



Town of Thorsby COUNCIL NOTES

January 18, 2022

Delegation - Mr. Macrae Water Billing and Administrative Request for Decision

On March 4, 2021 Public Works turned off the water at 4916 Hankin Street due to a frozen water line and cracked toilet. This was brought to the Town of Thorsby's attention after a month end reading was showing a much higher than normal water consumption. This incident resulted in a \$12,080.32 water bill with a total of 1932.87 cubes of water consumed.

Robert Macrae brought up concerns about the probability of that amount of water going through the lines in such a short amount of time and the exorbitant cost incurred. Macrae asked for suggestions to get an accurate test for water flow. Public Works Manager Andrew Kearley told Macrae that the Town had the meter in question tested and the results were that the meter was recording flow 7.6% under the flow rate. An approved engineer paid for by Mr. Macrae would be the only option to get an accurate assessment on the water flow and contributing factors said Interim CAO Donna Tona.

Macrae also told Council that he would like the water turned back on as soon as possible because he currently has a tenant with a viable new business and this business needs water. Macrae also told Council that with the exception of this bill, his utility bills are paid up to date.

Councillors agreed that they had to base decisions on facts and the tested meter recorded the water consumption accurately and in the business owners favor. Council asked Interim CAO Donna Tona to work with Mr. Macrae if he decides to proceed with hiring an engineer. In the meantime, the water bylaw will be brought to the next meeting for consideration and a decision to turn on the water for the tenant will be made at that time.

Request for Grant Funding - Leduc & District Food Bank

Executive Director Gert Reynar and Treasurer Tony Robinson from the Leduc & District Food Bank met with Council over a conference call. They reported that the Food Bank services the seven municipalities in Leduc County and relies on donations, grants and volunteers. The food bank is also helping families be more independent through the Kitchen Learning Centre and Life Skills Learning Centre. The School Snack attack program also offers nutritious snacks to the 40 schools within the system including Thorsby. Before Covid-19 the Food Bank was working with the Thorsby Seniors Centre offering their kitchen learning programs for clients working with both Thorsby FCSS and Leduc County FCSS Staff. They hope to resume this program in the future.

In 2021 the Food Bank served 34 families in the town of Thorsby and distributed 48 hampers throughout the year (over 10,000 lbs & approx value of almost \$27,000) in comparison to 2020 where they served 24 Town of Thorsby families and distributed 49 hampers (almost 11,000lbs & approx value of \$28,500). The Food Bank is requesting a \$500 grant from the Town of Thorsby for 2022.

Gert also mentioned that the Food Bank wants to meet the needs of Thorsby but in the past year or more it has been challenging with little to no communication from the Town of Thorsby. The Food banks goal is to connect with communities and this is typically done through FCSS. Gert is hoping to connect again with FCSS in our community to help serve Thorsby. Councillor Rasch was very concerned about the lack of communication from the Town and Thorsby's FCSS over the past year and wondered if our residents have been getting the support they need.

Council asked Interim CAO Tona to confirm that their \$500 contribution was submitted in 2021 and to bring the \$500 request to the next 2022 budget meeting.

Town of Thorsby - COUNCIL NOTES - continued CFO Report

Interim CFO Cindy Van Leest reported that the Great Plains accounting program has been updated and they are ready to begin the conversion however they are looking for a new consultant to assist as the current consultant withdrew his services due to the amount of work involved and the state of the office and financial information (previously reported in the January 7 issue of the Target)

Payroll is now in line with the Collective Agreement with the exception of standby/callout pay that had previously been withdrawn from Public Works. Back pay will be provided. The union is appreciative of the communication with the new administration as they get back on track.

Payables are being processed and will be caught up by the end of the week. Contacting suppliers to get copies of missing invoices is making this process time consuming.

Budget templates will go out by the end of the month to all departments because it is clear that they are starting from scratch building the 2022 budget. Each department will be responsible for compiling and managing their budget throughout the year so monthly reporting to departments will become standard practice.

It was also reported that the cost of the Auditors that was previously requested is still the same as it was last year at \$11,000/year.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING LEDUC TO ADOPT AN ALTERNATE **COUNTY ADVERTISING BYLAW**

Tuesday, Feb. 8 at 1:15 p.m.

Leduc County is proposing to adopt a bylaw establishing an alternate method for communicating information required under section 606 of the Municipal Government Act (MGA).

Under section 606 of the MGA, a council must give notice of certain bylaws, resolutions, meetings, public hearings or other things by advertising in a newspaper or other publication circulating in the area, mailing or delivering a notice to every residence in the affected area, or by another method provided for in a bylaw under section 606(1).

Section 606(1) stipulates that a council may, by bylaw, provide for one or more methods, which may include electronic means, to communicate proposed bylaws, resolutions, meetings, public hearings and other things referred to in section 606.

Leduc County is proposing the information be communicated electronically on the County's website, in addition to any other method deemed appropriate by administration.

A public hearing for the proposed bylaw will be held at the Leduc County regular council meeting on Tuesday, Feb. 8, 2022 at 1:15 p.m. Written or oral submissions can be made by any person who claims to be affected, or from any other person council agrees to hear from.

If you want to speak at the public hearing you must pre-register by Tuesday, Feb. 1, 2022 at 4:30 p.m. You can pre-register online through Leduc County's website or by contacting the legislative coordinator at 780-770-9259 or joyceg@leduc-county.com.

Extending the lifespan of public facilities and creating more spaces keeps people connected and engaged, making life better for all Albertans. These projects are an important part of Alberta's Recovery Plan to stimulate job creation and increase tourism and local revenue in communities across Alberta." Ron Orr, Minister of Culture

Community benefits of the approved projects will include:

- increasing access to tennis, skiing, skateboarding and biking parks
- creating community hubs with wraparound services for newcomer organizations and children support services
- supporting various shelters and food banks to expand their space
- supporting arts organizations to find a home

Projects must demonstrate a high level of community impact to the broader public and/or specific demographics. Projects are also prioritized for funding based on:

- direct and indirect economic benefits to the community, including job creation and the purchase of goods and services
- immediate or urgent need in the community project readiness
- project viability and organizational sustainability

The projects were approved through the Community Facility Enhancement Program Large and Small grant funding streams. The small grant stream provides up to \$125,000 per project, while the large grant stream provides funding of \$125,001 to \$1 million. Overall, 14 projects received grants through the CFEP Large funding stream, for a total of \$6.5 million, while 74 projects received a total of \$4.1 million through the CFEP Small stream.



Who is In Control?
