HAPPY GRAND PARENTS DAY

Just like Mother's day and Father's day, we also have a whole day dedicated to our grandparents. Grandparents have a special connection with children that is proven to both make grandparents live longer, and also make children more emotionally resilient. Grandparents Day is an opportunity to treasure that connection and spend some quality family time together.

History of Grandparents Day

In 1969, nine-year-old Russell Capper sent President Nixon a letter suggesting that a day should be set aside in order to celebrate grandparents. On June 12, 1969, he received a letter back from Rose Mary Woods — Personal Secretary to the President — reading, "Dear Russell, Thank you for your letter to President Nixon. Your suggestion regarding a Grandparent's Day is appreciated, but the President ordinarily issues proclamations designating periods for special observance only when a Congressional resolution authorizes him to do so. With best wishes, Sincerely, Rose Mary Woods Personal Secretary to the President."

Following this letter, Marian McQuade was recognized nationally by the U.S. Senate and by President Jimmy Carter as the founder of National Grandparents Day. McQuade wanted to educate the youth about the importance of seniors and the contributions they have made throughout history. She urged the youth to "adopt" a grandparent and learn more about their lives, challenges, and desires for the future.

In 1977, Senator Randolph, with the help of other senators, introduced a joint resolution to the senate requesting the president to "issue annually a proclamation designating the first Sunday of September after Labor Day of each year as 'National Grandparents' Day'." Congress passed the legislation, proclaiming the first Sunday after Labor Day as National Grandparent's Day. On August 3, 1978, Jimmy Carter signed the proclamation, and the day was finally celebrated the following year. Now this day is celebrated all over the world.

What to do for Grandparents day on September 11

Every family shares their own history and traditions so, naturally, ways to celebrate this day vary. Whether it is going through photo albums, asking grandma to bake your favorite treat, spending time with your grandparents at the park, fixing the car in the garage with grandpa, we're sure you'll find something to do together!

Unfortunately, some grandparents have no one to share the day with.

Volunteering at an old-age home is a great way to give back and so are community group projects that help the elderly feel included and like they are a part of a family.

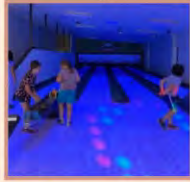

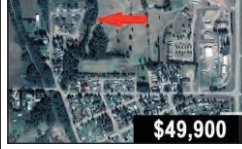

August 10, 2022 – Area of Warburg

Police making patrols in the area located a vehicle parked at a local business showing indications of **auto theft**. RCMP confirmed the vehicle was stolen, and the lone male occupant was arrested. **Kevin Loughran (32) resident of Entwistle, was held for a judicial hearing, and remanded into custody.**

August 10, 2022 – Area of Leduc County

Thorsby RCMP received a report of a break and enter into an occupied residence. The homeowner provided police with a description of the male. RCMP attended and observed a male matching the description. **Robert Lakevold (44) resident of Calmar, was arrested for Break and Enter and an outstanding warrant.** Lakevold was held for a bail hearing and released.

August 24, 2022 – Area of Wetaskiwin County

Breton RCMP conducted a traffic stop on a truck and

trailer on Hwy 22 for failing to have running tail lights on the trailer during a period of darkness. A mandatory alcohol screening was conducted confirming the driver was intoxicated. Immediate Roadside Sanctions were issued resulting in the truck and trailer being impounded. **A violation ticket for the lighting violation, as well as three other written warnings were issued.**

August 12, 2022 – Area of Warburg

RCMP received a report of an **armed robbery** that occurred at an area liquor store. A lone male entered the local business brandishing a baseball bat, and demanded money from the cashier. Police obtained surveillance footage of the suspect and involved vehicle. Patrols were made in the area, and Thorsby RCMP located the vehicle shortly after. **Dustan Halliday (27) resident of Thorsby, was arrested and is facing multiple charges including: Robbery, possession of a weapon for dangerous purpose, assaulting a peace officer (x2), committing an indictable offence, unlawfully having his face masked or disguised, obstructing a peace officer in the execution of their duties, and fraudulent concealment.** Following a judicial hearing, Halliday was released and is scheduled to appear on September 14, 2022 in Breton Provincial Court.

