the Genesee Generating Station, the BESS will create no air emissions and will not require additional water supply during the electricity storage and deployment processes.



With the Christmas Season fast upon us it seems that a present for the good folks of Thorsby is in order so here goes:

My name is Ivor Foster and I served as your councilor for the past four years. From the outset I have to say that it has been my pleasure and an honor to represent you and be part of a dynamic and motivated Thorsby Town Council. Our council has an impressive record of achievement over the past four years. I would like to present some hi-lights to clear up any misconceptions about our council's record that were spread by a few unknown voices during the last election.

Starting in 2017, after a long protracted process we were finally able to convince Alberta Transportation to install new signs on 778 South that seriously alleviated the noise levels of large transport trucks use of engine brakes because of the shorter 50 K sign just inside the town limits.

Unfortunately we failed to convince the authorities that a school zone was appropriate for the crossing at 48th Avenue and Highway 778. However, signage was improved to make it safer to cross 778 at all times.

A Ride-For-Dad event garnered a great deal of favorable publicity for Thorsby as the town and volunteers played host to more than five hundred motorcycles and riders. Who says there is no volunteer commitment in our town?

A request to the Ag Society to take part in their May long weekend festivities was accepted and as a result we can look forward to a long successful partnership in the future. In addition we should be extending an invitation to our First Nation neighbors to add their color and customs as well.

In the summer of 2018 we acted on past council's list of major infrastructure projects. First was 54th Avenue. A massive repair bill the winter before (3 repairs that cost the town over \$100,000) ensured that immediate remediation was necessary and was completed before winter.

At the same time remediation was completed on a segment of 47^{th} street between 49^{th} avenue and 50^{th} avenue.

In addition, the intersection at Hankin and 48thAve as well as lower Hankin past Happy Haven and 48th Ave to 51street was completed. A happy note saw the curbs redone and the boulevard was sodded instead

of seeded. The result was a complete new look and still looks good today.

Unfortunately, the impending Coronovirus Pandemic forced the closure of the recreation center. A wise and necessary plan formulated by Alberta Health Service meant that all further use of the center had to be put aside for the duration of the emergency. As a result and in keeping with other municipalities the FCSS office was re-located to space in the administration building.

In the following months a number of changes were introduced to soften the Pandemic effect on our population. Among them was a reduction in taxes, and changes to the payment system to allow more time to pay.

The Pandemic also gave council a chance to examine our by-laws to make them more efficient and closer to the reality of day-to-day operations. And I would like to make it clear that the by-laws we inherited only required minor tweaking here and there

The resignation of our CFO (for medical reasons) and our Public Works Manager was followed closely by the retirement of our CAO (Christine Burke). Our search for a replacement for Christine was unsuccessful until our newly hired CFO (Tamara Sloboda) threw her hat—in-the-ring (so to speak) and was accepted in her present role as CAO. With her professional credentials (CPA) and the business focus of our council we have made great strides in gaining efficiency in all matters of budget and operations. (No one could possibly disagree with the result of gaining a million dollars worth of infrastructure this year without borrowing money or increasing taxes.)

Further emphasis on by-law enforcement continued with a sharing agreement with the Town of Millet and the acquisition of a dedicated patrol vehicle from Brazeau County. At this time following the departure of our most recent By-Law Officer no replacement (during our mandate) had been hired.

An arborist inventory of type, condition, and number of trees on municipal property was conducted, followed closely by the examination and condition of sidewalks in Thorsby. A catalog of photographs detailing various conditions requiring remedial action led to a plan for repair and replacement. At this time the decision on what must be addressed a soon as possible and what could be put off to a later date must be made by the new council

Covid 19 restrictions resulted in an increased

use of electronic communications including Webinar and Zoom in particular. In spite of limited capacity for visitors in the council chambers we were able to accommodate the interests of town and county residents in the interactive process. In all cases the management of council matters was open to the scrutiny of all interested parties unless in some cases the issues required the use of in-camera sessions.

Although the Pandemic forced the closure of the Rec Center and placed limits on other activities, 'business as usual' continued with great work from our Public Works staff, the addition of office staff, and a constant search for efficiencies in operation budgets. In addition it was decided that in order assure the future needs of the Library the ability to expand would always be there.

The town was finally able to start work on Taylor Park after ownership approval was granted by Land Titles. Much work had been done prior to a dedication date but discovery of three fuel tanks buried under the sidewalk put further work on hold. **Remediation that should have been accomplished years ago needed to be taken care of now.** The good news is that the work may not cost more than the \$50,000.00 that had been approved. Unfortunately the discovery of two more tanks pushed the cost to \$80,000 plus. The bad news will depend on whether there is further contamination beneath Taylor Park itself.

Whatever the result, the Taylor Park Committee can take a measure of pride in the fact that with completion and final dedication of the Park, their initial vision, will still be there for all our citizens to enjoy.

