ALBERTA RCMP STATEMENT REGARDING COUTTS **BORDER ASSEMBLY**

February 1, 2022, Coutts, Alta.—The Alberta RCMP continue to act to preserve the peace and maintain public safety at the Coutts border crossing.

What may have begun as a peaceful assembly quickly turned into an unlawful blockade. While the Alberta RCMP has been in a position to conduct enforcement, we have been engaged with protesters at the Coutts border crossing in an effort to find a peaceful and safe resolution for all involved. We thought we had a path to resolution, the protesters eventually chose not to comply.

As of this morning, further action is being taken by the Alberta RCMP as this blockade continues to impede the ability for emergency agencies to provide full services to area residents. It has also negatively impacted the flow of goods and services, and impedes the public's freedom of movement.

A Highway is considered essential infrastructure. It is unlawful to wilfully obstruct, interrupt or interfere with the construction, maintenance, use or operation of any essential infrastructure in a manner that renders the essential infrastructure dangerous, useless, inoperative or ineffective as per the Critical Infrastructure Defence Act of Alberta. Anyone who actively blocks a highway-or aids, counsels or directs a highway to be blocked-may be subject to arrest and charge under this act.

Person's participating in this blockade can also expect enforcement of any contraventions of the Criminal Code of Canada, the Traffic Safety Act and Use of Highway and Rules of the Road Regulations at this location and area roadways.

The Alberta RCMP uses necessary measures to protect the fundamental freedom of peaceful assembly and freedom of expression, to promote the safety of all citizens, to enforce laws and to maintain peace and order. In turn, it must be recognized that while everyone has a right to peaceful freedom of expression; the general public, local residents and businesses also have the right to a safe environment and freedom of movement. This event is not a peaceful assembly.

February 2, 2022 UPDATE Coutts, Alta.—The Alberta RCMP continue to respond to the Coutts border crossina.

This afternoon, in response to concerned citizens in the area of Coutts, the participants in the blockade made the decision to open a lane going northbound and southbound on Highway 4 near the Coutts border. This allows for area residents to have freedom of movement, school bussing that was impacted to be reinstated, emergency services to provide full services, border access and the flow of goods and services to resume.

The Alberta RCMP remain on scene and our efforts continue to be focused on fully reopening services.

Feb. 3, 2022 The Alberta Association of Chiefs of Police Joint Statement on Protests and Coutts Blockade

Edmonton - Over the past week, many Albertans have seen protests take place on their roads and in their communities. Some Albertans have participated in these protests, convoys and blockades. As these events have unfolded, all of Alberta's police services and Alberta Sheriffs, throughout the province, have worked together to ensure public safety has been balanced with the right to protest legally and peacefully.

The safety of all who are involved in any of the events that have taken place has been our first priority, and it will continue to be as we move forward. If necessary, we will take enforcement actions at events like these, responding accordingly to the risks to public safety they may present. Our services are working together, and sharing information and resources, just as we do each and every day. Albertans can feel assured that their respective police services and law enforcement agencies will maintain peace and security across this province - together

Council Meeting Notes by Carol Rempel

February 1, 2022 Regular Meeting

The Library Board made a presentation requesting the Town of Thorsby Council pass a motion accepting the change of wording and amend the wording of the Annual Audited Balance Sheet and Income Statement for our reviewer to match the Library Act. The amendments to the agreements will be discussed by Council and brought forward at the February 15th council meeting.

Select Engineering was invited to present the Capital infrastructure Plan and state of Thorsby's infrastructure. Jarrad talked about the work that has been done in the past and plans that are recommended. There were some upgrades last year such as the sewer replacement on 54 Ave., and upgrades to 49th and 48a Ave, and 46th St in 2021. There were shared costs with Alberta Transportation last year but there are still problems on 52 St. with leaks and holes and it will continue to need more repairs. A Water Network Analysis was done. He was asked what are the priorities for 2022 on a limited budget? There was discussion that 50th Ave. has sewer issues, water main breaks, and frost issues. It was also mentioned that this is a truck route. The council accepted the presentation as information for the 2022 budget. Select Engineering will be invited to come to the budget meeting when dates are set.

Bylaw 2008-08, a Meeting Procedural Bylaw was discussed for repeal. Discussions showed that a draft for the bylaw was needed to update it and modernize it. It was referred to a future COW (Committee of the Whole) meeting for a full discussion.

The CFO report mentioned again that St. Arnaus Pinsent Stemen, Charter Professional Accountants, will continue to be appointed as auditors for 2022 and 2023 for an annual cost of \$11,000 plus a cost-of-living fee. Their fees did not change from 2020-2021.



As per Beverly's wishes there will be no formal service.



The Prairie Winterscape : Creative Gardening for the Forgotten Season is a book that I discovered when I was researching information about winterscaping for the Front Yards in Bloom – Winterscapes project. The premise of the book is that gardens should be just as beautiful and interesting in winter as in summer.

Nora (one of the two authors) spoke at a past EHS Speaker Evening, so I thought I'd check this book out. I like that the authors recognize that a good garden is more than just colour. A mix of shapes, sizes, movement, sound, light, and shadow will create beauty even when all is covered with a blanket of snow, ice, or frost, waiting for discovery. Indeed, the beauty of shape and size is enhanced by the smoothing effect of the snow. The delicate beauty of hoarfrost on branches can take your breath away. Take time to enjoy the garden all year-round, not just in the summer!

The Prairie Winterscape provides excellent advice for setting the stage and preparing for winter. Of course it takes the summer to get ready for the winter beauty to shine. I like how the book provides a wide range of plant materials especially suited for viewing in winter (and summer!). Also, it is appropriate that this book focuses on the prairies in winter. There are lots of pictures of creative ideas for your garden.



Hello, I have an important message of good news for you from God, the creator of heaven and earth. The good news is that God loves you and he wants to bless you with life, love, health, healing, and a lot of other good things. In order to give us life in exchange for the death that we deserve for being sinful, God had to pay off our debt of sin. But the truth is none of us are good without Jesus. The Bible says in Romans, "For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God" (King James Version Rom. 3:23). It also says, "But the scripture hath concluded all under sin, that the promise by faith of Jesus Christ might be given to them that believe" (Gal. 3:22). "For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord" (Rom. 6:23). So, there it is in black and white. We deserve death but God has given us the gift of eternal life. Have a look at what Jesus said in John, "And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up: That whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have eternal life. For God so loved the world, that he gave His only begotten Son that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life. For God sent not His Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through Him might be saved. He that believeth on Him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God. And this is the condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil. For everyone that doeth evil hateth the light, neither cometh to the light, lest his deeds should be reproved. But he that doeth truth cometh to the light, that his deeds may be made manifest, that they are wrought in God" (John 3:14-21). He has also told us how we can receive the gift of eternal life which He has provided for us. "That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised Him from the dead, thou shalt be saved. For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation. For the scripture saith, Whosoever believeth on Him shall not be ashamed. For there is no difference between the Jew and the Greek: for the same Lord over all is rich unto all that call upon Him. For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved" (Rom. 10:9-13). Here is a prayer that you could pray if you want to accept the gift of everlasting life: "Lord God of heaven and earth, please forgive me for all my sins. I accept you as my Lord and Saviour. Thank you Lord Jesus for giving me life and forgiveness, and health, and healing, in exchange for the everlasting punishment and death that I deserved. I give you the rest of my life here on earth in service to you." Now here is how you live for God: "Jesus said unto him, 'Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets'" (Matt. 22:37-40).


