Counselling Subsidies – Breton and Area FCSS is pleased to offer Counselling Subsidies

A subsidy is available for individuals, couples and/or families who are struggling with common, everyday issues to access short-term preventative counselling services. The goal is to:

- Improve relationships with better communication and conflict resolution skills;
- Improve mood with anger management and emotional support;
- Enhance personal growth with creativity, spirituality, self-esteem, self-awareness, goal setting;
- Improve parenting skills by focusing on attachment;
- Reduce stress with life balance; and/or
- · Learn new skills and behaviors

The cost of counselling can be a barrier for many individuals and families. This subsidy is available to those who do not have access to coverage through health benefits or employee benefits, such as an Employee Assistance Plan (EAP), and whose family income is less than \$75,000 per year. Fees are determined according to a sliding scale based on income and family size. Fees range from \$15 per session to \$50 per session. The maximum number of sessions available is seven for individuals and nine for couples or families.

Counselling services are provided through a partnership with Karunia Counselling from Leduc. We know that in this current environment many may have additional stress and anxiety. We also know that transportation may be an added barrier. These sessions can be arranged to be in person in the Karunia offices in Leduc, over the phone in your own safe environment or virtually on your computer.

To apply for the subsidy services, application forms are available through the Breton FCSS Office at 4916 50th Avenue or by contacting them at fcss@breton.ca or calling 780-696-3636. ALL APPLICATIONS ARE STRICTLY CONFIDENTIAL.

Breton and Area FCSS will be doing the intake of the applications. Counselling services are provided by Karunia Counselling by Registered Psychologists, Registered Provisional Psychologists, Canadian Certified Counsellors and Masters or PhD level student interns under the supervision of a qualified psychologist. All applications will be kept in strict confidence

BRETON, AB – July 11, 2023 – Homeowners in Breton now have access to optional service plans to assist with the cost and management of common plumbing repairs thanks to a new, voluntary program for residents, reviewed by local leaders. The service plans provide protection for the water and sewer service lines that connect a resident's home to Breton's system.

The 2022 SLWC "State of the Canadian Home" survey found that 40% of Canadian homeowners are unaware that they are financially responsible for needed repairs or replacement to the water and sewer lines on their property. These repairs are not covered under standard homeowner's insurance or by Breton.

"The worst call our employees can get is one from a resident who has had a water or sewer service line issue and doesn't know that it's their responsibility to maintain their service lines," said Natasha Morrisey, Chief Administrative Officer. "When a homeowner has a potentially expensive repair is not when we want them to learn this, so we've teamed up with Service Line Warranties to help educate them and offer them an optional repair plan to protect them from unanticipated repair costs."

These plans take the worry, inconvenience, and financial burden out of the repair," said Mike Van Horne, General Manager, Service Line Warranties of Canada. "Breton homeowners with a plan have easy access to a network of excellent contractors, and they get peace of mind that they won't be financially responsible for a covered home repair emergency."

Homeowners in more than 70 Canadian municipalities now have access to SLWC service repair plans. Since the SLWC program began in 2014, homeowners have saved more than \$8 million in repair expenses.