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DRAYTON VALLEY RCMP ASKING ANYONE WHO WAS A VICTIM OF SLASHED TIRES OR MAY HAVE VIDEO FOOTAGE TO REPORT

Drayton Valley, Alta.—On the night of Sept. 4, 2022, Drayton Valley RCMP responded to multiple slashed tire calls all across the town of Drayton Valley. Drayton Valley RCMP were quickly able to identify 2 of the 3 suspects and arrest one of them as they were caught slashing a tire at a hotel in Drayton Valley.

The investigation is still ongoing and the RCMP are requesting that anyone who was a victim of this event to report the incident to the Drayton Valley RCMP.

Drayton Valley RCMP are also asking that the residents of Drayton Valley review their surveillance footage on Sept. 4, 2022, between the hours of 01:30 a.m. and 5 a.m. for video surveillance of 3 suspects.

The suspects are all described as youths approximately 18-years-old: One male was believed to be wearing jeans, a ball cap, a black hoody and a white shirt; a second male was believed to be wearing ripped blue jeans, a black hoody and a grey and black ball cap; the third suspect is a female youth wearing a red top.

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COMMUNITY POLICING GRANT APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN

Indigenous and municipal communities in Alberta can now apply for a one-time grant of up to \$30,000 to develop a business case for their own self-administered police service or regional equivalent.

The Community Policing Grant will offer up to \$30,000 to Indigenous and municipal communities to assist in preparing a business case outlining local needs, capital requirements and transition considerations.

The Community Policing Grant formalizes funding the government has provided in the past and makes it more accessible to all Indigenous and municipal communities. Alberta's government provided \$30,000 to the Siksika Nation for a feasibility study in 2018 that has led to a memorandum of understanding focused on developing a funding framework for a new police service in Siksika.

Alberta has also unilaterally provided additional funding for 15 new police officers for the Blood Tribe, Tsuut'ina Nation and Lakeshore Regional police services to address issues created by shortfalls in federal funding.

"Communities in Alberta should be served by police services that have a deep-rooted understanding of the surrounding land and people. If Indigenous communities in the province feel they would be better served by an independent police service, we are ready to work alongside them to help achieve their safety and security goals" Tyler Shandro, Minister of Justice and Solicitor General

If Alberta moves to a provincial police service such as the proposed model found at www.futureofABpolicing.ca, the province would work with First Nations and municipalities to ensure local police services have more resources and give local Albertans more of a say in setting policing priorities.

Eligible First Nations communities, Metis Settlements and municipalities may use Community Policing Grant funding for business case expenses such as staffing, consultation fees and program administration. This includes communities that have already initiated the process of exploring a municipal

police service and communities collaborating on a regional police service. Applicants must provide a letter documenting the support of their communities' leadership for the development of the business case.

Quick facts

- The First Nations and Inuit Policing Program is a national, federally administered program that funds First Nation police services.
- Under this program, 52 per cent of funding is provided by the federal government and 48 per cent by the provinces.
- Alberta supports the work of the Blood Tribe, Lakeshore and Tsuut'ina Nation police services with annual funding of \$6.4 million to this cost-sharing program. Alberta also spends more than \$500,000 every year to pay for a crime prevention coordinator for each First Nation police service.
- More than two years ago, the federal government announced that it was going to overhaul this program, designate First Nation policing as an essential service and make more funding available to First Nations. This commitment remains unfulfilled.

