- Deliveries will be made on December 21 & 22. We are looking for VOLUNTEERS to do deliveries





CONSUMER FIREWORKS SAFETY

Consumer Fireworks are not toys. They are in fact, powerful pyrotechnic articles and, for this reason, both their sale and purchase are regulated.

YOU MUST OBTAIN A FIREWORKS PERMIT PRIOR TO **DISCHARGING ANY FIREWORKS**

Fireworks permit can be obtained from Drayton Valley Brazeau County Fire Services at 5120-52nd in Drayton Valley during regular business hours, for a \$10 fee.

Fireworks permit application shall include the following information:

- Name, address, and signature of applicant
- The date and time of proposed display
- A detailed description of the proposed display
- The exact location planned for the fireworks display including a diagram of the grounds on which it will be held, showing the point from where the fireworks will be discharged, the location of all highways, and the lines behind which the audience will be restrained
- Written consent from the owner of the property on which the fireworks display will occur • The manner and place of storage of all fireworks prior to, during and after the display
- The name and address of the vendor or vendors that supplied or will supply all the fireworks used in the fireworks display

It is the responsibility of the permit holder to know the rules and regulations of the municipality in which they will be discharging the fireworks.

Fireworks Safety Tips

- Choose a wide, clear site away from all obstacles.
- Refer to the safety instructions on the fireworks label for minimum distance from
- Do not discharge fireworks in windy conditions.
- Read all instructions on the fireworks.
- Kids should never play with fireworks.
- Buy only legal fireworks (legal fireworks have a label with the manufacturer's name and directions; illegal ones are unlabeled), and store them in a cool, dry place. Illegal fireworks usually go by the names M-80, M100, blockbuster, or quarter pounder. These explosives were banned in 1966, but still account for many fireworks injuries.
- Never try to make your own fireworks
- Always use fireworks outside and have a bucket of water (or an ABC fire extinguisher) and a house nearby in case of an accident.
- Steer clear of others setting off fireworks. They can backfire or shoot off in the
- Use a good firing base such as a pail filled with earth or sand.
- Never throw or point fireworks at someone, even as a joke.
- Don't hold fireworks in your hand or have any part of your body over them while lighting. Recommended wearing eye protection.
- Light one firework at a time (never place fireworks in glass or metal containers), and never relight a dud.
- Don't allow kids to pick up pieces of fireworks after an event. Some may still be ignited and can explode at any time. Allow 30 minutes before cleaning-up debris, or before approaching a firework that did not go off.
- Soak all fireworks in a bucket of water before throwing them in the trash can.

Community labs transition from APL to DynaLIFE

EDMONTON – On December 5, community lab services in larger urban centres in the province have transitioned from Alberta Precision Laboratories to DynaLIFE Medical Labs.

In addition, DynaLIFE labs are now testing specimens from hospitals throughout the province.

This is the first of three phases of the provincial transition to DynaLIFE, and impacts North, Edmonton, Central and Calgary zones of Alberta Health Services (AHS). This change will improve lab services for Albertans and create savings that will be reinvested into other healthcare services.

About two-thirds of provincial lab work, or 50 million tests per year, is generated from the community and will be delivered by DynaLIFE under contract to AHS. The contract includes operating community labs and mobile collection facilities in cities and communities with more than 25,000 collections per year.

APL in-hospital laboratories will continue to serve patients who have a requisition generated at a hospital or urgent care site, either through inpatient, emergency or ambulatory clinics. Hospital labs in rural areas that do not have a stand-alone community lab will also continue to serve rural community clients.

DynaLIFE has built and is continuing to develop additional capacity in Calgary and Edmonton, which will enable increased volume of tests to be processed every day. New community labs are also opening in several communities across the province. To learn more about the changes taking place in each zone, visit www.wearedynalife.ca

The new Q.Me centralized online appointment system is mobile friendly and provides additional options for Albertans accessing lab services, including options for pre-booked or same day appointments using "Save My Place", a queue management feature that informs patients when their appointment is time becoming available.

South Zone community laboratory services in Brooks, Lethbridge and Medicine Hat will transition in Phase 2,



MLA REPORT

from The Office of MLA Mark Smith, Member of the Legislative Assembly for Drayton Valley - Devon

The new legislative session has begun, and the Government of Alberta is hard at work for you and your family in the Legislature.

The new session opened with a speech from the throne, where Lieutenant Governor Salma Lakhani highlighted our government's key priorities for the months ahead; namely, making life more affordable for families, attracting jobs and investment to our province, fixing the healthcare system, and standing up for our jurisdictional rights against Ottawa.

Premier Danielle Smith began the new session by tabling Bill 1, the Alberta Sovereignty within a United Canada Act, to empower our province to stand-up against and defend our jurisdictional rights from federal overreach and interference. This legislation, if passed, would help strengthen the bonds of Confederation by upholding our nation's most foundational documents – the Canadian Constitution and the Charter of Rights and Freedoms.

Peace River MLA Dan Williams then tabled private member's Bill 202 to make it easier and more affordable for Albertans to give to charity. Bill 202 proposes to increase the non-refundable tax credit for charitable donations of \$200 or less from 10 per cent to 60 per cent. If passed, this would bring the total tax credit for charitable donations in-line with political donations at 75 per cent, when combined with the federal rebate of 15 per cent. Bill 202 has already been welcomed by several charitable organizations like the Alberta Cancer Foundation who called it, "a huge leap forward in helping to create a strong, vibrant, and sustainable charitable sector."

Soon, we will learn more details about our government's legislation to address inflation, including expanding the electricity rebate to a total of up to \$500; reindexing benefits like AISH, PDD, and Income Support, as well as the Alberta Seniors Benefit and the Alberta Child and Family Benefit; and providing targeted payments for kids under 18, seniors 65 and over, and vulnerable Albertans with household incomes of \$180,000 or below. Minister Jones will table a bill to help these actions fall into place.

Economist Trevor Tombe has already called these measures the "ideal way" to help Albertans weather the inflation storm. In particular, he said the \$600 being provided over six months to kids under 18 will

"fully offset costs for families with two to three kids and household incomes under \$120,000."

I look forward to providing you with more details on all the above legislation soon, as well other bills we will be putting forward this sitting.

Premier Smith and our United Conservative team have wasted no time getting to work for Albertans. Our economy has come back strong, but more work needs to be done, especially when it comes to making life more affordable for families and businesses.

Our United Conservative government won't shy away from doing the hard work that is needed to make life more affordable, reform our healthcare system, attract jobs and investment, and defend the rights and freedoms of Albertans.

We are hard at work in the Legislature, and we won't stop until we get the job done for you.




November 26, 2022 Area of St. Francis




