

CANADIAN MENTAL HEALTH WEEK

Here at the Town of Thorsby we believe Mental Health Awareness is one of the most important aspects of education that can be taught to residents. Our team practices regular conversations and support as we believe in the "power of talk."

In any given year, one in five Canadians experience a mental illness, and by the time Canadians reach 40 years of age, 1 in 2 have or have had a mental illness. Canadians in the lowest income group are 3 to 4 times more likely than those in the highest income group to report poor to fair mental health.

Mental Health doesn't just affect a person's mental state, it can also affect a person's physical state. People with long-term physical health conditions such as chronic pain are much more likely to also experience mood disorders. Conversely people with a mood disorder are at a higher risk of developing a long-term medical condition.

An important aspect of Mental Health includes empathy for those affected, and in 2019 a survey of working Canadians was conducted with 75% of respondents saying they would be reluctant or refuse to disclose a mental illness to an employer or co-worker. Many people suffering from mental illness also suffer from the fear of judgement or stigmatization regarding mental health.

This week, please reach out to your loved ones and make sure to tell them that you care.

ANOTHER GRANT APPROVED FOR THE TOWN OF THORSBY

The Town of Thorsby is excited to announce that they were successful in their grant application for the Canada Summer Jobs program. This program funds 50% of minimum wage for summer student positions **totaling \$16,800**. All 8 positions were approved – 3 public works, 2 recreation and 3 administrative.

Canada Summer Jobs provides wage subsidies to employers from not-for-profit organizations, the public sector, and private sector organizations with 50 or fewer full-time employees, to create quality summer work experiences for young people aged 15 to 30 years.

This is a program under the Youth Employment and Skills Strategy, which aims to provide flexible and holistic services to help all young Canadians develop the skills and gain paid work experience to successfully transition into the labour market.





LOW-INCOME SENIORS WILL NOT FACE A REDUCTION IN THEIR GIS OR ALLOWANCE BENEFITS

OTTAWA: Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, wishes to advise low-income seniors that they will not face a reduction in their GIS or Allowance benefits if they received pandemic benefits in 2021, or if they find they need to access any related benefits in the future.

These payments will alleviate the financial hardship of seniors who qualified and received pandemic benefits in 2020, but who subsequently saw that they counted as income and impacted their GIS or Allowance benefits. This automatic one-time payment was issued by direct deposit on April 19, 2022. Clients who have not signed up for direct deposit will receive a cheque by mail no later than the end of April 2022. These payments will support those who saw a loss of GIS or Allowance by compensating them for the full annualized amount of that loss.

2021 year-end financial reports

The 2021 year-end audited statements and accumulated surplus schedule were presented to Council for review and approval. Curtis Friesen with Metrix Group LLP Chartered Professional Accountants presented the year-end reports to Council.

Council approved the 2021 year-end financial reports.

Transfer station bin supply and transport contract

The current contract for transfer station bin supply and transport services is up for renewal. In February, administration went to public tender for this contract and received five bids.

Administration recommended that Council enter into a three-year contract with GFL Environmental Inc. for transfer station bin supply and transport services.

Council approved the recommendation.

Road allowance closure and land sale – Township Road 492. Hunter and Webber

Administration provided a report to Council regarding the public hearing that took place on Feb. 8, 2022 for a proposed road allowance closure at Township Road 492.

During the Feb. 8 public hearing, the applicant advised of their involvement with the ALUS (Alternative Land Use Services) program and the intent to maintain the riparian area of Strawberry Creek. Council referred the motion to allow administration time to contact Alberta Environment and Parks (AEP) regarding the applicant's involvement with the ALUS program.

Due to concerns in the area, a lack of unified stance from area landowners and limited support from AEP, administration recommended for Council not to provide first reading of the bylaw and cease the road allowance closure process.

Administration also provided an alternative

recommendation, which was for Council to provide first reading of the Road Closure Bylaw XX-22 for the partial closure of Township Road 492, all of the undeveloped road allowance west of the most westerly intersection of the creek with the road allowance and adjacent to the south of the SE 15-49-3-W5M.

