

Regular Council Meeting

September 6, 2022

Production Well in Rocky Rapids

Council directed Administration to proceed with drilling a production well at the Rocky Rapids water treatment plant to determine accurate sub-surface conditions and if softer water is obtainable.

It appears feasible that a grey shale/sand/sandstone formation, which indicates softer water, could be located if a well was drilled to a deeper depth (approximately 200 feet). This exact formation and the volume of water found in a lower aquifer cannot be known or guaranteed until after an exploratory well is installed.

Winter Road Maintenance Policy

Council adopted the Winter Road Maintenance Policy, which sets clear expectations for snow removal within Brazeau Count, and increases the level of service for snow removal on Brazeau County roads. The policy is available under Front Page News on the Brazeau County website.

1. Brazeau County snow clearing services will, at a minimum, commence and be prioritized according to Table 1: Service Level Standards

2. Regardless of the service levels outlined in Table 1, calls received for snow clearing from emergency services (police, fire, ambulance) supersede and will be given the highest priority for snow clearing.

- 3. Snow clearing of paved and gravel roadways will be completed concurrently as the different road types and areas require different snow clearing equipment.
- 4. Generally, the starting point for snow clearing within each route will be alternated, from east to west, except where local conditions dictate a higher priority starting point for snow clearing (i.e., isolated drifting, localized snowfall, isolated (ce control), as per the Maintenance

Support for Eagle Point Blue Rapids Parks Council

Council approved writing a letter of support for an application to Alberta Environment and Parks for the Eagle Point – Blue Rapids Parks (EPBR) Council's core park operational costs. This funding will help support EPBR operations for the next year as it continues to encourage the practice of environmental

stewardship to improve ecological integrity along the park system's 50 kilometres of the North Saskatchewan River. The Park Council's management and operations of the Eagle Point-Blue Rapids Park System has improved the recreational and learning opportunities. Council has provided a letter of support in the past.

Library Agreement

Council directed Administration to enter into an agreement with the Drayton Valley Municipal Library Board to provide \$194,464 based on the proposed 2023 library budget. This is the same level of funding provided in previous years.

Council set October 19 at 1 p.m. as the dtae and time for the Organizational Meeting. Council will appoint councillors and members of the public to committees and boards. 
Remember we pay councillors about \$1500 per month to deal with your concerns.


