



February 6, 2024 Regular Council Meeting

Emergency Management Preparation

Council directed staff to investigate Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) funding for planting edible trees in Cynthia and other Brazeau County areas, including costs.

FCM has partnered with Tree Canada to ensure local governments have access to key expertise and information that informs best practices. The Edible Trees grant helps fight food insecurity

by offering financial and logistical support to plant fruit and nut bearing trees and shrubs in communities on publicly accessible sites. A grant of up to \$10,000 may be available.

Lodgepole Water Wells

Council directed staff to conduct a table top investigation on the water wells in Lodgepole to address resident concerns about dried up wells.

Agricultural Inspector Appointment

Council appointed Assistant Agricultural Fieldman Greg Cameron as a weed inspector, pest inspector, and soil conservation officer.

WILDLAND FIRE INDUSTRY RESPONSE INFORMATION SESSIONS

A company representative will not suffice. Each individual interested in providing assistance, should the need arise, is required to attend one of these sessions.

The discussion will focus on the following topics:

1. Incident Command System

An overview will be provided of the incident command structure which will involve a discussion around an incident action plan and what information it provides and why it is important for industry members to understand it.

2. Staging and Checking into an Incident

Discussion will focus on what staging is, what forms need to be completed at staging so members of industry can get paid.

How vehicles are marked at staging so they can be deployed into the incident

. Why this is important for accountability in an incident

It will also include checking in and checking out of the incident and how resources are assigned and deployed to assist.

3. Emergency Operations Best Practices

This section will focus on how industry and emergency services work in a shared space during an emergency.

It will include items such as what color fire helmet should a contractor be looking for to get directions.

It will give a general overview of air operations

The water haulers discussion will focus on fittings that are needed to attach to a fire apparatus, where these fittings can be found on a fire truck, as well as how water haulers park so they supply water but also exit quickly and safely if needed.

For heavy equipment operations, discussions will focus on a general overview of dozer operations in terms of dozer fire guards, flagging, as well as some basic information on safe dozer operations.

4. Framework for Integration

In this section the focus will be on the payment for services based on the provincial tender rates for equipment. We will focus on what the rate covers and does not cover.

We will also talk about establishing contracts with companies prior to any incident.

We will also look at the pre-employment training that will be required to work with the municipality. What training do they need to have? (Wildfire Contractor Orientation Online Program), Fireline Safety, Dozer Boss courses, etc.

There will also be discussion on equipment expectations and maintenance programs for equipment and what the expectations are for contractors sharing maintenance program records and ensuring the company has a safety program. for their equipment and personnel.

A discussion will also be had regarding insurance and liability and what expectations are for holding insurance policies.

We will also discuss the preseason information registration process which will include type of equipment, training, etc. This will also include protocols for resource sharing and coordination with emergency responders.

We will also discuss plans for further follow-up sessions and ongoing communications.





CELEBRATING BLACK HISTORY MONTH

ANOTHER PIECE OF THE STORY THE ALEXANDER BROTHERS

As Black History Month draws to a close, I wanted to write an article which has been on my to do list for over a year. The amount of information which the Breton Museum has on a particular family or individual depends to a large extent on what was published in the community history book the "Ladder of Time", or is included in the archival records of the museum. This was the case with the Alexander family.

One of the main themes at the Breton Museum is documenting the story of the Keystone, and the African American families who settled here in the early 1900's. These families left Oklahoma escaping limited opportunities and racial prejudice. They turned their eyes northward, to western Canada, where the lure of homestead land was available to all males over the age of 18. From 1909 -1911 small groups travelled by train from Oklahoma, arriving in Edmonton. Once in Edmonton, the groups split with some travelling north to Amber Valley, others to Junkins (Wildwood) and Campsie, and some to the community of Keystone.

In 2021, I had an Email from Andrea Alexander the great grand daughter of Clifton T. Alexander. As a child she had been out to the museum with her parents, but with the passing of her father Clifford III, interest in her family's past became a priority to her. Thanks to her research and passing the information along, the museum now has a more detailed picture of the family and the time they resided in Keystone, and where their lives lead them after moving from Keystone.

Mrs. Emma King wrote a short article (seven sentences to be exact) about the four Alexander brothers, who arrived in Edmonton in 1911 along with the King family. She also writes that the brothers stayed with Charlie and Emma King when they first moved out to Keystone.

All four brothers had been born in Alabama. Marvin the eldest was born in 1888 at Florence Alabama. Marvin did file on a homestead at Keystone in 1911, but by 1913 there is evidence that he had returned to the United States, and his homestead application was cancelled. He has remained somewhat of an enigma in Andrea's research.


