Federal-provincial Child Care Agreement

The Alberta Government has successfully negotiated an agreement with the federal government that will support the expansion of accessible, affordable and high-quality child care that gives families the choice they need. This made-in-Alberta plan also reduces fees for parents of 0 to kindergarten-aged children by an average of half next year, and provides an average of \$10 per day child care by 2026.

Through the agreement, \$3.8 billion will be invested in child care for children aged 0 to Kindergarten over the next 5 years:

\$2.865 billion to lower child care fees for Alberta parents

\$240.64 million to increase the number of child care spaces

\$202.6 million to develop and fund child care options to support vulnerable and diverse populations, as well as children with extra needs

\$306.16 million to support licensed programs and certified educators in offering high-quality support for families in their communities

What this means for parents.

Parents will see reduced fees starting in early 2022 and for the next 2 years. While additional information will be shared soon, families can expect to pay an average of:

\$10 per day if they earn up to \$119,999

\$11 to \$17 per day if they earn between \$120,000 and \$179,999

\$22.19 per day if they earn \$180,000 and above

For example, a family earning \$120,000 with an infant attending a licensed facility-based centre full-time currently pays on average \$1172 per month. By year 2022, this family can expect to pay an average of \$284 per month.

What you can do, if you are being bullied, there are 4 ways you can take action:

Tell someone you trust. There are people who can help. You do not have to deal with this alone.

- Talk to someone you trust, such as the Bullying Helpline or a trusted friend, teacher, coach, co-worker or human resource person.
- You may need to contact the police if the bullying is severe and includes threats or physical violence.

Stay safe - Do not fight back – it can make the problem worse.

- Be assertive and stand up for yourself by telling the person to stop.
- Try to remain calm and leave the area.
- Find support in your community
- Contact the Bullying Helpline to find supports.
- Spend time with friends, family or colleagues who support you.

Know your rights. You have the right to feel safe. Schools, workplaces and other organizations have a legal responsibility to protect you from bullying.

- Check the bullying prevention policies and codes of conduct for your school, workplace, sports team and other community organizations.
- Learn about the laws to protect you from bullying.

Stay safe online. Follow these tips to protect yourself from cyberbullying:

- Report bullying and abusive behaviours to the place where it is happening (like Instagram or Facebook) and tell someone you trust.
- Save texts, voicemails, emails and

- screenshots to prove what happened.
- Do not share your passwords with anyone and change them immediately if you suspect someone knows them.
- Block the people who are bullying you

Breton RCMP investigate fatal collision on Highway 22

On Nov. 9, 2021 at approximately 10:16 p.m., Breton RCMP with the assistance of Thorsby RCMP and Emergency Medical Services, responded to a serious two vehicle collision on Highway 22 approximately one kilometre south of the intersection of Highway 616 in Brazeau County.

Preliminary investigation revealed that a car was travelling northbound on Highway 22 when it crossed into the southbound lane and struck a southbound SUV.

The driver of the car, a 42-year-old female from Rimbey, Alta. was pronounced deceased on scene.

The driver of the SUV, a 55-year-old female from Alder Flats, Alta. was transported by STARS air ambulance to a local area hospital with serious injuries.

Traffic was re-routed for a period of time while the RCMP Collision Analyst attended the scene.

Breton RCMP with the assistance of the RCMP Collision Analyst continue to investigate the cause of the collision.

No further updates are anticipated and the name of the deceased will not be released.



I thought I was going to die. My chest felt heavy and tight with sharp pains piercing through it. Then I started to feel overwhelmed and had difficulty breathing. I could hardly stand as the dizziness and shaking took over my body and I had no idea what was happening. Little did I know that I was experiencing what would be my first anxiety (panic) attack. That was almost 10 years ago. In those 10 years I was admitted into EMERG 4 times thinking I was having a heart attack. My last time was 15 months ago.

Anxiety is real.

We have all experienced anxiety at some level. A new job, moving, having a baby, or going on a date can all cause one to feel anxious and nervous, which in fact is a normal experience. But for some, anxiety can be debilitating. Physical symptoms caused by an anxiety disorder can feel like you are having a heart attack. Anxiety can be caused by many circumstances in your life such as stress from school, work, financial worries, a medical concern, emotional trauma, a difficult personal relationship, or the turmoil from a pandemic. Then we have the emotional symptoms of anxiety which can include the intense feeling of losing control, or like your mind is going crazy or that you feel like every breath you take is your last breath and you feel like you are dying.

We are living in complicated and challenging times. CTV reported the number of individuals experiencing high levels of anxiety quadrupled in the first month that COVID-19 was reported. Depression and anxiety are at an all time high as many struggle through their days. Every one of us can be impacted by anxiety including children.

I am sharing this today to encourage you that you are not alone and do not need to go through these feelings of losing control and feeling hopeless on your own. We have an amazing God who cares for us and knows what we need and when we need it. He does not leave us or forsake us; Hope comes from Him. and He loves us.

What you are feeling is real and there are individuals who are trained in this area who can walk along side you. Reach out to them.

You are not alone. You are loved.

For out of His infinite riches in Jesus, He giveth and giveth and giveth again.


When we have exhausted our store of endurance, When our strength has failed ere the day is half done, When we reach the end of our hoarded resources, Our Father's full giving is only begun.

[22] But when the young man heard that saying, he went away sorrowful: for he had great possessions. [24] And again I say unto you, It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle, than for a rich man to enter into the kingdom of God. [25] When his disciples heard it, they were exceedingly amazed, saying, Who then can be saved? [26] But Jesus beheld them, and said unto them, With men this is impossible; but with God all things are possible. [27] Then answered Peter and said unto him, Behold, we have forsaken all, and followed thee; what shall we have therefore? [28] And Jesus said unto them, Verily I say unto you, That ye which have followed me, in the regeneration when the Son of man shall sit in the throne of his glory, ye also shall sit upon twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel. [29] And every one that hath forsaken houses, or brethren, or sisters, or father, or mother, or wife, or children, or lands, for my name's sake, shall receive an hundredfold, and shall inherit everlasting life. [30] But many that are first shall be last; and the last shall be first.

John 10:25-30 KJV Jesus answered them, I told you, and ye believed not: the works that I do in my Father's name, they bear witness of me. [26] But ye believe not, because ye are not of my sheep, as I said unto you. [27] My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me: [28] And I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand. [29] My Father, which gave them me, is greater than all; and no man is able to pluck them out of my Father's hand. [30] I and my Father are one.

It is essential to pray, and to repent of our sin, and ask for salvation, but that is just the beginning of a new life dedicated to the Lord Jesus Christ. Praying one prayer is no guarantee of salvation and everlasting life. We must follow him by obeying His commandments and doing what he told us to do.
