
And now we are content that our life was worthwhile. Knowing, as we passed along the way, we made somebody smile.

Community Volunteer Income Tax Program – FREE INCOME TAX PREPARATION

For Low Income Persons, Families, seniors and students. You need to file your income tax each year, even if you have no income to report. By doing this you may receive benefits that you did not know you were eligible for. Also, in the event of the death of your spouse, benefits can easily be transferred to you, if you have filled a return for the last calendar year. If you did not file a tax return in 2021 you may not be receiving benefits from the government that you are eligible for. The focus of the Community Volunteer Tax Program is to assist those individuals who have limited income. This includes seniors, families and students. If your income was approximately in one of the following categories you may qualify for assistance.

1 person	35,000
2 person family	37,000
3 person family	40,500
4 person family	43.500

We are not able to complete returns with income from the following sources:

Capital Gains or Losses, Farming Income, Rental Income, Self-Employment, Interest exceeding \$1,000, Bankruptcies, Deceased Persons

This service is FREE to those who qualify. If you require this service, please gather your information and bring it to the Village of Breton office Monday to Thursday between 8:30-4:00. Clients will be notified when your return is completed. The program will run from March 1-May 15, 2022. **Deadline to file is MAY 2, 2022. Filing after May 2 could result in the delay of any federal or provincial payments.**

We require the following information in order to complete your return:

 Personal Information (Social Insurance Number, Birth date, Marital Status, Address)

- Dependent's information spouse/ children's names, birthdates.
- All "T" Slips (T4's, T4A, OAS etc.)
- All Forms, Schedules, and Labels you have received from Revenue Canada.
- Receipts for any expenses such as medical, moving, tuition, sporting activities. Printouts from your pharmacist are available for those with numerous prescriptions.


An evening with Dr. Jody Carrington

HIGHLIGHTS

Financial Audit Presentation

Auditor Phil Dirks of Metrix Group presented the results of the annual financial audit conducted earlier this year. He confirmed that the County is in good financial shape.

The County has \$50 million in assets, \$20 million in liabilities, including \$9.2 million in debt, and a remaining debt capacity of \$34 million.

By law, all municipalities must be audited each year. The approved financial statements will be posted to the County website shortly.

Accurate Assessment Presentation

Accurate Assessment Group provided an update to Council on assessment of properties in the County. Overall, there was an increase of 1% in both residential and non-residential assessment in 2021 compared to 2020.

There was negligible change in commercial and industrial assessment. Linear assessment was unchanged. New residential construction was valued at \$8.3 million in 2021, compared to \$7.9 million in 2020. There were 59 new wells drilled in 2021, up from 18 in 2020.

Improvements at Willey West Campground

Council approved the addition of \$12,000 to the 2022 operating budget for improvements to the shower house at Willey West Campground, with funds to come from the Brazeau County Recreation Facilities Capital Investment (Willey West) Restricted Surplus.

The upgrade includes installing a new feed of appropriate size to the shower house, a new panel for the shower house, and re-distributing power to nearby campsites. The original estimate for the project was \$27,000.

In February 2022, the Canadian Electrical Code was revised that affects how load calculations are performed for RV electrical. Unfortunately, this regulation change has resulted in increased project costs in the amount of approximately \$12,000.

Support for Lindale Community Hall

Council approved \$40,000 in funding, pending matching funding from the Community Facility Enhancement Program (CFEP) to the Lindale Community Hall Association for

improvements to the hall. Improvements include the kitchen facilities, flooring, and the furnace for a total cost of \$118,000.

2022 Schedule of Fees

Council gave three readings to Bylaw 1103-22, the 2022 Schedule of Fees. This Schedule of Fees includes a few new fees for approaches, road use agreements, pipeline crossings, and use of the Lindale Rodeo Grounds. There is no charge for local non-profit groups to use the grounds.

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Often when first seeing someone new in my office I have specific questions I ask to see how they are doing in their current moment. They are called guiding questions or what I like to call my Big Questions. I ask these questions to try to understand where a person is at in their current story and how to move forward.

The Big Questions are simply reflective questions such as;

How are you mentally and physically feeling today? I not only ask how one is feeling mentally but also how one is feeling physically, because when you are dealing with any kind of mental health concern such as depression, trauma, or anxiety it not only affects you mentally but also physically. Some of the ways that we can feel it within our body is chronic headaches, stomach aches, dizziness, achiness throughout the body and more. You can be anxious and stressed without necessarily knowing it, so we check in for both mental and physical concerns.

Another Big Question I like to ask is, what is taking up most of your head space? Right now, what are you thinking about? Is it work? Family, friends, what's for dinner? When will I see him/her again? When will it happen again? What is the one worry or thought that is all consuming you, as that is where we begin our journey of exploring how to walk alongside together.

I also ask when was the last time you ate a whole meal? Proper Nutrition is important and if you are binge eating or eating poorly, or not eating at all, this will all affect you not only physically but also your mental health.

Another important question is How tired are you on a scale from 1 to 10? Many are finding themselves tired all the time. We have had a difficult three years and the chronic stress that most of us have found ourselves in has taken a toll on our health. There is a condition called Tired All the Time Syndrome (TATT Syndrome) where individuals experience chronic and persistent fatigue. Many times, it is due to an underlying condition such as diabetes, depression or thyroid disease, but can also be caused by pressures of the stress in daily life such as an unhealthy work environment or stressful family situations. Studies show that 1 out of 10 people have TATT and the syndrome is found more in women due to their abundance of multitasking. (Sai Krishna G, Komal Krishna T, Saiteja T, Krishna R, Chaitanya K. Tired All The Time: A Chronic Fatigue Syndrome. J Pharm Pract Community Med. 2016;2(2):32-34)

I try to end the Big Questions time with a reflection on what will you engage in today that will bring you joy?

If you cannot answer the joy question, then we start to explore what gives you joy and how to go about adding this into your daily life.

I have a few more Big Questions that I ask as they are important, and I encourage each of you to ask yourselves these questions on a weekly basis. If you are struggling with anything, please do not hesitate to reach out to someone for care. Don't lose yourself in all the busyness that can surround us, take the time to care for yourself so that you can continue to do what you are called to do. There is always Hope!






