MECCS NEW OUTDOOR CULTURE CLASSSROOM

On December 15, 2021 was the official grand opening of Mother Earth's Children's Charter Schools camp/outdoor classroom. This beautiful property and school located on the shores of the North Saskatchewan river near Genesee is Canada's only Indigenous Charter School.

Official Opening Story by MECCS superintendent Ed Wittchen:

"In late August we broke ground on our vision to have an all weather culture camp/outdoor classroom. Trees and rocks were removed, the ground was leveled for pads for a fire pit, a lean to shelter and a tipi.

The site clearing was mostly done by Dale LeMoignan- Maintenance Director, Maxine Hildebrandt- teacher and her husband Mark Hildebrandt (many after school and weekend hours). Construction of the concrete pads and building the lean to shelter was done by ZAPA Construction (Zach and Brandon Paul). The final stage was getting the tipi from Lethbridge Custom Canvas and having Mark and Maxine Hildebrandt put it up.

For the official opening of this welcome addition to our facilities we were able to demonstrate the success of the vision of having an all weather facility as it was held in minus 24 temperatures. Despite the cold, participants were kept comfortable by the 4 fire pits and the straw bales to sit on. As well we are fortunate to have a heated, lighted all weather washroom supplied by Kopala Towers which makes a big difference in comfort for our students staff and guests when it gets cold like this.

The MC for the ceremony Erin Danforth –MECCS Principal introduced our Stoney Elder Theresa Bird to deliver an opening prayer. That was followed by

a special drum song from Arnold Alexis. Maxine Hildebrandt then performed the dedication of the facility name- OSKI Kisikau ENA Mahkochih which is a combination of Cree and Stoney words roughly translating to New Day for Mother Earth.

Minister of Indigenous Relations Hon. Rick Wilson represented the Alberta government and provided his remarks as well as best wishes from Premier Jason Kenney and Minister of Education- Hon. Adriana LaGrange. Mother Earth's Board Chair Dale Friedel then thanked the staff for their efforts in creating this wonderful space for the students of the school.



CANADA EMERGENCY BUSINESS ACCOUNT LOAN FORGIVENESS REPAYMENT DEADLINE EXTENDED

OTTAWA: Gerald Soroka Member of Parliament for Yellowhead wishes to advise that the - Canada Emergency Business Account (CEBA) Loan Forgiveness Repayment Deadline has been extended. The repayment deadline for CEBA loans to qualify for partial loan forgiveness is being extended from December 31, 2022, to December 31, 2023, for all eligible borrowers in good standing.

This extension will support short-term economic recovery and offer greater repayment flexibility to small businesses and not-for-profit organizations, many of which are facing continued challenges due to the pandemic. Repayment on or before the new deadline of December 31, 2023, will result in loan forgiveness of up to a third of the value of the loans (meaning up to \$20,000).

Outstanding loans would subsequently convert to two-year term loans with interest of 5 per cent per annum commencing on January 1, 2024, with the loans fully due by December 31, 2025.

The repayment deadline to qualify for partial forgiveness for CEBA-equivalent lending through the Regional Relief and Recovery Fund is also extended to December 31, 2023.

MLA REPORT

from The Office of MLA Mark Smith, Member of the Legislative Assembly for Drayton Valley - Devon

While 2021 has been a challenging year for many Albertans, there is a lot worth celebrating from this past year.

Alberta is leading Canada's economic comeback. We replaced approximately 340,000 jobs that were lost due to the pandemic, and we added approximately 105,000 new jobs that will help Albertans pay their bills and mortgages. At 64 per cent, Alberta now has the highest employment rate in the nation.

2021 saw the return of high oil prices. Our province is now producing more oil than ever before in our history. According to a recent forecast from the Canadian Association of Energy Contractors, Alberta will see over 6,000 new wells drilled in 2022 – a 26 per cent increase from 2021.

