

#### **Roadside Vegetation Control Program**

Brazeau County Agricultural Services Division will be carrying out roadside spraying of prohibited noxious, noxious weeds, and woody vegetation (brush) throughout the County from May to October. For public safety, a buffer zone will be maintained between these roadside spray areas and county residences/yard sites.

As per our Vegetation Management policy, spraying on roadsides is done under the authority of Alberta's Weed Control Act. Brazeau County is required to control the weeds on the roadside just like any other landowner is on privately owned land. As well, in the public interest of safety, brush control is performed to increase the sightlines on roadways and intersections. As a result, costs of maintaining these open roadways are reduced where brush and trees are managed properly as it makes snow removal easier and allows roads to dry out quicker after precipitation falls.

The following programs related to herbicide use are available to residents:

- Hawkweed Program (County staff will treat up to 5 acres infested with Hawkweed on private land at no cost)
- Herbicide Rebate Program (the County will reimburse landowners 50% of the cost of herbicide used on the landowner's property)
- No Spray Agreement (the County will not use herbicides in the ditch adjacent to a landowner's property; responsibility for weed control is assumed by the landowner)

- Season with salt, pepper, and garlic powder to taste.


### **Berry Yogurt Parfait:**



# CELEBRATE AT THE BRETON MUSEUM JULY 1

Yes, the Breton and District Historical Society is celebrating an anniversary this year. It was fortyfive years ago that a group of dedicated individuals gathered to start preserving the history of the Breton area. The group incorporated with the Societies' Act of Alberta, and on April 18, 1978 they officially became the Breton and District Historical Society. Their goal was to publish a community history book for the area. The publishing of community histories was very common during the time period, leading up to the 75th Anniversary of Alberta becoming a Province in 1980. For the next two years the group diligently worked contacting families who had been residents of the area, gathering family histories, photographs and information on all aspects of the Breton Community from the early 1900's. The research included information on the early families who settled the community, the logging and lumbering industry, the railway, the town, schools and agriculture all which played a vital role in the development of the community as we know it today.

Their work came to fruition on August 2, 1980, as part of a Homecoming event, celebrating Alberta's 75th anniversary as a province. The Ladder of Time history book was launched that weekend with the first copy, a leather-bound edition, auctioned off by local auctioneer Norris Lansdell. Proceeds from the auction went to help offset the publishing costs of the book. Wayne Carson was the successful bidder of this copy which he graciously donated back to Village to be placed in the new Breton Library. The Ladder of Time also won the 1980 Alberta Culture's Regional History Award from a record 43 submissions that year.

While the Ladder of Time is now an out-of-print book, people who own a copy treasure it as a wonderful community resource. It has been said that it has solved many arguments about the community's history. At the Breton Museum we use it as a valuable research resource.

Today the legacy started by the Breton and District Historical Society lives on at the Breton Museum. Join the museum on July 1 at 2 PM for cake and light refreshments. You will also be entertained with live music from the *"No HitchHiker Band"* during the afternoon. Hope to see you on July 1st.

# HIGHLIGHTS

#### **State of Local Emergency Cancelled**

Council cancelled the State of Local Emergency, as the Pembina Complex fires do not currently pose a threat to people or property.

#### **Off Highway Vehicle Bylaw**

Council adopted Bylaw 1153-23, which amends the current Off Highway Vehicle Bylaw to include a section that would allow for the CAO or designate by way of notice, to prohibit the operation of offhighway vehicles where a fire hazard or burning hazard warrants it. The section further provides for exemptions for farming or work-related activities. The modifications to the bylaw would allow for Community Peace Officers to enforce and to fine violators.

#### **Education and Enforcement Policy**

Council approved the updated PD-17 Education and Enforcement Policy, which provides additional clarification to staff and members of the public on the education and enforcement process for community standards complaints.

#### **Assessment Update**

Bob Daudelin and Ray Fortin of Accurate Assessment provided Council with the County's 2022 Assessment Highlights.

In general, assessment rose across the county by about nine per cent between 2021 and 2022. There were 75 new roll numbers added to the property list, and 92 development permits issued. Seventy-two new wells were drilled in 2022.

#### **Canadian Heritage Rivers**

Council directed administration to write a letter to the provincial and federal ministers of environment outlining concerns with the North Saskatchewan River being designated a Canadian Heritage River and the potential impacts on local decision-making and land use decisions.

#### **RCMP Update**

Ryan Hoetmer introduced new Drayton Valley detachment commander Staff Sergeant Troy Raddatz to council. He and Staff Sergeant Dwayne Moore of the Breton/Thorsby detachment provided crime statistics.

In Breton, total Criminal Code offences increased by 23% when comparing the January to March periods of 2023 and 2022, to 154 from 125.

In Drayton Valley, total Criminal Code offences decreased 34% when comparing January-May 2022 to the same period in 2023, with 88 fewer offences.