Bylaw 09-22: Road Allowance Closure and Land Sale – Township Road 492 Hunter and Webber

Council provided first reading of Bylaw 09-22 for the partial closure of Township Road 492, all of the undeveloped road allowance west of the most westerly intersection of the creek with the road allowance and adjacent to the south of the SE 15-49-3-W5.

Regional Assessment Review Board – renewal of agreements with municipal partners

A recommendation was made for Council to approve the following:

- Renewal of agreement with the following municipal partners for another three-year term from Jan. 1, 2022 to Dec. 31, 2024:
- 1. City of Beaumont
- 2. Town of Thorsby
- 3. Village of Warburg
- Confirm the re-appointment of Councillor Vandenberghe as a Leduc County member, subject to training requirements, and authorize administration to advertise for one public member to the Regional Assessment Review Board on behalf of Leduc County.

Council approved the recommendation.

Call to action - new provincial police service

Council received a letter from National Police Federation regarding a proposal to join the federation's Call to Action to the Government of Alberta to halt the idea of a new provincial police service and to invest the proposed monies into underfunded services in Alberta.

Council directed administration to prepare a summary report related to the new provincial police service versus the RCMP for future Council discussion.

MLA REPORT

from The Office of MLA Mark Smith, Member of the Legislative Assembly for Drayton Valley - Devon

Here is some of the latest news coming out of the Alberta government this past week or so.

Fighting the federal firearm ban

Alberta chief firearms officer Teri Bryant is raising concerns with the federal firearm ban. The federal measure prohibits more than 1,500 models of firearms and other related firearm components. It also calls for an amnesty period and a federal program to acquire and destroy the firearms. The banning of an arbitrary selection of firearms and imposing unfair costs and controls on law-abiding gun owners reflects a main concern of Albertans: firearms policies and regulations should be evidence-based instead of ineffective measures that target law-abiding citizens rather than criminals.

Welcoming West Virginia Senator Joe Manchin

United States Senator Joe Manchin of West Virginia visited Alberta to discuss being partners in energy security. Premier Jason Kenney and Senator Manchin spoke to the media about the need for Canada and the United States to be better partners in energy security. Manchin, who sits on the U.S. Senate Committee on Energy and Natural Resources, said the U.S. now wishes it didn't kill the Keystone XL pipeline and that he will ask Premier Kenney to testify before the committee on the need for better energy cooperation between Canada and the U.S. on pipelines and energy issues.

Terminating relationships with Russian regions

In response to the unprovoked Russian invasion of *Ukraine, the Government of Alberta has terminated its relationship with three Russian regions.* Premier Jason Kenney stated that despite the decades-long relationships, Alberta denounces Russia's invasion of Ukraine and is terminating its relationship with these regions. The relationships between Alberta and Tyumen Oblast, Khanty-Mansi Autonomous Okrug and Yamalo-Nenets Autonomous Okrug began in 1992, 1995 and 1997, respectively. This is the first time the Government of Alberta has terminated relationships with sister regions.

Acting to better support children and youth

Minister of Children's Services Rebecca Schulz has

accepted and is implementing all six action items outlined in the Review of Deaths of Children and Youth Receiving Child Intervention Services.

The past two years have been challenging for children, youth, and young adults because of the COVID-19 pandemic and related restrictions. Young adults struggling with addiction have also been particularly hard hit by these events. Alberta's government is responding by making significant investments to improve mental health and addiction care and help youth and young adults recover from the challenges they face. Alberta's government is also enhancing safety planning, oversight and reporting to improve the safety of children and youth receiving intervention services.

Supporting well-being for Indigenous women

Three grants will help provide Indigenous women in Alberta with the skills and support they need to find careers and improve their livelihoods.

Funding to the Institute for the Advancement of Aboriginal Women (IAAW) will support programs to help Indigenous women find jobs, security and success in Alberta's rapidly recovering economy. With a focus on job readiness, retention and improved access to vital services, these programs will help participants build skills and confidence by offering customized plans to help develop career paths, from pre-employment training and education to long-term achievements in the workplace. The IAAW will also provide advocacy, referrals and strategies for mental health, housing, transportation, childcare, and assistance navigating the justice system.
