BRETON SCHOOL MODERNIZATION PLAN PUT ON HOLD

Wild Rose School Division News March 12, 2024

With the announcement of the latest budget and the Approved School Capital Projects, the modernization of Breton High School was noticeably absent from the list. This project was approved for design funding in the 2023

budget. Planning has been underway to modernize Breton High School to fit all Breton students (K-12) and to demolish Breton Elementary. This includes the preparation of construction tender documents, including drawings and specifications.

"While we are disappointed that the Breton project was not approved for construction funding, we are hopeful that with all of the work and planning that has already occurred, this will just be a temporary pause and that it will be approved in the 2025 budget," stated Board Chair, Daryl Scott.

"It is unfortunate that after a year's work on design plans, the Breton community is left wondering when or if this will happen," said WRSD Superintendent, Brad Volkman. "Regardless, the staff of Breton Elementary and Breton High School remain committed to providing powerful learning environments for our students."

The plan to bus Breton High students to Warburg for the next school year will not be happening. There will be no need to vacate the building as there will be no construction occurring.

Art Burrows Lumber Co.

Today's post is a great photo from the Breton Museum collection. It's a picture from the Art Burrows Lumber Co. of Norbuck, Ab. circa 1940's. The photo was taken by W.F. Montgomery of Chase BC. and came to the Museum via a donation from Roy Wold. Burrows Lumber moved their mill from the Buck Lake area to Norbuck, in 1932, where they operated until 1944, when they relocated their mill to Aggie, near High Prairie, AB.

Notice the log jammer frame in the background, used to load the logs on the truck. also notice the set of sleigh runners attached to the back of the truck to extend the flat deck to accommodate the logs. Quite a load for the size of the truck!

You need to file your income tax each year, even if you have no income to report. By doing this you may receive benefits that you did not know you were eligible for. Also, in the event of the death of your spouse, benefits can easily be transferred to you, if you have filled a return for the last calendar year. The focus of the Community Volunteer Tax Program is to assist those individuals who have limited income. This includes seniors, families, and students. If your income is approximately in one of the following categories, you may gualify for assistance. 1 person - \$35,000 / Couple - \$45,000 / Family \$52,500

We are not able to complete returns with income from the following sources: *Capital Gains or Losses, Farming Income, Rental Income, Self-Employment, Interest exceeding* \$1,000, Bankruptcies, Deceased Persons

This service is FREE to those who qualify. If you require this service, please gather your information, and bring it to the Village of Breton office Monday to Thursday between 8:30 - 4pm. Clients will be notified when your return is completed. The program will run from March 1 – April 30, 2024

OBITUARY SCAMS: A Way to Say Goodbye or Commit Fraud?

Our loved ones lived full lives before their passing, and we want to share that life, whether it was their parents' names, where they worked for 40 years or their beloved pet. While obituaries are a way to send off our loved ones and inform our communities of a loss, criminals also use the information in these articles to commit fraud.

Alberta Provincial Crime Watch Association and our crime prevention partners want to help you give your friends and family a proper send-off that will also keep their information and you safe from scammers.

What Are Obituary Scams?

Obituary scams involve exploiting details from obituaries to target grieving families or friends. Scammers typically take facts from public obituaries, such as the names and relationships of the deceased and birthdates, and then form their scam. Scammers may contact individuals through email, phone calls, or even in person, claiming to have a connection to the deceased and fabricating urgent situations that require financial assistance. This is a growing concern, especially with obituaries moving online. It's no longer the criminal down the street that you have to worry about seeing an obituary in the local newspaper; scam artists worldwide have access to this information online.

These scams can also include fake charity requests, false debt collection, or phishing attempts.

It's important to exercise caution and verify any unexpected requests or communications, especially during vulnerable times such as mourning a loss.

Criminals can also commit fraud by using the deceased information. If they can find personal details about the deceased, they can use the information to commit identity fraud, such as opening credit cards, renting vehicles or residences, or opening telephone accounts.

