Pink Shirt Day is an annual event against bullying, held in Canada and New Zealand. Participants wear pink shirts and attend or host informative events to raise awareness about bullying, particularly in schools. Pink Shirt Day was started in 2007 in Canada, where it is held on the last Wednesday of February each year.

### **History**

The original event was organized in 2007 by two grade 12 students named David Shepherd and Travis Price of Berwick, Nova Scotia, who bought and distributed 50 pink shirts after a ninth-grade student Chuck McNeill was bullied for wearing a pink polo shirt during the first day of school at Central Kings Rural High School in Cambridge, Nova Scotia. That year, Nova Scotia Premier Rodney MacDonald proclaimed the second

Thursday of September (aligning with the start of each school year) as "Stand Up Against Bullying Day" in recognition of these events.

In 2008, then-Premier of British Columbia, Gordon Campbell proclaimed February 27 to be the provincial Anti-Bullying Day. In 2009, the Boys & Girls Clubs of Canada worked on pink t-shirts that say "Bullying Stops Here." and "Pink Shirt Day" for Anti-Bullying Day.

Just when we thought winter may be over, we get a rude reminder that the snow and cold are not quite done with us. With the heavy snowfall, if you are able to assist a neighbor or senior on your street, it is greatly appreciated.

**Community Volunteer Income Tax Program – FREE INCOME TAX PREPARATION - For Low Income** Persons, Families, seniors and students. Although this is something that most of us would like to avoid thinking about and doing, I am afraid that this is unavoidable. You need to file your income tax each year, even if you have no income to report. By doing this you may receive benefits that you did not know you were eligible for. Also, in the event of the death of your spouse, benefits can easily be transferred to you, if you have filled a return for the last calendar year. If you did not file a tax return in 2023 you may not be receiving benefits from the government that you are eligible for. The focus of the Community Volunteer Tax Program is to assist those individuals who have limited income. This includes seniors, families, and students. If your income was approximately in one of the following categories, you may qualify for assistance. 1 person - \$35,000 / Couple -\$45,000 / Family \$52,500

We are not able to complete returns with income from the following sources: Capital Gains or Losses, Farming Income, Rental Income, Self-Employment, Interest exceeding \$1,000, Bankruptcies, Deceased Persons

This service is FREE to those who qualify. If you require this service, please gather your information, and bring it to the Village of Breton office Monday to Thursday between  $8:30-4 \mathrm{pm}$ . Clients will be notified when your return is completed. The program will run from March  $1-4 \mathrm{pm} = 1.00 \mathrm{m}$ 

We require the following information for your return:

- \* Personal Information (Social Insurance Number, Birth date, Marital Status, Address)
- \* Dependent's info spouse/children's names, birthdates.
- \*All "T" Slips (T4's, T4A, OAS etc.)
- \* All Forms, Schedules, and Labels you have received from Revenue Canada.
- \* Receipts for any expenses such as medical, moving, tuition, sporting activities. Printouts from your pharmacist are available for those with numerous prescriptions.

Changes to Alberta Government Payments - Albertans who rely on the Assured Income for the

Severely Handicapped (AISH) and Income Support programs will get their payments four business days before the first of the month. Here are the next few payment dates: *March* - Feb-26/April - March-25

# SUPPORTING AND GROWING ALBERTA'S SKILLED TRADES

February 23, 2024 Alberta News

If passed, Budget 2024 will create 3,200 additional apprenticeship seats across the province to support industry demand for skilled workers and Alberta's economic growth.

Alberta's economy is rapidly growing and diversifying. More jobs continue to be created in the province, although some industries are still facing labour shortages. To create more opportunities for students and ensure students have the skills to meet labour market demands and begin good-paying careers, apprenticeship seats are needed to support students entering the skilled trades.

Through Budget 2024, Alberta's government would invest an additional \$24 million per year over the next three years to create 3,200 apprenticeship seats at 11 post-secondary institutions across the province. The new investment would bring the total funding through the Apprenticeship Learning Grant for the 2024-25 academic year to \$78 million.

