



# AHS FLU IMMUNIZATION CLINICS IN DRAYTON AND WINFIELD

Alberta Health Services (AHS) is holding a flu immunization clinic in Winfield for children under five years of age and their family and household members. Winfield Community Health Centre will host the clinic on Nov. 8 between 9:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. by appointment only.

The site is located at 12 Avenue.

AHS is also holding flu immunization clinics in Drayton Valley for children under five years of age and their family and household members.

The Drayton Valley Community Health Centre (CHC) will offer the clinics on Nov. 16, Nov. 23 and Dec. 21, 2022 and Jan. 18, 2023.

The CHC is located at 4110 50 Avenue, with clinics open varying times on these dates by appointment only.

In addition to offering the vaccine to children under the age of five and their families, AHS flu clinics are also available to individuals who do not have a provincial health care number, and to individuals who live in a community where there are no other immunizing healthcare providers.

All Albertans, six months of age and older, are

eligible to be immunized at a variety of locations, free of charge. Those five years of age and older can get immunized at participating pharmacies and doctor's offices.

AHS encourages individuals to ask about getting a COVID booster at the same time.

Residents can learn more and book their influenza immunization at ahs.ca/vaccine.





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# **MLA REPORT**

In a recent article by Michael Rodriguez published (September 23/22)in the Calgary Herald, it is stated that "... multiple investigations ..." are being launched by Chestermere City Council by its own members.

Three members of that council are accused of "... Code of Conduct and Election Act breaches." It is stated in the article that an inquiry into allegations of 100 Code of Conduct infractions and 17 Election Act infractions is being done.

It should be noted that this inquiry did not have a petition to instigate.

The article also states that conduct violations can be classified into several categories, some of which are

- a. Potentially directing staff without CAO approval;
- b. Interfering with the duties of a CAO;
- c. Interfering with duties of Mayor and Council;
- d. Not respecting majority decisions of Council.

The inspector report (by the Minister) will make " $\ldots$  recommendations or orders  $\ldots$ " It would be hoped that there would be several orders, as recommendations don't have to be followed and nothing changes.

Of the several corporate reviews done in Brazeau County, no orders (as this writer recalls) were ever made–only recommendations.


It appears to this observer that it is long overdue for the government to establish (several) teams to do random, unannounced corporate reviews on an ongoing basis including following up on Orders to make sure county councils across the province follow the ACT—or pay an appropriate penalty.

It's about time that the Department enforced its own ACT throughout the Province.
