

If possible, we encourage purchases to be made in Breton and Drayton Valley to support our local businesses.



Rocky Rapids Water Well

Council directed Administration to proceed in engaging a consultant to drill an observation well, production well, and submit water test analysis on Brazeau County's behalf to a maximum of \$150,000 at the current water treatment facility to create a new production well that will meet all requirements from Alberta Environment and Parks.

Rural Crime Draft Resolution

Brazeau County will submit a draft resolution to the January 23, 2023 Pembina Zone meeting of the Rural Municipalities of Alberta, seeking support for recommendations to address rural crime. The recommendations include a crossjurisdictional analysis of other provinces to see how they address bail packages, bail Crown offices, bail ladder systems, and any other issue that may be impacting the increase in catch and release of criminals; and creating a Bail Sub-committee composed of the Rural Crime Committee and stakeholders from the Ministry of Justice to examine other bail systems, canvass Albertans on ideas for improving the justice system, and present an annual report with recommendations to the Minister of Justice.

Increased Support for STARS

Glenda Farnden, Senior Municipal Relations Liaison for STARS Air Ambulance, provided an update on the organization. Council increased its annual contribution from \$2 per capita (approximately \$14,358) to \$16,500 in 2023.

Moving forward, these programs will continue to be indexed with inflation to ensure lowincome Albertans have the resources to afford their basic needs.

"The affordability crisis has made life more difficult for seniors, families with children and Alberta's most vulnerable citizens. Everyone struggling needs to know that they are not alone. Our government is increasing benefits to help make life more affordable and ensure all Albertans can afford the rising costs of life's necessities." Danielle Smith, Premier

Alberta's government recognizes the urgency of supporting Albertans through this affordability crisis. That is why social benefit programs will be indexed effective Jan. 1, 2023. Albertans receiving AISH and Income Support benefits will see this increase on their January payments, which will be distributed on Dec. 22. Recipients of the Alberta Seniors Benefit will see this increase on their January cheques and recipients of the Alberta Child and Family Benefit will see the increase in their first quarterly payment in February 2023.

Examples of monthly benefit rate changes for Jan. 1, 2023

Examples are based on the maximum core monthly benefit rates for single people with no children:

- \$1,685 to \$1,787 AISH
- \$745 to \$790 Income Support (expected to work)
- \$866 to \$919 Income Support (barriers to full employment)
- \$286 to \$303 Alberta Seniors Benefit

Indexation will increase the benefit payments per child by six per cent for families who access the Alberta Child and Family Benefit. The increased benefit payment for annual totals, based on whether a family has anywhere from one to four children, follows:

- one child \$120
- two children \$198
- three children \$260
- four children \$307

Benefit increases are based on the consumer price index for 2022 and benefit rates vary depending on Albertans' needs, household composition and other factors.

Alberta's government will invest about \$45 million in 2022-23 and \$173 million in 2023-24 to support indexation of the AISH, Income Support and Alberta Seniors benefit programs, and about \$7 million in 2022-2023 and \$35 million in 2023-2024 to support the indexation of the Alberta Child and Family Benefit.

Alberta's government is delivering immediate cost-ofliving and inflation relief while working to support longterm affordability.

The Affordability Action Plan will extend broad-based supports while targeting additional relief to families, seniors and our most vulnerable. Albertans can learn more about current and future affordability relief programs and supports at alberta.ca.

Brazeau County has recently completed budget deliberations. A few things might be worth noting.

This budget appears to be tight, with little room for the unexpected, especially without knowing

what the Province will do with linear taxes, etc. Given that this council has spent about \$40 million more than revenues over the last few years, this could be a problem.

A lot of time was spent on hard surfacing/paving. One has to question the X ? millions going to luxury. In a previous letter, it was mentioned that 14 residents along one mile would receive a benefit of \$100,000 each (via the paving). How does this benefit the rest of the County?

It should also be noted that one road project was moved up from 2024 to be done in 2023. This item would be done in Westerlund's division. Is it possible that public funds are being used for political promotion? You decide.

Council also approved the "474" road (1 mile) that will likely cost about \$4 million. This road

benefits only one person (a councillor) and is completely unnecessary (in my estimation). When finished (according to staff analysis), it will not be suitable for school bus use as the grade (after 45 feet of fill) would be too steep. An expensive cow trail?


