BRETON MUSEUM KICKED OFF SENIOR'S WEEK

Thirty people attended the Breton Museum as the museum kicked off Senior's week, with an open house on June 5. The attendees were served light refreshments by museum volunteers as they gathered in the south exhibit gallery to be entertained with musical selections by Frank Peters, Mike Bunting and Allan Goddard. These three, along with bassist John Gorham, had played for several years as the Bear Creek Ramblers, an old-time country band. Frank sang a number of his original songs and told some of the background story as to how the song had come about. The band reminisced about some of their humorous incidents while playing around rural Alberta in the late 1980's and early 1990's to the laughter of the crowd.

The Museum Manager, had selected about 6 artifacts from the museum's collection that are not usually on display and spoke about the story behind the artifacts. The artifacts included a 1955 Breton Ball Club leather jacket, from the days when baseball was a major source of entertainment in most towns. Another was an artifact which was clipped on a Christmas tree and held a small candle. Numerous of these clips and candles would have been used to illuminate the

tree... **now what could possibly go wrong**...open flames and a semi dry evergreen! A news article from December 1913 told of a Christmas concert held at the Funnell School, which described that the school was nicely decorated with evergreen boughs and a well-lit Christmas tree. Guess nothing went wrong, as the Funnell School house is still here! He also showed the latest in calculator technology...slide rule...that brought back a few remember when from the audience.

Leonard Meade brought in a "What Is It" ... it was passed around the group to see what their guess would be. It was a metal bell shaped item with a hook at the top that looked like it would have had a handle. After it was passed around, I asked Leonard what is it...he said that is what I want to know. The one guess, which may be right, is that it was a candle snuffer to extinguish candles.

The afternoon concluded with visiting and reminiscing about days gone by. The museum would like to thank all who attended as the museum started its summer season.



NOTICE

Roadside Vegetation Control Program

Brazeau County Agricultural Services Division will be carrying out roadside spraying of prohibited noxious, noxious weeds, and woody vegetation (brush) throughout the County from May to October. For public safety, a buffer zone will be maintained between these roadside spray areas and county residences/yard sites.

As per our Vegetation Management policy, spraying on roadsides is done under the authority of Alberta's Weed Control Act. Brazeau County is required to control the weeds on the roadside just like any other landowner is on privately owned land. As well, in the public interest of safety, brush control is performed to increase the sightlines on roadways and intersections. As a result, costs of maintaining these open roadways are reduced where brush and trees are managed properly as it makes snow removal easier and allows roads to dry out quicker after precipitation falls.

The following programs related to herbicide use are available to residents:

- Hawkweed Program (County staff will treat up to 5 acres infested with Hawkweed on private land at no cost)
- Herbicide Rebate Program (the County will reimburse landowners 50% of the cost of herbicide used on the landowner's property)
- No Spray Agreement (the County will not use herbicides in the ditch adjacent to a landowner's property; responsibility for weed control is assumed by the landowner)

The Village of Breton - Waste Transfer Site Reopens June 1 Operating Hours Thurs Fri Sat 10am to 5 pm

After the recent fire at our waste transfer site Village Council reviewed the operations of the site and have instituted additional safety measures. These will take effect in stages as indicated below.

EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY

The following waste must be **taken directly to a landfill**. Waste can be taken to the Drayton Valley Landfill located at HWY 22 and 58 Ave. Tipping rates vary at the Drayton Valley landfill starting at \$6.00 for residential waste.

- Bleach, Drain, Toilet/Oven Cleaners etc.
- Paint/Stain Cans & Motor Oil Filters
- Tires & Car/Truck Batteries
- Herbicide, Pesticide Containers
- Fluorescent Tubes/Ballasts, Light Bulbs,
- Halogen Lights & Fixtures & Household Batteries
- Caulking Tubes/Cement Powder Boxes
- E Waste, Computers, Monitor's DVD Players, TV's,
- BBQ's & Lawnmowers
- Furniture, Mattresses, Sofas, Box Springs, etc.
- Lumber, Decking, Concrete, Shingles, Insulation & Drywall

Trees, branches and yard clippings will still be accepted as per usual. This waste will no longer be burnt each year. It will be chipped twice a year and the mulch from the chipping will be available for resident use. No cardboard, paper, lumber etc is permitted to be disposed of within this pile. All cardboard is to be placed in the newly provided bin.

For the month of June the Waste Transfer Site will still accept household waste free of charge. As of **July 1st this will no longer be accepted for free**. Residents will be able to purchase garbage bags at a cost of \$3.00 per bag from the Village office. These bags will be the **only items accepted for waste**

To the Editor:

On June 26 at Buck Creek Hall at 6:00 p.m., there will be a public meeting for council to present data on the wild fire situation in Brazeau County. (Beef on a bun.)

The following thoughts come to mind as a response to this announcement.

At a recent county council meeting, it was stated that the wildfires in the county cost \$7 million. As usual, who will pay? Given provincial cuts to provincial fire training (etc.) budget, county taxpayers will likely bear the brunt. (I hope I am wrong here.)

Why is there not a county disaster fund with monies set aside for such occurrences. Any reserve fund that could be depleted has been depleted, so where is the money to be found to cover the fire costs?

Additionally, this council has spent about \$35 million more than revenues. Why were previous councils able to keep reserve amounts close to where they needed to be, but not this council? Again, where will the money come from to cover the fire costs?

With regard to the firefighting, the following questions come to mind:

- Why did the Province cut its "fire" budget" (Provincial debt of about \$79 billion? {Google})
- Were initial efforts to put out the fire aggressive and sustained enough?
- Given the provincial cuts on the issue, did the firefighters have access to all the training and equipment they could have used?
- Was/is there a county disaster plan in place and if not, why not? (Fires are not the only disasters that can happen.)
- What are the policies regarding the protection of housing, outbuildings, and stock?

At the last council meeting, it was stated that ". .. . we will learn something from this " It seems the learning will be a little late, given the lessons that Ft. McMurray and other fires presented.

Attend to see how the council handles their data and presentation on the issue.