"When students join the skilled trades, they are entering well-paying jobs and starting a bright future in our province. Investing in apprenticeship education will supply Albertans with in-demand skills, nurture homegrown talent and support our labour market with world-class skilled tradespeople who keep our economy moving." Rajan Sawhney, Minister of Advanced Education

Apprenticeship education is an affordable postsecondary option for learners. In addition to the job opportunities available upon completion, sponsored apprentices are employed and paid wages for more than 75 per cent of their program.

The Apprenticeship Learning Grant provides supplemental funding to support the delivery of apprenticeship classroom seats. The funding is intended to address demand throughout the academic year. In 2023-24, the government provided \$54 million to 11 public post-secondary institutions through the grant.

The Canadian Apprenticeship Forum estimates that Canada will face a gap of more than 60,000 registered apprentices by 2025.

Currently there are about 61,000 registered apprentices in Alberta, a 28 per cent increase over the number of apprentices who progressed through Alberta's system last year. In the last 12 months, more than 24,000 apprentices were registered. This increase in registration has led to a demand for more apprenticeship seats.

#### **Quick facts**

Eleven post-secondary institutions deliver apprenticeship training in Alberta.

- The Apprenticeship Learning Grant supports specific apprenticeship education programs, based on demand.
- All 11 post-secondary institutions offering apprentice education programs receive a portion of the Apprenticeship Learning Grant for the academic year.
- Additional Apprenticeship Learning Grant funds are held in reserve to respond to seat demands throughout the year.

# Village of Breton Bylaw 24-02 Off Highway Vehicle Bylaw

The Village of Breton motioned to update the Off Highway Vehicle Bylaw at the February 21, 2024 Special Council Meeting. The Bylaw in its entirety is on the village web page at <a href="https://www.breton.ca">www.breton.ca</a>. Portions of the bylaw read as.

### Section 3. Definitions

- 3. i) "OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE" means any motorized mode of transportation built for cross-country travel on land, water, snow, ice or marsh or swamp land or on other natural terrain and, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, includes, when specifically designed for such travel:
  - (i) 4-wheel drive vehicles
  - (ii) low pressure tire vehicles
  - (iii) motorcycles and related 2 -wheel vehicles
  - (iv) amphibious machines
  - (v) all-terrain vehicles
  - (vi) miniature motor vehicles
  - (vii) snow vehicles, minibikes
- 3. j) "OPERATOR" means a person who drives or is in actual physical control of the off-highway vehicle and who is the holder of a valid subsisting operator's license:
- k) "OPERATOR'S LICENCE" OR "DRIVER'S LICENCE" means an operator's license or a driver's license that is issued under the Act and includes a document or information and other data contained in an electronic form that is recognized under the Act as an operator's license or a driver's license.

### Section 4. Rules for the Operation of Vehicles

- 4.2 All off-highway vehicles travelling on the roadway shall be equipped with at least one (1) taillight that must be alit always.
- 4.8 No person shall operate an off-highway vehicle unless the off-highway vehicle is equipped with an exhaust muffler that complies with the following:
- a) An exhaust muffler must cool and expel the exhaust gases from the engine without excessive noise and without producing flames or sparks.
- 4.12 Operators of off-highway vehicles on VILLAGE of Breton roadways shall travel on the extreme right-hand portion of the travelling surface of the road or ditch and shall travel single file always.

Section 5. Licensing, Registration, and Insurance

- 5.1 No person shall drive an Off-Highway Vehicle on any portion of a highway within the municipal boundaries of the VILLAGE unless:
- a) They are a holder of a valid operator's license or learner's permit and are abiding by the rules of that license or permit as the provisions of the Act.
  - 5.3 No person under the age of fourteen (14) years shall operate an Off-Highway Vehicle in a public place.

### Section 6. Designated Areas & Speed

6.3 Notwithstanding Subsection 9.3, no person may operate an off-highway vehicle at a speed in excess of twenty (20) kilometers per hour on any portion of the VILLAGE of Breton where such vehicles are permitted to operate.

### **Notice of Public Hearing**

Bylaw No. 24-02 Proposed Amendment to Off Highway Vehicle Bylaw No. 05-01
