SAFETY TIPS TO KICK OFF THE 2022-2023 SCHOOL YEAR

School has already commenced on August 29 but it's important to remind everyone to be safe and mindful of school zones and pedestrians. Drivers are reminded to be aware that there will be an increase in pedestrians, cyclists and motor vehicle traffic on the roads and walkways particularly during pick-up and drop-off times.

Here are some tips from the RCMP to ensure everyone shares the road safely and to ensure everyone stays safe this school year:

- Pay attention to posted speed limits, especially when entering school or playground zones. Slow speeds can improve your reaction time.
- When a school bus is flashing its alternating red lights, stop and do not pass. Children may be on or off-loading.
- Share the road with cyclists. Be patient when following and provide extra space when passing
- When pedestrians are crossing the street, come to a complete stop and do not block the crosswalk with your vehicle. Ensure pedestrians have cleared the road before proceeding.

- Always follow the direction of crossing guards. Crossing guards are there to keep children safe.
- Look out for children, especially during school operating hours. Kids can easily become distracted and unaware of their surroundings.

A reminder, school zones are 30 km/h, and are in effect every school day from 8:00 a.m. to 9:30 a.m., 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m., and 3:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. Drivers should remember to slow down in school zones and be particularly alert for students during school hours, especially when dropping off and picking up children from school.



The Town of Thorsby wishes everyone a very safe and enjoyable Labour Day weekend. As it is the last weekend before the fall school season, we want to remind you of road safety.


On the May Long Weekend, in 2022,

- RCMP say they removed 165 impaired drivers from Alberta roads during a safety blitz many on outstanding warrants
- Police say during the weekend patrols, 2,804 traffic safety tickets were written up, with 1,280 drivers found to be speeding, 74 driving distracted and 66 for operating a vehicle without proper seatbelts.
- Officials say the aim of the campaign was to promote the message of safety to Albertans, something that many still need to learn.
- "From May 16 to the 23 alone, there were five motor vehicle collisions resulting in the loss of six lives. Three of these collisions were confirmed to involve impairment," said Insp. Chris Romanchych, Alberta RCMP Traffic Services, in a release.

What does this mean for Thorsby? You are on those roads and there is nothing worth speeding over, weaving out of traffic over, or being impatient. Leave early for your destination. Don't get in your vehicle stressed and upset. Settle your kids so they are ready for the trip. Make sure "Fluffy" and "Rover" are in their kennels and not impeding your driving by being on your lap or have their heads out of the window. Be respectful for those pulling trailers with horses or livestock.

If you're pulling your holiday trailer, hook it up safely and drive like you're pulling another vehicle, not just a storage bin for your bed!

AUGUST HIGHLIGHTS

August 10, 2022 – Area of Warburg

ALBERTA RCMP RECOGNIZES INTERNATIONAL OVERDOSE AWARENESS DAY 2022

In 2021, Alberta lost over 800 lives to meth-related accidental overdoses – a 28% increase from such tragic fatalities in 2020. On Aug. 31, 2022, the Alberta RCMP recognizes International Overdose Awareness Day by launching a methamphetamine awareness campaign in collaboration with the Canadian Integrated Response to Organized Crime. The campaign will help educate, protect and inform the public about negative impacts of methamphetamine and other synthetic drugs – as well as highlight the Alberta Clandestine Lab Enforcement and Response (CLEAR) Team and their role as a liaison with the chemical industry.

Methamphetamine is pervasive in our communities and has contributed to property crimes and crimes of violence. The Criminal Intelligence Service Canada identified methamphetamine as having one of the highest threat levels "due to its geographical reach. high burden of harm, and increased involvement of organized crime groups." According to a 2017 Canadian Tobacco, Alcohol, and Drugs Survey, 3.7% of Canadians have used methamphetamine at least once in their lifetime. While methamphetamine use among the general population in Canada may be low, the Canadian Centre on Substance Use and Addiction notes that "there has been a dramatic increase in the availability and harms associated with methamphetamine in Canada" since 2013 - with notable trends in Western regions.

The Alberta CLEAR Team provides specialized operational support in identifying, assessing, processing and dismantling illegal synthetic drug production labs, processing locations, dump sites and Butane Hash Oil labs. Often, the CLEAR Team is called upon to liaise with the chemical industry in Alberta to 'back track' chemical precursors and facilitate the real time exchange of information regarding methods of diversion and indicators of suspicious transactions.

Lemon Bars

Ingredients

1c +2 T. all purpose flour, divided 1/4 c. powdered sugar 1/4 c. butter 1/2 c. sugar 1/2 t baking powder 2 eggs 1/2 c. lemon juice 1T. lemon zest

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 F
- 2. Mix 1 c flour and ¼ c. powdered sugar. Melt butter and pour into flour and sugar mixture. Stir until combined.
- 3. Grease an 8X 8 baking dish. Pour flour mix into pan. Using a spoon, flatten the mix into a pan. Bake for 20 minutes until golden brown. Remove and cool.
- 4. Combine sugar, 2T flour and baking powder in a mixing bowl.
- 5. In a separate bowl, beat eggs, lemon juice and zest. Slowly add lemon mixture to sugar mixture. Stir until fully mixed.
- 6. Pour lemon mix over the crust.
- 7. Bake at 350 for 25 minutes. Chill in the refrigerator, and then cut into squares. Dust with powdered sugar, if using before serving

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

This is addressed to anyone growing trees for fruits or other bushes prone to deer browse. Wildlife pressure on my perennials has been a constant struggle from porcupines stripping the bark to deer and moose eating all the tender fruit-bearing buds to voles girdling the base of trees, effectively killing it.

The last letter about trees on the TNT or in Taylor park spurred my observations and input. I have walked the trails dozens of times and I can personally attest to the existing food forest already growing in significant quantity. Raspberry, Chokecherry, Beaked Hazelnut, Highbush Cranberry, Red Elder Berry, Sarsaparilla, and several other choice edibles. The soils are more than fertile enough for several other species like Korean Pine Nut(Pine with edible pine cone nuts), Apple, Plum, Cherry, Seabuckthorn, Nanking, Haskap to name a few top hardy choices i've grown here in town already.

There are many spots for added fruit and nut trees some better some worse but regardless of the spot a solution does exist, free to make, one that lasts for 5-10 years to stop all predation from all local wildlife. Its known as 'Bone Sauce' by Stepp Holzer an agroforestry expert. This is a unique use for raw bones from any animal. TLDR: Char the bones in one pot while using a second pot to catch all the drippings without the actual bones getting in the liquids.

This is best done in a hole for the bottom pot, with clay sealed around the mesh and 2 pot rims. Assemble a fire pile over the 2 pots that will burn for multiple hours. Light and when only ashes remain remove the clay, mesh and charred bones. This residue left over painted on the bark is harmless to the trees while effectively stopping predation from all animals. The residual fat from the bones keeps it on the tree working for a decade. FYI there are several case studies on youtube of this used and results tracked.

We love our trees and effective repellants are simply not available for more than a couple of years. Thank you for learning how to make your garden a more productive space this is my free tip from the experts of affordable agroforestry.


