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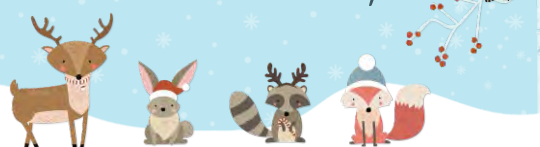

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# Soul Care

It seemed to be a familiar pattern that I was noticing with my girl, after what I thought was a good opportunity for connection, we walked away from our time together with her friend and we noticed that she became angry. What was hard to understand is that she was not angry at anything in particular, but just angry. Then we noticed that the anger was starting to surface more and more each day.

After some digging, we came to the realization that she was dealing with loss and grief. With our recent move and leaving with no opportunity to say goodbye due to covid, we just left. We came to the awareness that she missed her best friend and all that was familiar. Personally, I have noticed that I express myself in angry ways and if I can be honest with myself, it is also all due to loss and grief as anger is one of the stages of grief. When my father died, I was angry for what felt like years. Pain is also a big indicator of anger. I have been living with chronic pain for years and I notice that when I have 'bad' days I become angry and depressed.

We have witnessed many different behaviours this past year. Responding in anger was one of them.

An article that I came across on the root of anger explains that pain, injustice, fear, and frustration all contribute to unexplained long-term emotions of anger. It is no surprise that anger is all around us. In the last two years, we have all been living in very frustrating times. When we feel that we have no control or no voice, we become angry. And out of that anger, we can do and say things that we otherwise never would.

In addition to pain, injustice, loss, grief, and frustration many other things can trigger anger, including stress, family problems, financial issues, medical concerns, and the list goes on. Anger itself

isn't considered a disorder, but anger can also arise from known symptoms of many underlying health disorders such as alcoholism, depression, OCD, ADHD, ODD or bipolar disorder and these disorders need to be addressed with a professional.

Anger can also be present due to unforgiveness. Who do you need to forgive, let go, move on from, in order to move out of your anger? May we forgive over and over again ... until we feel no more anger.

Anger is complicated and real. We should not ignore it but explore it. With a bit of research, we can see that anger affects different parts of your body, including your heart, brain, and muscles. In 2011, a study found that anger can cause an increase in testosterone levels and decrease in cortisol levels, it can increase blood pressure, increase heart rate, you may feel tingling sensation and muscle tension. You may also feel irritable, frustrated, a sense of rage, stress, feeling overwhelmed, guilty and anxiety setting in. All of these can harm your health in a drastic way. We were not created to be in constant anger.

We also need to remember that there can be healthy anger, even Jesus was angry at different times in the Bible. I am angry at children being abandoned, any kind of abuse or bullying, hunger, any form of injustice, lack of love shown, unkind words...I think those are things worthy of being angry about.

Today, check in with our anger.

What are you angry about? Is it healthy or is it making you ill?

Maybe this year, we strive to be less angry and more joyful.

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# LETTER TO THE EDITOR

To the Editor:

Last week I made an excursion to RR53 and Township Road 474 (County of Brazeau).

Two years ago (or so) a road was built from RR 53 to RR 54 at a cost of close to \$1,000,000 (including washout repair the following year after construction), and the road banks are still sloughing.

Before construction, two public meetings were held for public input as to the viability/acceptability/necessity of extending TWP RD 474. The one I attended had only ONE person in favour. At that time NO justification was provided as to its necessity. It should be noted that the meeting was poorly chaired in that not everyone was allowed to speak.

In previous posts, I have stated that this \$1,000,000 expenditure benefited only one person. I was wrong! It appears to benefit NO ONE! All lands bordering it have access from north/south roads.

With the above as a backdrop, Council has approved the spending of about \$250,000 just for an engineering report to extend the above road another mile (going east from RR53 to RR52).

Some obvious issues become apparent along the proposed route. There are only two land owners on this proposed extension and both have access to their lands elsewhere. One landowner is vociferously opposed to the project. So who benefits as NO ONE NEEDS this road.

How does this expenditure benefit the other 8000 residents of the County?

Additionally, it should be noted that there are

two significant valleys to cross, one of which has a fish-occupied stream, along with the issue that several existing springs will create.

Since Mr. Ekstrom voted in favour of this expenditure and has land bordering this proposal, a possible pecuniary interest will have to be decided by someone else.

To this observer, there is no need; and with no apparent benefit to anyone, why is this project even considered?

Think about it. We as the residents of Brazeau County need to realize that once the money is gone, we will need to pay higher taxes and do with fewer services to cover this. WE as the public need to voice OUR concerns to our councillors and do it soon. Ask questions! How much money is left in reserves? How much debt is the County carrying? Why were we led to believe we are still a wealthy County? Don't leave it until it is too late!

Given that there are 20 plus other road requests, none of which have been considered (to date), makes one wonder what the justifications are; i.e., what makes this road so important to this Council/County?

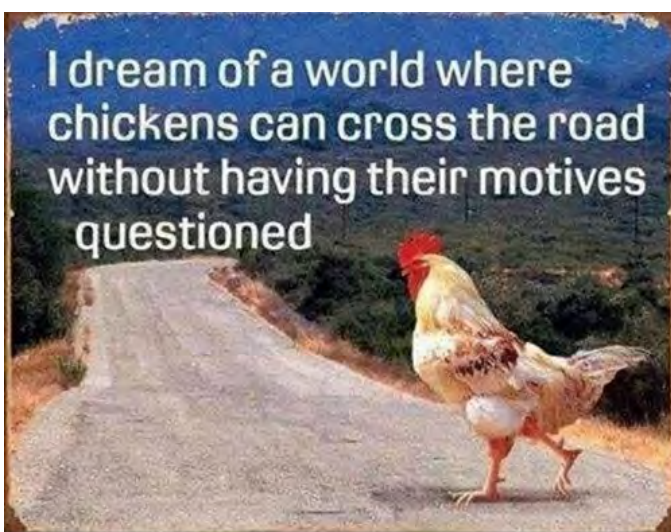

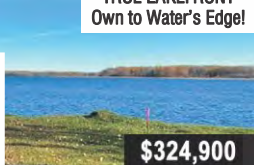