In 2021, we continued our focus on diversification, with burgeoning industries like technology having banner years in our province. Alberta is now home to more than 3,000 technology companies, a 233 per cent increase since 2012. 2021 also saw Amazon Web Services recently announce that it's building a data hub in Calgary. This \$4.3 billion investment will create 1,000 new jobs and marks the largest technology sector investment in Alberta history.

Our film and television industry also had a record year in our province, with more than 50 major productions underway, supporting over 9,000 jobs. These projects include HBO's The Last of Us, the largest production in Canadian history. With Alberta being featured in movies like Ghostbusters: Afterlife, it's easy to understand why our province is fast becoming the new "Hollywood North."

2021 saw historic industry investments in renewables. Air Products is investing \$1.3 billion to build a net-zero hydrogen energy complex near Edmonton and Dow Chemical is investing up to \$10 billion to build the world's first net-zero carbon emissions ethylene and derivatives complex near Fort Saskatchewan, marking the biggest capital investment in the province in 15 years. This is just a couple of the exciting investments happening in Alberta that will create thousands of new jobs for our

workers.

We know the pandemic has been hard on many Albertans, so we made historic investments to support those struggling with addiction. In 2021, we doubled down on addiction treatment announcing that the government will fund more than 8,000 addiction treatment spaces annually, doubling the original commitment made in 2019 and firmly establishing Alberta as a national leader in treating addiction.

In 2021, we fought for and delivered a made-in-Alberta childcare plan that protects Alberta's mixed-market system. This new plan will make childcare more affordable for families with kids aged zero to kindergarten by reducing fees by an average of half in early 2022 and by 2026, all Alberta families will pay an average of \$10 per-day for childcare. And unlike the NDP's proposed plan, we delivered a plan that includes private operators who make-up most of our system.

In 2021, we were proud to deliver on a promise to give Albertans a say on Canada's broken equalization system and watched as over 60 per cent of voters voted in favour of reform. We will continue to update you as we proceed to our next steps of fighting for a fair deal for Alberta within our confederation.

2021 also saw what economist Trevor Tombe called "the largest improvement in provincial finances ever recorded." The deficit for 2021-22 is now forecast at \$5.8 billion. This is \$12.4 billion lower than the budget estimate and \$1.9 billion lower than the first quarter fiscal update. Total revenue in 2021-22, meanwhile, is forecast at \$57.9 billion, \$14.2 billion higher than the budget estimate and \$2.9 billion higher than the first quarter fiscal update. In 2022, we will remain focused on prudent fiscal management to ensure our province's books are healthy.

Alberta's Recovery Plan is working, and Albertans are going back to work. In 2022, our United Conservative government will remain relentless in delivering jobs and investment for Alberta families and businesses. Truly, our best days are still to come.

The Alberta RCMP Major Crimes Unit were seeking to locate this individual and seeking the public's assistance but in a later update, Jesse Cardinal had been located. The extent of his involvement is unknown.

Additional information regarding the deceased is not available at this time pending notification of next of kin.

Alberta RCMP Major Crimes continue to investigate this suspicious death.

Are you his Disciple?

If we have made Jesus our Lord, our life should be very different than it was before. If we believe in Jesus as Lord, we will:

- 1. Love God with all our heart and love other people.
- 2. Dedicate the rest of our life to following Him as our Lord
- 3. Be His disciple, and allow Him to teach us and lead us into all truth
- 4. Fellowship with Him by reading His word, meditating on His word, talking to Him, listening for a response, and by praising and worshipping Him.
- 5. Study His word, commands, and actions so that we will know what He wants us to do.
- 6. Obey His word, and commandments.
- 7. Do the works that He did and greater
- 8. Make disciples by teaching others to follow Jesus, and helping them along the way
- 9. Trust Him to do what He said He would do; He is not a liar.
- 10. Fear, reverence, honour, and respect Him

In Previous articles I wrote about #1, 2 and 5. It is time now to have a look at #3. If Jesus really is our Lord and we claim to be a Christian, we will be His disciple and allow Him to teach us and lead us into all truth. Jesus said, "And He who does not take his cross and follow after Me is not worthy of Me" (Modern English Version Matt. 10:38). The Greek word that follow is translated from means to follow, to join one as a disciple. DUE TO RISING DEMAND FOR PCR TESTS, ALBERTA IS CHANGING THE ELIGIBILITY FOR THESE TESTS TO FOCUS ON THOSE WHO MOST NEED THEM.