Efforts to gain an audit of 3920 accounts were turned down, with the result that we refused to pay the annual fee of \$5,000.00. Having already spent thousand of dollars, the only tangible result was a cost saving in the area of 50 cents per household for a garbage contract that benefitted all 3920 municipal members. The contract lapsed in 2020 with the result that a new contract for Thorsby was signed at a better rate.

Monthly meeting of County officials has resulted in a great deal of savings in operation equipment and promises greater municipal co-operation in the future.

Diligent efforts by our CAO enabled us to fund remediation projects at no additional cost to our tax-payers. Much of the work involved road surface repair, some of it on 778 despite the fact that Alberta Transportation declined our request to share the cost.

The list also included curb replacement between Hankin and 48th street.

Hankin street was refurbished along with 48th avenue between Hankin and 778. Long needed surface repairs were also undertaken on 49th avenue between 48th street and 50th avenue. Re-surfacing of parts of the Community Hall parking were completed as well as new bridges and railing were installed at the rec-centre and library entrances.

Paving was completed on 49th avenue between 48th Street and 46th street. MCI commitment precluded spending the money on any other project.

Other work included re-paving and fencing the tennis courts, with the subsequent repainting lines for pickle ball, tennis and basketball delayed till the spring of 2022.

The playground at the Rec Centre was rededicated to the Kuzio family.

A grant for \$903,000.00 was applied for and if approved will go a long way to allow the disabled access to all areas of the Rec. Centre.

The voters concern for more communication with the community resulted in a new Website that is completely interactive and offers a great deal of information. In addition, a new electronic sign to be installed at the North entrance to town was purchased for \$70,000. The money was from the Coal Transition Grant, ear marked for economic development. Finally, following a long delay by Alberta Transportation, the project was allowed to go ahead. The sign when erected in the spring will be available for Thorsby administration and community groups to advertise events, etc.

On a final note, it must be expressed at this point, that employing the efforts of CFO/CAO Sloboda came at the precise time that Thorsby needed her expertise in the worst way. With her due diligence and 14–16 hour work days, she was able to accomplish a great deal on budget and operational concerns that helped us back away from the highest debt load for a community of our size. And yes, we still have a long way to go. But there is still room for improvement, one of which must be a solution to the 'elephant in the china shop' water treatment plant. We started the dialogue and it is in the best interest of the town of Thorsby to continue.

Finally, at this time I would like to offer my sincere best wishes for a happy season and a successful new year

The Bible Truth Page

Physical Healing

I have heard it said that Jesus died for our spiritual healing. This statement is not at all true. Jesus died so that we could have forgiveness of sins and be made righteous, the same as He is righteous. In the process we also receive a new spirit and physical healing. This is plain to see in the Bible if we are willing to read it as written. Let's start with 1 Peter 2:24. "He Himself bore our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness. 'By His wounds you were healed'" (Modern English Version 1 Peter 2:24). Notice especially the last part of that verse, "By His wounds you were healed". The wounds Peter is referring to are the wounds that Jesus received when He was whipped before He was crucified (Matt. 27:26). He took those wounds for our physical healing. Peter is actually quoting a prophesy about Jesus from the Old Testament book of Isaiah. "Surely he has borne our grief and carried our sorrows; Yet we esteemed him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted. But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities; the chastisement of our peace was upon him, and by his stripes we are healed" (Isaiah 53:4-5). The Hebrew word used for grief in this passage includes sickness, disease, and calamity, as well as grief. The Hebrew word that sorrow is translated from means physical pain, mental pain, affliction, and sorrow. Healed is translated from a Hebrew word that means to cure, to heal, make healthful and make whole. When we accept these scriptures as written we can clearly see that they are talking about physical healing.

I have one last nail to drive into the spiritual healing coffin, and that is Matthew 8:14-17. "When Jesus entered Peter's house, He saw his wife's mother, lying sick with a fever. He touched her hand, and the fever left her. And she rose and served them. When the evening came, they brought to Him many who were possessed with demons. And He cast out the spirits with His word, and healed all who were sick, to fulfill what was spoken by Isaiah the prophet, 'He Himself took our infirmities and bore our sicknesses'" (Matt. 8:14-17). This short passage removes any doubt as to the context of 1 Peter 2:24 and Isaiah 53:4-5. The Word of God means what it says. Jesus cast out demons and physically healed all who were sick to fulfill the prophesy in Isaiah 53:4-5. That is the same physical healing Peter referred to when he wrote "By His wounds you were healed". Also notice that he said were. That word is past tense. Peter wrote this letter after Jesus had been whipped for our healing. We were healed when Jesus was whipped; our healing has already been provided. All we have to do is believe Jesus and take a stand against the devil who stole our healing from us.


