## READE, Glenn Sinclair 1930-2023



It is with deep sorrow that we announce Glenn's passing, on the 20th of November, in Wetaskiwin.

Glenn was raised in Medicine Hat by his parents, Marian and Frank Reade. Deciding that he'd be a "city boy going farming", he subsequently moved to Cassils, near Brooks, where he met the love of his life, Olga; the principal of the two-room schoolhouse. Together, Glenn and Olga first fostered

five children, then later started their own family of four.

In 1973, Glenn and Olga moved their family to near Breton, where Glenn continued to farm until his retirement in 1991. They later moved to the town of Breton, then to the south Pigeon Lake area, and finally to Wetaskiwin.

Glenn liked to portray himself as a crusty farmer of simple tastes. Those of us who knew him could easily see past the facade, to his underlying humour, intelligence, compassion, and integrity.

His mother, Marian, inspired in him a lifelong love of music. He completed eight years' of Toronto Conservatory at an early age, but as an adult preferred playing Big Band and other popular music from his youth. Glenn subsequently passed his passion for music to his own family and graced them with his repertoire of piano playing and singing throughout the years. He loved dancing, especially with his wife and daughters.

As a boy, Glenn was a King's Scout, enjoyed camping in the Elkwater area, and later introduced his sons to Scouts. He was an avid card player and enjoyed the many summer Bridge tournaments through central Alberta. In retirement he continued to contribute to the community through his membership in the Lion's Club.

Glenn often expressed that despite the hardships of farming, he was very fortunate that his life's work was in the profession that he loved. He practised organic farming before the term was coined, was gentle with his animals, and considered himself as a steward of the land, with a responsibility to future generations greater than his immediate needs.

He was a proponent for good education, firm in his beliefs of the world, while maintaining an open mind that allowed him to change and admit when he was wrong. Glenn had strong opinions on personal responsibility and the importance of fulfilling obligations once taken. He always believed that the most important moral code lies in how each of us treat our fellow person.

He is survived by his wife of 65 years, Olga; his sister, Joanne; four wonderful children; and five cherished grandchildren.

## BRAZEAU COUNTY PASSES 2024 INTERIM BUDGET

BRAZEAU COUNTY, November 24, 2023 — On November 23, Brazeau County Council passed an interim budget for 2024, with a focus on core services and ratepayer relief.

The interim budget maintains the years-long freeze on municipal taxes. Fees, which were limited to zero or to minimal levels in previous years, are not set to increase.

The budget also includes \$14.8 million in capital investment in roads, equipment replacement, and other infrastructure, and accounts for a 20% incentive on residential taxes that are paid on time. It also maintains the 25% decrease in municipal taxes for properties for the small business sub-class.

"As always, Council is spending where it makes sense and where it is needed to provide municipal services to residents, while keeping as much money as possible in their pockets," says Reeve Bart Guyon. "We are becoming well-known in the province, nationally, and globally for our economic development approach, which includes keeping taxes among the lowest in the country."

Infrastructure investments and other initiatives include:

- 27.2 km of newly budgeted improvements to existing roads
- 16.8 km of improvements to roads carried over from the 2023 budget
- Investment in solar power installation at the Cynthia SAS water treatment plant
- Relocation of a portion of the walking path on the ring road near Drayton Valley
- A new Fire services Command Vehicle for Drayton Valley/Brazeau County Fire Services
- A new playground at Rocky Rapids Community Hall
- A modernized radio system to allow Fire Services to use the same communication system as the RCMP and other emergency responders (Year 2 of a 5 year commitment)

Council passes an interim budget in order to proceed on approved operational and capital projects in the period between now and when the County receives final property assessment information, and approval of a final budget in April.





## Legislative Highlights: Prioritizing Progress for Albertans

I would like to share that substantial progress has been achieved in the House this week for the benefit of Albertans. It's important to take this opportunity to update my riding on the significant positive changes underway and the impactful work that has been accomplished.

In the recent week, the United Conservative government in Alberta has prioritized key issues, including provincial rights, affordable housing, healthcare, and infrastructure. Municipal Affairs Minister Ric McIver criticized the Trudeau Liberals for bypassing the provincial government in dealings with municipalities, asserting Alberta's constitutional right to govern its municipalities. Leduc-Beaumont MLA Brandon Lunty introduced Bill 204, aiming to safeguard Albertans' interests in the creation and development of National Urban Parks.

Transportation Minister Devin Dreeshen responded to concerns from drivers by announcing a ban on photo radar on ring roads in Calgary and Edmonton from December 1. The government also plans to collaborate with municipalities and law enforcement to eliminate all "fishing hole" radar locations in the province.

Health Minister Adriana LaGrange announced the upcoming allowance for nurse practitioners to establish independent clinics, addressing the challenge of access to primary care. This initiative is part of ongoing efforts to enhance healthcare in the province, with a focus on immediate problem-solving rather than delaying solutions. Positive indicators include an increase of 348 doctors in the province, according to the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Alberta. Premier Danielle Smith and the United Conservative team remain dedicated to addressing the concerns of Albertans as the legislative session progresses into its fifth week. The government aims to enhance health outcomes and empower healthcare workers across the province. Soliciting input from healthcare workers, patients, and families is a priority, and Albertans are encouraged to share their perspectives through the survey to contribute valuable insights on the current healthcare system.

Alberta's government is investing in the provincial trail system and creating new recreation, tourism, and

economic development opportunities. The Rocky Mountain House to Nordegg Rail Trail, developed over 30 years along the historic Canadian Northern Western Railway, repurposes the Brazeau Branch rail line and Taunton Trestle bridge for multi-use recreation. Clearwater County's 2009 concept plan gained support from Alberta's government, securing a \$2.4 million investment for the initial two phases, resulting in 45 kilometers of trails. This Rail Trail is expected to boost regional tourism, providing a chance for Albertans and visitors to enjoy the province's top-notch trail system.

Alberta's government is launching a new program to provide shelter for seniors escaping elder abuse in rural and Indigenous communities. We are investing \$3.3 million over three years to create safe spaces for seniors, with a focus on collaboration with community partners. The Safe Spaces initiative, allocating over \$2 million, aims to provide secure shelters for seniors in rural Alberta and Indigenous communities.

Driven by a sincere commitment to serve and represent my riding, my ultimate goal is to bring about positive change and amplify awareness of the concerns within our community. As we transition into the colder weather and approach the holiday season, I extend my heartfelt wishes for the safety and well-being of each individual.

As always, I am fully committed to being accessible and supportive. Whether it's addressing concerns or meeting with you, I am here to provide assistance and dedicated to working together for the betterment of our community.



# BRAZEAU COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

November 21, 2023 Regular Council Meeting

### **Appointments to Committees**

Council appointed Georgia Frost, Laura Delesalle and Mike Mueller to the Pest, Weed and Soil Appeal Committee as of January 1, 2024 and Georgia Frost to the Subdivision and Development Appeal Board. Vacancies remained following the Organizational Meeting October 23rd due to insufficient applications.

### Financial Update

Council received a financial update with the County's current available funds, commitments, payables and operating requirements prior to beginning interim 2024 budget discussions this week. As of September 30th, 2023, the County had a cash and investment balance of \$48 million, with \$38.5 million committed to projects or reserves and to day to day operations through June 2024.

## Support for Buck Creek Hall

Council passed a motion to cover half of the costs to replace the floor at Buck Creek Hall, subject to 50% of the funding coming from a provincial Community Facility Enhancement Program (CFEP) grant. The cost is estimated at \$47.253.




Here are six last-minute Christmas budgeting tips for you master procrastinators... err... busy people.