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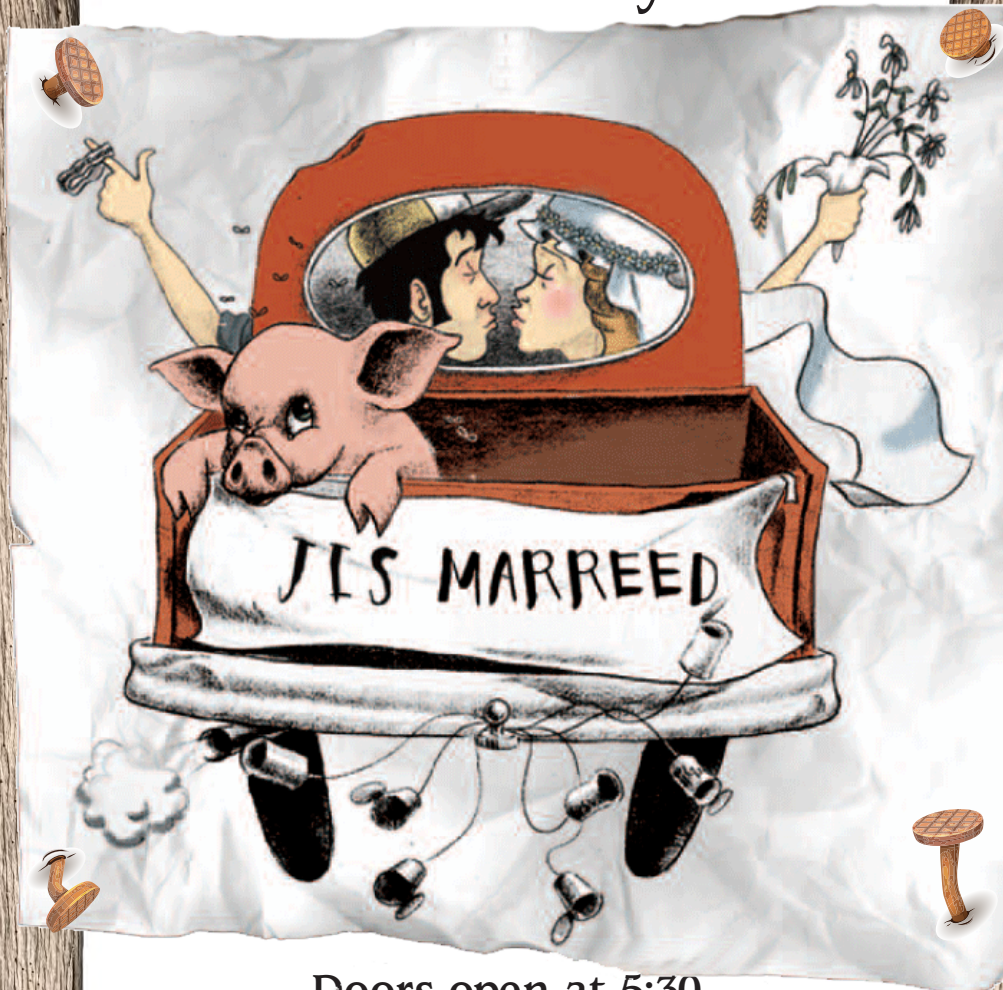

To the Editor:

In the Reeve's report in the Brazeau County News issue of July/August 2022, one paragraph had some interesting fallout in the mind of this observer.

In this paragraph, it states that "... if you have a concern ...bring it to me, a councillor ... at a council meeting ... and we will listen respectfully ..."

A rather interesting statement from a council that has had 3 code of conduct investigations completed, the results of which have not (as yet) been made public. The public can come to their own conclusions as to why. And there may be another investigation initiated as well.

Another concern is the council's follow-through of their stated objectives as stated under introductory page in every Agenda:

- a. Under Values– Transparency – also in Admin Policy 21
- b. Under Code of Conduct (A3) accountability (Admin 21)
- c. Under Code of Conduct -- Best interests of the county (Admin 21)
- d. Under Code of Conduct – accurately communicate (Admin 21)

Voters may want to note that Council has denied a letter to Council which was in the Agenda to be referenced in the minutes.

Voters may want to evaluate how often and for what reasons the council goes "in camera."

Voters may want to know why one councillor (Reeve) was negotiating with "Fiscal Energy" for about one year (in secret) before the rest of Council was informed of same. (That info was released at a public meeting in Breton.)

Voters may be interested that Council is considering changing the appropriate bylaw so they can refuse letters to council.

Voters may wish to find out why councillors that attend conferences (out of province) do not comply with the policy of submitting a written report for the

public. Are we to assume they learn nothing or do we assume that they don't care about the people that paid their way.

Remember we pay \$1500/month to look after citizen concerns. This report fits in that category. If a councillor can't or won't follow policy, don't go or resign.

Why do councillors continue to approve people to go, knowing they won't comply? And Council won't enforce their rules.

Why is it such a problem writing reports when we pay (average) around \$50,000 to \$55,000 per year to each councillor without accountability? What other corporation would allow this?

Do voters realize that Council has spent about \$35 million more than revenue in 5 years?

Do voters realize that FOIP requests have been denied – County information is supposed to be available to the public upon request. At a recent Surface Rights meeting in Warburg, the speaker, who is the president of the Rural Municipalities Association (RMA) and who is the Reeve of Ponoka County, was surprised to hear of this and apparently remarked that the public in his county gets any material that they ask for.
