The world's largest Easter egg is found in Vegreville, Alberta.

This Pysanka (Ukrainian Easter egg) is 31ft tall & 18ft wide and 27ft long and is recognized around the world as not only a unique artistic masterpiece but also an achievement of nine mathematical, architectural and engineering firsts. It is a complicated jigsaw puzzle containing 524-star patterns, 2,208 equilateral triangles, 3,512 visible facets, 6,978 nuts and bolts, and 177 internal struts.

This enormous egg was built because in 1973, the Government of Alberta established the Alberta Century Celebrations Committee to coordinate the centennial celebrations of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP). The committee distributed funds to several Alberta municipalities including Vegreville. With these funds, the Vegreville & District Chamber of Commerce decided to build to Pysanka to symbolize Vegreville's rich Ukrainian culture and the peace and security that the RCMP offered the area's pioneers and their descendants.

It is so cool that Queen Elizabeth, Prince Edward, and Prince Andrew came to Vegreville in 1978 to see it for themselves.



LEDUC RCMP CRIME REDUCTION UNIT DISMANTLE CHOP SHOP AND RECOVER 9 STOLEN VEHICLES

Leduc County, Alta. – On April 1, 2022, officers of the Leduc Crime Reduction Unit obtained and executed a search warrant with the assistance of Leduc RCMP General Investigation Section and Drug Unit, Wetaskiwin RCMP Crime Reduction Unit, the RCMP Emergency Response Team, RCMP Police Dog Services and the RCMP Auto Theft Unit, on a rural property that they believed was being used as a chop shop in the area of Township Road 492 and Range Road 235 in Leduc County.

2022 Dust Control Program

Leduc County is currently accepting applications for our 2022 dust control program. There are two product choices available:

1. Calcium chloride

- Calcium chloride is a top shoot dust control product that is applied by spraying over the gravel surface.
- Two applications of product will be completed for every residence applying for this dust control product. The second application will be automatically applied approximately six-to-eight weeks after the first application (weather permitting).
- Residents desiring a calcium chloride dust control
 product on the County road adjacent to their residence will
 be required to complete an application form and must prepay a fee of \$381.50 for the first 122 metres (400 feet).
 Dust control requested beyond 122 metres (400 feet) will
 be charged an additional \$8.93/metre.

2. Incorporated petroleum

- Incorporated dust control is a petroleum-based product that is applied to the road surface and mixed in and packed by graders.
- It is warrantied for one year from the date of application.
- Residents desiring an incorporated dust control product on the County road adjacent to their residence will be required to complete an application form and must prepay a fee of \$3,791.50 for the first 122 metres (400 feet). Dust control beyond 122 metress (400 feet) will be charged an additional \$36.89/metre.

Other information

- GST will be added to all prices listed above.
- The prices listed are after receiving a Leduc County subsidy of \$708.50 per strip.
- This subsidy is provided to County residents living in permanent residences along a county gravel road.
- Businesses will be charged the full rate without subsidy.
- The dust control program begins as soon as possible after seasonal road bans have been lifted.

MLA REPORT

from The Office of MLA Mark Smith, Member of the Legislative Assembly for Drayton Valley - Devon

On April 1, Albertans received a welcome surprise – prices coming down at the pumps!

Gas stations across the province reported prices dropping anywhere from 10 to 13 cents overnight. This was due to our United Conservative government's decision to scrap the 13-cent-per-litre provincial fuel tax for the indefinite future.

Equal to exactly 13.6 cents per litre, our fuel tax cut will apply to all gasoline and diesel purchases, including marked farm fuel. This cut will remain in effect for at least three months. Beyond that, our government will review the collection of the fuel tax on a quarterly basis and, if required, consider reinstating collection in stages, based on the average price of West Texas Intermediate over several weeks. We will not start to reinstate collection before July 1, however.

Alberta is the only province in the country where this fuel tax relief is being offered, and as a result, we now have the lowest fuel prices in the country. This massive tax cut is worth more than a billion dollars of savings for Albertans on an annualized basis. This means more money in the pockets of everyday people who are facing high energy prices right now due to world events, short-sighted NDP policies, and the NDP-Trudeau carbon tax.

I'm particularly proud that this tax cut will apply to farm fuel. Our farmers and ranchers have worked so hard to feed the province and world throughout the pandemic. For them, this tax relief is much needed and well deserved.

THREE SUBJECTS OF NEW CURRICULUM READY FOR CLASSROOMS

from Alberta Education

Alberta students and teachers will benefit from three updated K-6 subjects, with supporting learning and teaching resources, in classrooms this September.

As announced in March, all K-3 students will learn new Mathematics and English Language Arts and Literature curriculums, while all K-6 students will learn from new Physical Education and Wellness curriculum starting this September. This balanced and measured approach to implementing the new K-6 curriculum is based on insight and advice from the Curriculum Implementation Advisory Group.

"It took eight years of advocacy for me to see this. This is a very strong math curriculum. It is clear, concise, age-appropriate and well sequenced. It is a curriculum that sees and realizes our children's fullest potential. They will have the confidence and skills to pursue their dreams and succeed not only in the STEM fields, but also in life." New details on implementation, piloting and engagement

As it is finalized, the new K-6 curriculum will be implemented in three phases, with Phase 1 beginning in the 2022-23 school year. By September 2024, it is anticipated that all K-6 grades and subjects will be implemented. More information on curriculum implementation, further piloting of some subjects and engagement will be on www.alberta.ca/curriculum as details become available.

