

Community Volunteer Income Tax Program – FREE INCOME TAX PREPARATION

For Low Income Persons, Families, seniors and students. Although this is something, that most of us would like to avoid thinking about and doing, I am afraid that this is unavoidable. You need to file your income tax each year, even if you have no income to report. By doing this you may receive benefits that you did not know you were eligible for. Also, in the event of the death of your spouse, benefits can easily be transferred to you, if you have filled a return for the last calendar year. If you did not file a tax return in 2021 you may not be receiving benefits from the government that you are eligible for. The focus of the Community Volunteer Tax Program is to assist those individuals who have limited income. This includes seniors, families and students. If your income was approximately in one of the following categories you may qualify for assistance.

1 person	30,000
2 person family	37,000
3 person family	40,500
4 person family	43,500

We are <u>not able</u> to complete returns with income from the following sources:

Capital Gains or Losses, Farming Income, Rental Income, Self-Employment, Interest exceeding \$1, 000, Bankruptcies, Deceased Persons

This service is FREE to those who qualify. If you require this service, please gather your information and bring it to the Village of Breton office Monday to Thursday between 8:30 – 4:00. Clients will be notified when your return is completed. The program will run from March 1 – April 30, 2022

We require the following information in order to complete your return:

- Personal Information (Social Insurance Number, Birth date, Marital Status, Address)
- Dependent's information spouse/ children's names, birthdates
- All "T" Slips (T4's, T4A, OAS etc.)
- All Forms, Schedules, and Labels you have received from Revenue Canada.
- Receipts for any expenses such as medical, moving, tuition, sporting activities. Printouts from your pharmacist are available for those with numerous prescriptions.

Counselling Subsidies – Breton and Area FCSS is pleased to offer Counseling Subsidies.

A subsidy is available for individuals, couples and/or families who are struggling with common, everyday issues to access short-term preventative counselling services. The goal is to:

- Improve relationships with better communication and conflict resolution skills;
- Improve mood with anger management and emotional support;
- Enhance personal growth with creativity, spirituality, self-esteem, self-awareness, goal setting;

- Improve parenting skills by focusing on attachment;
- Reduce stress with life balance; and/or
- Learn new skills and behaviors

The cost of counselling can be a barrier for many individuals and families. This subsidy is available to those who do not have access to coverage through health benefits or employee benefits, such as an Employee Assistance Plan (EAP), and whose family income is less than \$75,000 per year. Fees are determined according to a sliding scale based on income and family size. Fees range from \$15 per session to \$50 per session. The maximum number of sessions available is seven for individuals and nine for couples or families.

Counselling services are provided through a partnership with Karunia Counselling from Leduc.

We know that in this current environment many may have additional stress and anxiety. We also know that transportation may be an added barrier. These sessions can be arranged to be in person in the Karunia offices in Leduc, over the phone in your own safe environment or virtually on your computer.

To apply for the subsidy services, application forms are available through the Breton FCSS Office at 4916 50th Avenue or by contacting them at fcss@breton.ca or calling 780-696-3636.

ALL APPLICATIONS ARE STRICTLY CONFIDENTIAL.

Breton and Area FCSS will be doing the intake of the applications. Counselling services are provided by Karunia Counselling by Registered Psychologists, Registered Provisional Psychologists, Canadian Certified Counsellors and Masters or PhD level student interns under the supervision of a qualified psychologist. All applications will be kept in strict confidence. This program is being made available through funding from the Government of Canada's Emergency Support Fund, the Drayton Valley Community Foundation and Breton and Area FCSS.

ALBERTA NEWS -PROTECTING PLACES OF WORSHIP

Budget 2022 more than doubles funding to help protect places of worship and all vulnerable Albertans from hate crimes and vandalism.


Funding for the Alberta Security Infrastructure Program has increased from \$2 million to \$5 million annually. This funding will support places of worship, not-for-profit agencies, registered charities, and other organizations or identified groups at risk of being targeted by hate crimes or incidents.

The groups can apply for grants for security and technology improvements. Funding for upgrades to facility infrastructure, including security and monitoring systems, helps protect individuals and property from vandalism and other criminal acts. Launched last summer, the program is flexible enough to address a range of protective measures, such as security planning, education and training.