Daily PCR testing volumes are beginning to exceed system capacity. Wait times for booking a PCR test are now approaching four days and turnaround time for providing results to patients is approaching 48 hours. To ensure that patient care decisions are supported by timely diagnostic information, PCR testing eligibility will now be focused on those who have clinical risk factors for severe outcomes and those who live and work in high-risk settings.

"Like other provinces, Alberta's testing resources have increasingly become stretched, and with the rising number of COVID cases due to Omicron, we now need to focus this testing capacity strategically to those most at risk of serious illness from COVID." Jason Copping, Minister of Health

"While we have been used to managing COVID through widespread PCR testing, that approach is not possible with the Omicron variant. At this time, most people who have mild symptoms don't need a PCR test. For those without risk factors such as immunosuppression, they should self-isolate and manage their symptoms at home, using a rapid test if they have one." Dr. Deena Hinshaw, chief medical officer of health

Alberta Health Services has updated the online COVID-19 assessment tool to help Albertans determine whether they need a PCR test, what type of care to seek based on their symptoms and how to take care of symptoms at home with appropriate support.

Health Link 811 continues to experience high daily call volumes. It is recommended Albertans use the online COVID-19 assessment tool to check their symptoms or the symptoms of someone they may be caring for before they call Health Link.

At this time, the assessment tool has been updated to reflect new PCR testing criteria for adults. The tool will be updated later this week for children and youth.

Those with mild illness should not visit emergency departments seeking a test, as tests in those settings are only used when a test is needed for patient care. If Albertans are unsure whether they need to talk to a doctor about their illness, they can also use the Alberta Medical Association tool to determine what they should do. Most people with mild illness do not need a test or a conversation with their doctor.

Employers and organizations should not require individuals with mild symptoms to have a PCR test to be eligible for sick time off work. It is critical to support those who are sick to stay home with no testing requirements at this time of high transmission.

Eligibility criteria

Effective immediately, PCR tests will be available only for the following individuals:

- Continuing care residents and health-care workers and staff in acute and continuing care settings, shelters and correctional facilities who meet one or more of the following criteria:
 - need confirmation of a positive rapid test on screening
 - have COVID-19 symptoms
 - are part of an outbreak investigation where public health has requested lab-based PCR testing
- Symptomatic household members of a person who works in continuing care or acute care.
- Emergency department or hospital patients of all ages who meet one or more of the following criteria:
- inpatients who develop new COVID-19 symptoms while in hospital
- patients being admitted for symptoms consistent with COVID-19
- patients in the emergency department with respiratory illness where a test will change treatment plans
- Symptomatic community patients who would be eligible for Sotrovimab (monoclonal antibody) treatment if positive:
 - Those who are not immunized and are:
 - age 55 and over
 - 18 years and over with one of the following health conditions: diabetes, obesity, chronic kidney disease, congestive heart failure, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease or moderate to severe asthma
 - children aged 12 to 17, with referral by a pediatric I.D. specialist
 - pregnant
 - Those who are immunosuppressed (transplant, active cancer or systemic immune treatment), regardless if immunized or not.
- People from isolated and remote First Nation, Inuit and Métis communities, and individuals travelling to these communities for work.
- Asymptomatic continuing care residents returning/readmitted from other health-care settings.
- Pediatric and adult asymptomatic transplant donors and recipients, prior to transplant.
- Pediatric and adult oncology patients, prior to commencing chemotherapy.
- Newborns born to COVID-19-positive parents.
- -Returning international travellers who become symptomatic within 14 days after their arrival.