Quick facts

- About 400,000 students will be the first to benefit from learning from the new K-3 Mathematics, K-3 English Language Arts and Literature, and K-6 Physical Education and Wellness curriculums during the 2022-23 school year.
- Changes across the three K-6 subjects included updates to address instances of concern with content load, age appropriateness, wording clarity and First Nations, Métis and Inuit content.
 - In the English Language Arts and Literature content updates include strengthened content related to

- creative and critical thinking, and digital literacy.
- Mathematics content was redistributed and strengthened to address fractions, measurement, operations (adding/subtracting, multiplying/dividing) and percentages to better develop number sense.
- Enhancements to the Physical Education and Wellness content related to consent, mental health, nutrition, safety, physical fitness, foundations and confidence to value physical activities for life.
- In 2022-23, \$59 million has been allocated for the K-6 implementation process.
 - To support school authorities, about \$37.7 million will offer flexibility and support local decision making.
 - \$17.7 million, on a per student basis, to purchase additional curriculum resources to support implementation of new K-6 curriculum in three subject areas.
 - \$20 million for professional learning for teachers, allocated to school authorities on a per teacher basis.
 - o To support resource purchasing, licensing and development, about \$14.8 million will be retained by Alberta Education to:
 - Leverage economies of scale offered by provincial buying power.
 - Provide equitable access across all school authorities through the availability of high-quality learning and teaching resources aligned to the new curriculum.
 - Invest \$3.5 million in the procurement and development of French resources.
 - To support classroom piloting, \$6.5 million in the form of release time to support the ability to plan and participation in feedback sessions.
- The 12-member Curriculum Implementation Advisory Group has balanced representation from across the education system to help ensure the best interests of the entire education system inform the group's advice and recommendations.

The Bible Truth Page GOOD DEEDS

Nobody can earn their way to Heaven. Nobody can do enough good deeds (or works) to cover their sin. Yet we know that a man is NOT justified by the works of the law, but through faith in Jesus Christ. Even we have believed in Christ Jesus, so that we might be justified by faith in Christ, rather than by the works of the law. For by the works of the law no flesh shall be justified (Modern English Version Gal. 2:16). Works of the law are any works or deeds you do to earn salvation. Works of the law can be any moral standard that we live by, with the hope of that standard being enough to qualify us as good people. It does not matter how good we are in our own eyes or the eyes of other people. The only way we can be made righteous or good is by faith in Jesus Christ. But now, apart from the law, the righteousness of God is revealed, being witnessed by the Law and the Prophets. This righteousness of God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all and upon all who believe, for there is no distinction. For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God, being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus (Rom. 3:21-24). Notice in the above verse that by the grace of God we are "justified freely". That means we don't have to earn it. It is not possible to earn it. For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord (Rom. 6:23). Everyone has sinned. The punishment for sin is death. There is only ONE way to get around it. Without faith in Jesus, we would have to suffer the punishment for our sin, which is an eternal death sentence. The good news is that Jesus has already taken the punishment that we deserve by giving His life for us. Jesus said, "Truly, truly I say to you, whoever hears My word and believes in Him who sent Me has eternal life and shall not come into condemnation, but has passed from death into life" (John 5:24). It is up to us to believe in Him. If we believe in Him we have life, and are made righteous by Him as a free gift.

Jesus did many good deeds, but it was not to be good enough. He did good deeds because it was His Father's will, and because He and His Father love people; they wanted to set them free from the oppression of the devil. Jesus did good works because he was good; He was not trying to become good by doing good deeds. Here are some examples of the works that Jesus did. Jesus healed "All". When the evening came, they brought to Him many who were possessed with demons. And He cast out the spirits with His word, and healed all who were sick, to fulfill what was spoken by Isaiah the prophet, "He Himself took our infirmities and bore our sicknesses" (Matt. 8:16-17). Jesus multiplied food and fed five thousand men plus women and children with just five loaves of bread and two fish (Mark 6:35-44). He did all these good works because He loved the people and because it was His Father's will. Jesus said: "For I came down from heaven, not to do My own will, but the will of Him who sent Me" (John 6:38). The works Jesus did can be summarized with this verse: God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power, who went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him (Acts 10:38). Jesus did do many good works, and He also wants His followers to do good works. Truly, truly I say to you, he who believes in Me will do the works that I do also. And he will do greater works than these, because I am going to My Father. I will do whatever you ask in My name, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If you ask anything in My name, I will do it. "If you love Me, keep My commandments" (John 14:12-15). Faith in Jesus is keeping His commandments and doing the same works that He did. We do good deeds or works because we love God and to show the love of God to other people (to see God's definition of love, read 1 Cor. chapter 13). As believers we are not THE Son of God, but we are A son or daughter of God. If we abide in Him, He lives in us and will do whatever we ask the Father in His name. We are to do the same works that Jesus did, through faith in Him. Jesus said: "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father who is in heaven" (Matt. 7:21).