"While it saddens me that many religious and ethnic organizations and Indigenous groups need this protection, I am proud of this government's commitment to helping keep them safe. Our province continues to stand against hate and violence, and alongside those targeted by these terrible crimes." Jason Kenney, Premier

"Our church knows the pain of being targeted by hate crimes. We are still trying to repair all of the damage caused by arson last summer. The protections these grants make available can make a real difference in churches and local groups like ours, who come together for worship and to serve our communities." New calls for grant applications will take place this spring and fall. More information on program eligibility and the application process will be available soon.



RED DEER RCMP WARN COMMUNITY OF SCAM TARGETING SENIORS

Red Deer, Alta. - Red Deer RCMP are warning citizens of a fraud specifically targeted at grandparents. On Mar. 3 Red Deer RCMP received a report of a bail scam targeted at a Red Deer senior. The fraud was very similar to occurrences that have been reported across Canada in the last few weeks.

In the Red Deer incident, the suspect contacted a senior pretending to be their grandchild. The suspect stated that he had been arrested in the United States and needed bail money. The suspect warned the victim that there was a "gag order" posted on the bond and that they must not tell anyone about the money.

The scam became more elaborate as the victim received calls from persons impersonating both American and Canadian police officers. The victim was instructed to withdraw cash and informed a courier would pick it up from their residence later that day. Over the course of several days, the victim was contacted multiple times and instructed to withdraw more money to assist their grandson with his legal costs. Ultimately, the victim was defrauded of \$50,000.

"These fraudsters are highly-skilled at manipulation and use fear, panic, guilt and empathy to prey on people," says Cst. Nadeau of the Red Deer RCMP. "Their techniques are elaborate and quite convincing. They often search social media for information to enhance their credibility and knowledge of their victim."

Red Deer RCMP provide the following tips to recognize impersonation fraud and avoid becoming a victim:

- Don't be afraid to say no. Fraudsters use highpressure tactics like creating a sense of urgency or secrecy to cloud your judgement.
- Verify the caller. Hang up and call the person or business that the caller is claiming to be – even when the caller is claiming to be a police officer.
- Don't be secretive. Fraudsters will pressure you to lie to your bank, the police or family about what is happening. Financial institutions will often intervene if customers withdraw large quantities of cash to ensure they are not being victimized. Fraudsters often coach their victims to say they are doing home renovations, purchasing a used car, or provide other legitimate reasons for the large cash withdrawals. This is a big red flag.
- Do your research. New scams are invented daily, but likely someone has already experienced it and reported it. Call or visit the Canadian Antifraud Centre website to read up on what scams are currently "trending".
- Never give out personal information. Beware of calls where you are asked to provide your name, address, birthdate, Social Insurance Number,

- credit card or banking information, and other personal family details.
- Be careful about what you share on social media. Even limited information on profiles can provide a wealth of opportunity for fraudsters. Be wary of how sharing pictures, connecting with family members or joining groups may make you more vulnerable.

If you believe you have been defrauded or know someone who has, contact the Red Deer RCMP at 403-343-5575 or your local police service. You should also report it to the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre (CAFC). The CAFC collects information on fraud and identity theft across Canada.

The Bible Truth Page What About Job?

I have been told that God allows evil things to happen to people, so if we are sick and poor, we should just be thankful that God loves us enough to train us. This false teaching I heard, was supposedly supported by the story of Job. However, if we read Job with an understanding of who God is and what he has done for us, it is obvious that God is not permitting evil things to happen on earth. As I explained in a previous article: "Who Is In Control," (January 21st in The Thorsby Target and January 26th in The Breton Booster), God gave control of the earth to mankind; then mankind gave his authority and control to Satan. God created the Heavens and Earth, and His creation was very good, but man handed the earth over to the enemy of God. The story of Job takes place in this very setting, where Satan, who wants to destroy mankind has authority on earth where mankind lives. Job was a very prosperous man who feared God, and God had placed a special hedge of protection around Job. Then the Adversary answered the LORD, saying, "Has Job feared God for nothing? Have You not made a hedge around him, around his household, and around all that he has on every side? You have blessed the work of his hands, and his possessions have increased in the land (Modern English Version Job 1:9-10). God was protecting Job from Satan's oppression. When Satan came before God in Job chapter one, he asked God to remove that special hedge of protection. All authority in Heaven and on Earth has now been given to Jesus. Then Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Amen (Mat. 28:18-20). Jesus gave us the use of His authority on earth. One of Jesus' commandments to His disciples was to heal the sick and cast out devils (Mark 16:15-18). He said to them, "I saw Satan as lightning fall from heaven.