Gathering Information from Obituaries

To find a target, scammers crawl obituaries listed in local newspapers, funeral homes, and other online platforms. Information from obituaries can be used to create accounts and answer security questions. While we want to share everything that made our loved ones great, you could put your family and friends in a serious situation.

Here is a list of information that scammers can use that is commonly found in obituaries.

- Full legal name - Nickname - Birthdate and death date -Birthplace - Place of residence at death - Name of significant other - Full names of parents and siblings -Date and time of funeral services - Names of pallbearers - Name of funeral home and cemetery - Childhood & Education - Children & Grandchildren - Employment -Extra-curricular activities - Retirement - Home life -Special pets

Prevention and Protection

When writing an obituary, you should exercise caution and avoid providing unnecessary personal details. Don't include the both deceased's day and month of birth, employment history, or home address. You should also be careful about including the information mentioned above. Scammers can use this information to impersonate the deceased and commit fraud. This way, you can significantly reduce the risk of falling victim to obituary scams.

Reporting Suspicious Activity

In the digital age, you must be vigilant and report any suspicious activity related to your loved ones. If you come across a potentially fraudulent obituary or notice unauthorized use of personal information, report it to local law enforcement or online platforms hosting the obituary. Timely reporting can help authorities act quickly to investigate and prevent further damage.

Additional Measures for Executors

If you are acting as an executor for an estate, take these extra steps to secure the deceased's information:

- Alert credit bureaus to place a flag on the deceased's profile as soon as possible.
- Alert the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) and Service Canada so they can place a flag on the deceased's social insurance number and CRA account.
- Inform the deceased's financial institutions and the utility providers, including cell phone providers.
- Monitor their bank and utility account activity until they are closed.

While we try to honour and remember our loved ones, we share their lives through obituaries, which have evolved from local newspapers to digital platforms. However, criminals exploit the personal details we willingly provide in these tributes, putting us at risk of fraud.

The Alberta Provincial Crime Watch Association and our crime prevention partners want to ensure that your friends and family are not targeted by scammers. Obituary scams have become a global concern as criminals gather information from online obituaries to impersonate family members or steal the identity of the deceased to open accounts or steal money.

Together, we can help these tributes remain sincere and the memories of our loved ones are honoured without having to worry about fraud.

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

The following is an analysis (mine) of the cost to send 5 councillors (including the Reeve) (of which only two are on the Ag Service Board), 2 members at large, and 2 staff to an Agricultural Service Board Conference in Lethbridge January 22 to 24 this year.

Information is taken from council honorarium claim forms as well as the conference website.

Limitations: The total cost for councillors as submitted is very close to \$15,000 or within dollars of \$3,000 per councillor. Since only 2 submitted hotel fees, costs for the other 3 are assumed. Also, it can be assumed that the 2 members at large cost about \$3,000 each as well, but staff cost can only be guessed. (There were some costs, but accuracy is sacrificed.) In addition, Conference registration fees appear to be around a total of \$7,000 according to the conference website.

Conclusion: It could be easily assumed that this conference cost the taxpayers of Brazeau at least \$25,000. The question is, what do we get in return?

Considerations/questions:

--Why do we pay for expenses (meals) without receipts? --Why do we pay the Reeve, reeve rates, when there is no relationship to his designation to this conference.

--Why were so many allowed to attend? Can the councillors not write detailed reports for others' edification? If not, send someone who can.

Apparently, it was revealed (learned at this conference) that drones cannot be used to spot spray. This same information could be had online. (an expensive learning?) It is my information, first, that drone spraying with pesticides is illegal in Canada and secondly, that one must have an applicator's license to spray. This raises the question as to why the county would be interested, given the liability associated with it.

Summary: Since at least 3 councillors are NOT on the ASB, why did they go? a paid holiday?

Since it is taxpayer dollars that pay for this exercise, are we not entitled to know/have access to anything/everything presented? How does it help us taxpayers to send 9 people to one conference?

Perhaps a final question could be: Just how does the expended \$25,000 for this conference help us farmers improve our farming since none of the expertise that was shared at the conference has been made available to the public.