Clifton T. Alexander, born in 1892, also filed on a homestead at Keystone shortly after his arrival. He would marry Victoria Bella Briscoe of Athabasca Landing in 1913. By 1916 records indicate that he had completed

the requirements of the Homestead Act and received title to his land. At some point the family moved from Keystone to Edmonton where Clifton was employed as a porter with the Northwestern Railroad. Clifton passed away December 31, 1957, and was survived by his wife and four children. Clifton would have a son he named Clifford II, and a grandson also named Clifford III. It was from this family branch which Andrea's research started.

Elmer L. Alexander also filed on a homestead next to his brother Clifton. He married Lottie Ramsey a daughter of George and Leutisha Ramsey, an early Keystone family. By 1921 we find Elmer and Lottie living in Edmonton with their two children, where Elmer is listed as a labourer. Elmer, like his brother, would also work as a railway porter. Elmer and family moved back to the United States, where he passed away in 1951.

Eugene, the youngest Alexander brother, filed on the homestead that his brother Marvin had filed on and abandoned. He would marry Mattie Allen at Keystone in 1917. Mattie was the daughter of William and Mattie Allen, one of the earliest families to settle in Keystone. As with his brothers, Eugene and family would leave Keystone in the 1920's. Eugene would also follow his brothers and work as a porter on the railway. Eugene passed away in 1949 while living in Vancouver. Mattie would remarry and eventually relocate to the United States where she passed away in 1994.

While the Alexander family's stay at Keystone was relatively short, their story deserves to be documented at the Breton Museum. Is the puzzle complete, no but we definitely have more details than we had before, thanks to a family member who took up the cause.

THE HISTORY BEHIND WHY VALENTINE'S DAY IS CELEBRATED

People have been sending Valentines since the year 269 A.D.

Whether you spend the day celebrating your gal pals or cooking a romantic dinner with your partner, Valentine's Day is all about love. But why do we celebrate February 14 with cards, flowers, and chocolates—and what does St. Valentine have to do with it all?

As it turns out, St. Valentine was a real person, credited with sending the first-ever valentine in the third century. We dug into the history of the holiday so you can read up on the sweet traditions before you send flowers to your sweetie and mail your valentine cards. Who knows—they may inspire a few new Valentine's Day traditions for you and your loved ones.

When Is Valentine's Day?

Valentine's Day is always celebrated on the 14th day of February, so it falls on a different day of the week each year. This year, Valentine's Day is on Monday, February 14, 2022.

Who Was St. Valentine?

There are multiple saints named 'Valentine' that appear throughout history, but only one is credited with starting the romantic origins of the holiday we know today. The story goes that in the year 269 A.D., a Roman priest named Valentinus was in jail and ordered to be executed. His last act before he died was writing a love letter to the woman who frequently came to visit him while he was imprisoned. He signed the letter, "From your Valentine," and from then on it has been considered the very first Valentine's Day card in history. Valentinus died on February 14, 269 A.D., and several hundred years later Pope Gelasius declared his death date would be known as St. Valentine's Day.

The History of Valentine's Day

While St. Valentine lived in ancient Rome, the holiday actually combines both Christian and ancient Roman traditions—but it didn't begin as a day filled with cards and flowers.

In the fourth century, a celebration called Lupercalia was celebrated on February 15. On that day, it's said that Roman priests would sacrifice an animal they believed to be associated with fertility (typically a goat). That evening, all the single women in the area would come and place their names in a large urn; names were then drawn by all the eligible bachelors, and typically the couples would decide to get married.

Two centuries after Valentinus wrote his love letter in 269 A.D., the celebration of Lupercalia was outlawed. At the end of the fifth century, Pope Gelasius effectively

declared February 14 to be St. Valentine's Day, merging the two holidays.

Because the holiday came to be associated with the marriage rituals of Ancient Rome, it's believed that this is when the holiday took on a romantic meaning—but it wasn't celebrated with cards and gifts until almost 1,000 years later. In the early 1800s, Valentine's Day cards began to be mass-produced in Britain and the United States, and in the early 1900s, the Hallmark company was founded.

People often refer to Valentine's Day as a "Hallmark holiday," and there's some truth behind the nickname; the Hallmark company was actually instrumental in creating the holiday we know and love today. They created some of the first affordable Valentine's Day cards (\$2, Hallmark) in the United States, and as the mail system became more efficient and less expensive, people began sending cards—which eventually led to sending flowers, special Valentine's Day gifts, and other items as well.

Today, Valentine's Day is celebrated in the United States, Canada, Britain, Mexico, France, and Australia. And while we certainly still do send greeting cards to celebrate (these are our favorite funny Valentine's Day cards), it's now customary to share flowers, chocolates, candy, and gifts on the holiday as well. According to the National Retail Federation, Americans spent more than \$20 billion on Valentine's Day last year, and the NRF predicts this year spending will increase to more than \$27 billion. That's a lot of heart-shaped chocolate boxes (\$5, Party City)!

So as you choose your card and gift this year, remember the sentiment of the very first valentine written by St. Valentine himself—while gifts are a popular choice, a love note to your special someone can be just as meaningful.




