Community Volunteer Income Tax Program – FREE INCOME TAX PREPARATION

For Low Income Persons, Families, seniors and students. Although this is something, that most of us would like to avoid thinking about and doing. I am afraid that this is unavoidable. You need to file your income tax each year, even if you have no income to report. By doing this you may receive benefits that you did not know you were eligible for. Also, in the event of the death of your spouse, benefits can easily be transferred to you, if you have filled a return for the last calendar year. If you did not file a tax return in 2021 you may not be receiving benefits from the government that you are eligible for. The focus of the Community Volunteer Tax Program is to assist those individuals who have limited income. includes seniors, families and students. If your income was approximately in one of the following categories you may qualify for assistance.

	1 person	30,000
	2 person family	37,000
	3 person family	40,500
•	4 person family	43,500

We are <u>not able</u> to complete returns with income from the following sources:

Capital Gains or Losses, Farming Income, Rental Income, Self-Employment, Interest exceeding \$1,000, Bankruptcies, Deceased Persons

This service is FREE to those who qualify. If you require this service, please gather your information and bring it to the Village of Breton office Monday to Thursday between 8:30 – 4:00. Clients will be notified when your return is completed. The program will run from March 1 – April 30, 2022

We require the following information in order to complete your return:

- Personal Information (Social Insurance Number, Birth date, Marital Status, Address)
- Dependent's information spouse/ children's names, birthdates.
- -All "T" Slips (T4's, T4A, OAS etc.)

- All Forms, Schedules, and Labels you have received from Revenue Canada.
- Receipts for any expenses such as medical, moving, tuition, sporting activities. Printouts from your pharmacist are available for those with numerous prescriptions.

PULLING RUSSIAN LIQUOR PRODUCTS FROM ALBERTA SHELVES

Alberta Gaming, Liquor and Cannabis (AGLC) is not accepting new stock of Russian-made liquor products and will not sell any current stock to retailers.

Alberta's government has directed AGLC to take these immediate steps as a sign of condemnation of Russia's invasion of Ukraine.





WORLD DAY OF PRAYER 2022

The date for this year's World Day of Prayer (WDP) is Friday, 4th of March. Each year since 1927, a different host country has prepared the content of the WDP service, highlighting its country's culture and regional justice issues.

The 2022 service was written by the England, Wales and Northern Ireland WDP Committee on the theme "I Know the Plans I Have for You" (Jeremiah 29: 1-14) It has been adapted for use in Canada by the Women's Inter-Church Council of Canada(WICC) and presented as a video. This way, viewers from all over the country, in small groups or alone at home, will be able to virtually unite in prayer and action.

The video is available on the WICC website: wicc.org and may be accessed by anyone.

You may like to try this recipe for Welsh Cakes from Nancy Weir, WICC Office Administrator

11/2 cups stirred all-purpose flour

½ cup sugar

½ tsp cinnamon

1/4 tsp ground mace or nutmeg

11/2 tsp baking powder

½ tsp salt

½ cup butter

⅓ cup lard

1/₃ cup currants, rinsed and patted dry

1egg

2 to 3½ tsp water

Stir together flour, sugar, cinnamon, mace (or nutmeg), baking powder, and salt in a bowl. Mix in the butter and lard using a pastry cutter, your fingers, or a food processor until it looks like coarse crumbs. Stir in currants. Set aside.

Combine egg and 2 teaspoons water and beat well. With a fork, stir the egg mixture vigorously into the flour until you have soft dough. Add another 1 to 1½ teaspoons of water if dough is not holding together.

Roll out dough on a lightly floured work surface to ¼ inch thick. Cut out rounds using a 2 inch cookie cutter or juice glass. Re-roll scraps and cut again.

Heat a heavy frying pan to medium hot. Grease with lard or oil. Cook Welsh cakes for about 3 minutes per side. Welsh cake should be golden brown, crisp, and cooked through. If needed, adjust temperature. Remove to a plate and allow to cool a little. Serve warm or cool. Makes 25 cakes.




Preacher's Point






Someone I Love By Emilia Harris Grade 5 Warburg School





MLA REPORT

Budget 2022:

After a few difficult years, Albertans have a reason to celebrate. Your United Conservative team has presented a balanced budget for the first time since 2014.

Our budget is keeping taxes low while increasing spending on health, education, postsecondary education, children's services, and social services. While the turnaround in the price of oil has helped our bottom line, we have gotten to this enviable position mainly due to careful fiscal restraint and responsibility. Our province is seeing dynamic revenue growth across the entire economy as a direct result of our government's relentless pursuit of pro-growth, open-for-business policies, and economic diversification.

In conclusion, remember that ASB works for us (residents). Where are the written reports from earlier conferences? The statement made by an attendee that it was a "good learning experience" doesn't cut it. Exactly what was learned that is of value to our county? Perhaps a published written report (in the Booster or on the website) would be of interest and help to your constituents. Remember we pay these people over \$300 a day, plus expenses, to

attend. At the present time, written reports are not required for conferences attended within the province. Perhaps to show a professional thrust, Council could make written reports part of policy. If members are unwilling or unable to produce a written report, then don't go.

As Mr. Cuff (a provincial corporate reviewer) once told me "... a conference is not a paid holiday."
