



The Village of Breton - Waste Transfer Site Reopens June 1 Operating Hours Thurs Fri Sat 10am to 5 pm

After the recent fire at our waste transfer site Village Council reviewed the operations of the site and have instituted additional safety measures. These will take effect in stages as indicated below.

EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY

The following waste must be **taken directly to a landfill**. Waste can be taken to the Drayton Valley Landfill located at HWY 22 and 58 Ave. Tipping rates vary at the Drayton Valley landfill starting at \$6.00 for residential waste.

- Bleach, Drain, Toilet/Oven Cleaners etc.
- Paint/Stain Cans & Motor Oil Filters
- Tires & Car/Truck Batteries
- Herbicide, Pesticide Containers
- Fluorescent Tubes/Ballasts, Light Bulbs,
- Halogen Lights & Fixtures & Household Batteries
- Caulking Tubes/Cement Powder Boxes
- E Waste, Computers, Monitor's DVD Players, TV's,
- BBQ's & Lawnmowers
- Furniture, Mattresses, Sofas, Box Springs, etc.
- Lumber, Decking, Concrete, Shingles, Insulation & Drywall

Trees, branches and yard clippings will still be accepted as per usual. This waste will no longer be burnt each year. It will be chipped twice a year and the mulch from the chipping will be available for resident use. No cardboard, paper, lumber etc is permitted to be disposed of within this pile. All cardboard is to be placed in the newly provided bin.

For the month of June the Waste Transfer Site will still accept household waste free of charge. As of **July 1st this will no longer be accepted for free**. Residents will be able to purchase garbage bags at a cost of \$3.00 per bag from the Village office. These bags will be the **only items accepted for waste**



NOTICE

Roadside Vegetation Control Program

Brazeau County Agricultural Services Division will be carrying out roadside spraying of prohibited noxious, noxious weeds, and woody vegetation (brush) throughout the County from May to October. For public safety, a buffer zone will be maintained between these roadside spray areas and county residences/yard sites.

As per our Vegetation Management policy, spraying on roadsides is done under the authority of Alberta's Weed Control Act. Brazeau County is required to control the weeds on the roadside just like any other landowner is on privately owned land. As well, in the public interest of safety, brush control is performed to increase the sightlines on roadways and intersections. As a result, costs of maintaining these open roadways are reduced where brush and trees are managed properly as it makes snow removal easier and allows roads to dry out quicker after precipitation falls.

The following programs related to herbicide use are available to residents:

- Hawkweed Program (County staff will treat up to 5 acres infested with Hawkweed on private land at no cost)
- Herbicide Rebate Program (the County will reimburse landowners 50% of the cost of herbicide used on the landowner's property)
- No Spray Agreement (the County will not use herbicides in the ditch adjacent to a landowner's property; responsibility for weed control is assumed by the landowner)



Breton Museum

"Painting Alberta" Edmonton Art Exhibit Features Two Images from Breton Museum

Last April, the Breton Museum was contacted by Calgary based artist Sabine Lecorre -Moore about a project she was working on called Painting Alberta. Painting Alberta is a series of 360 paintings, based on photographs from 1881 to the present. Each painting is six-inches square in size, with some images being a single canvas, and others varying from two to six canvases to complete the image. This labor of love has taken Sabine several years in total to complete. Her interest in visiting the Breton Museums was centred on the work at the museum about Alberta's black history from the early twentieth century. From her visit two images made it into the exhibit, which launched in Edmonton on June 8.

The project Painting Alberta pays tribute to a beautiful province. It represents a 360 view of the province's culture, landscapes, populations and history. Over the course of the project the project took on a collaborative effort with 120 participants from all walks of life, religions and cultures sharing

their images and stories to bring the project to fruition. To learn about the subject matter Sabine researched in libraries and archives, in addition to developing strong relationships with several first Nation Groups such as the Lubicon Lake Band from Little Buffalo and the SAGE Clan Patrol from Lethbridge.

The first image to be included in the exhibit from the

museum was an archival photograph of Funnell School teacher Jess Jones and his students circa 1922. The second image was a photograph taken by Sabine, of Brandy Fredrickson a descendant from the Keystone community families, wrapped in the "Matilda Day Quilt." If you go to Sabine Lecorre-Moore's web page and click on Painting Alberta you will find a very interesting video about the Matilda Day Quilt, along with other images of the exhibit.

The Breton Museum received an invitation to the exhibit opening, and on June 8th myself, along with museum volunteer Arlene Hedlund and her daughter Jodi attended the exhibit opening at the CAVA gallery in the "Old French Quarters", located in south Edmonton. The CAVA Gallery is a non-profit association whose mission is to raise community awareness of the importance of the visual arts and to stimulate Francophone artists in their development. It was a great experience to

attend the exhibit opening and to see what a beautiful and diverse province we live in. The exhibit is on display at the CAVA gallery located at 9103 95 Ave NW. Edmonton until July 20th. The Old French Quarters is a very beautiful part of south Edmonton. so if you get a chance check out Painting Alberta.

The Santiago Partnership and Co founders Kim Carter-Delp and Joel Delp see the bigger picture as in the last 8 years I have seen this amazing ministry invest in the people of Ecuador. LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

To the Editor:

One of the fundamental principles of governance is to make data-driven decisions. If memory serves, this principle is referenced in the MGA (Municipal Government Act). Let's check how the concept plays out in Brazeau County.

A decision was made some time ago to reduce fees to zero for subdivision development in the county. Information coming my way suggests a cost of at least \$3000 to the county to process a subdivision application.

Originally, the idea was to promote an increase in tax revenues by increasing the movement of people into the county.

Not many years ago, a report was presented to the County council that clearly stated that it costs the county about \$1.80 for every \$1.00 of tax revenue from subdivisions.

Why then do we have zero fees for subdivision development?

It should be noted that any landowner in the county who develops many subdivisions per year would be a primary beneficiary of the policy, and one landowner has developed about 10 so far this year.

Given that the county has drawn down its reserves to ridiculously low levels (see machinery and equipment reserves, for example), may have to pay something (unknown at this time) for the wildfires, has spent \$35-\$40 million more than revenues the last few years, is it a reasonable (i.e., data-driven) policy to have?

Perhaps a rethink on the 25% tax rebate is also in order and any other fees that have been reduced or eliminated.

How do such policies/decisions benefit the county (i.e., the rest of us that subsidize them)? Ask your councillor how they justify this situation.

If you are happy with these policies, do nothing and the beneficiaries (damned few) will be happy; if not, call, write, email your councillor and express your displeasure.
