

Community Volunteer Income Tax Program – FREE INCOME TAX PREPARATION

For Low Income Persons, Families, seniors and students. Although this is something, that most of us would like to avoid thinking about and doing, I am afraid that this is unavoidable. You need to file your income tax each year, even if you have no income to report. By doing this you may receive benefits that you did not know you were eligible for. Also, in the event of the death of your spouse, benefits can easily be transferred to you, if you have filled a return for the last calendar year. If you did not file a tax return in 2021 you may not be receiving benefits from the government that you are eligible for. The focus of the Community Volunteer Tax Program is to assist those individuals who have limited income. This includes seniors, families and students. If your income was approximately in one of the following categories you may qualify for assistance.

1 person	30,000
2 person family	37,000
3 person family	40,500
4 person family	43,500

We are <u>not able</u> to complete returns with income from the following sources:

Capital Gains or Losses, Farming Income, Rental Income, Self-Employment, Interest exceeding \$1, 000, Bankruptcies, Deceased Persons

This service is FREE to those who qualify. If you require this service, please gather your information and bring it to the Village of Breton office Monday to Thursday between 8:30 – 4:00. Clients will be notified when your return is completed. The program will run from March 1 – April 30, 2022

We require the following information in order to complete your return:

- Personal Information (Social Insurance Number, Birth date, Marital Status, Address)
- Dependent's information spouse/ children's names, birthdates
- -All "T" Slips (T4's, T4A, OAS etc.)
- All Forms, Schedules, and Labels you have received from Revenue Canada.
- Receipts for any expenses such as medical, moving, tuition, sporting activities. Printouts from your pharmacist are available for those with numerous prescriptions.

Counselling Subsidies – Breton and Area FCSS is pleased to offer Counseling Subsidies.

A subsidy is available for individuals, couples and/or families who are struggling with common, everyday issues to access short-term preventative counselling services. The goal is to:

- Improve relationships with better communication and conflict resolution skills;
- Improve mood with anger management and emotional support;
- Enhance personal growth with creativity, spirituality, self-esteem, self-awareness, goal setting:
- Improve parenting skills by focusing on attachment:
- Reduce stress with life balance; and/or
- Learn new skills and behaviors

The cost of counselling can be a barrier for many individuals and families. This subsidy is available to those who do not have access to coverage through health benefits or employee benefits, such as an Employee Assistance Plan (EAP), and whose family income is less than \$75,000 per year. Fees are determined according to a sliding scale based on income and family size. Fees range from \$15 per session to \$50 per session. The maximum number of sessions available is seven for individuals and nine for couples or families.

Counselling services are provided through a partnership with Karunia Counselling from Leduc.

We know that in this current environment many may have additional stress and anxiety. We also know that transportation may be an added barrier. These sessions can be arranged to be in person in the Karunia offices in Leduc, over the phone in your own safe environment or virtually on your computer.

To apply for the subsidy services, application forms are available through the Breton FCSS Office at 4916 50th Avenue or by contacting them at fcss@breton.ca or calling 780-696-3636.

ALL APPLICATIONS ARE STRICTLY CONFIDENTIAL.

Breton and Area FCSS will be doing the intake of the applications. Counselling services are provided by Karunia Counselling by Registered Psychologists, Registered Provisional Psychologists, Canadian Certified Counsellors and Masters or PhD level student interns under the supervision of a qualified psychologist. All applications will be kept in strict confidence. This program is being made available through funding from the Government of Canada's Emergency Support Fund, the Drayton Valley Community Foundation and Breton and Area FCSS.



Message from Gerald Soroka, MP



Launch of the Canada Digital Adoption Program

OTTAWA: Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, wishes to advise the federal government's launch of the Canada Digital Adoption Program. The \$4-billion package of grants and loans is aimed at encouraging small and medium-sized businesses to expand their online presence. The program includes \$1.4 billion in grants and advisory services and up to \$2.6-billion in loans.

Applications for both grants and loans opened on March 3, 2022.

Smaller businesses with at least one employee can apply for a \$2,400 "micro-grant" to offset costs such as website development, search engine optimization, subscription fees for e-commerce platforms and social media advertising.

Alarger "Boost Your Business Technology" grant worth up to \$15,000 will be available to companies with revenue between \$500,000 and \$100-million and fewer than 500 employees. The grant can be spent in areas like new customer software, digital inventory management systems, network security improvements and robotics.

In addition to the grant programs, companies can apply for an interest-free loan of up to \$100,000 from the Business Development Bank of Canada for digital adoption spending.

The government has partnered with Magnet, a not-for-profit organization, to place up to 16,800 students and young Canadians with businesses. The program involves a wage subsidy to employers of up to \$7,300 to retain a post-secondary student or recent post-secondary graduate.



Soul Care

Last week our family began the journey of Lent. I recall early on in my childhood attending Ash Wednesday Mass. I was not necessarily aware of what exactly was happening, but I knew it was something of significance. I knew we were readying ourselves for something

important to come. I carry the memory of the smell of incense and the cross on my forehead etched out of ashes to this day. When I accepted Jesus as my Saviour and made my faith my own, I began this journey of understanding.

Over the years I came to understand that Lent is a time where we are being called to begin this spiritual preparation before Easter. This is a time where I decide to seek ways to fast, search my heart and repent and seek intentional ways to a much deeper intimacy with Jesus.

Fasting or giving up something helps me to set the time aside to reflect on the deep suffering, the sacrifice, and the life of Jesus. This usually takes place over 40 days, representing the 40 years of wandering in the desert by the Israelites and the temptation of Jesus after He spent 40 days fasting in the wilderness.

Reflecting on this, I sensed the desire that I yearn for more than 40 days set aside to spend strengthening and developing a deeper and closer relationship with Jesus.

It is like anything else in our lives, we make room for what is important in our lives. When we look at our calendars and schedules, what fills them up? What makes our day 'busy'? That is what becomes important and a priority in our lives.

I want my whole life to be in a posture of this constant drawing into a deep intimate relationship with Jesus. The time set aside to prepare our hearts for Good Friday and the anticipation of Easter Sunday is important, but I want to be reminded each day of the sacrifice Jesus made for me and what that means for my life.

Today for me, it is not so much about the giving up of something in order to create time for Jesus, but it is about being reminded to make Him the most important part of my life, so I don't need to create space, because it is already there.

What or who takes priority in your life?

PROVIDING RELIEF FOR FUEL AND UTILITY COSTS

Albertans will see lower fuel and utility bills through action to address rising costs.

Alberta's government will stop the collection of the provincial fuel tax to offer Albertans relief from current high fuel prices. Currently, Albertans pay 13 cents per litre in fuel tax. This change will come into effect April 1.

The federal carbon tax rate on gasoline is set to increase again on April 1, from just under nine cents per litre to just over 11 cents per litre.

"We've heard Albertans' concerns about the rising cost of living loud and clear. While the federal government is set to increase the carbon tax April 1, Alberta's government is taking the opposite approach and stepping up to offer relief. Stopping the provincial fuel tax puts money back in the pockets of Albertans when they need it most." Jason Kenney, Premier

Alberta's government will also provide \$150 electricity rebates to help Albertans pay for the high bills they faced this winter. More than one million homes, farms and businesses are expected to receive a \$50 monthly rebate for three months. These retroactive rebates will help defray the high costs that many families and businesses paid in recent months.

Alberta's government will work with utilities and regulators to determine exact details, including rebate timing. This includes working to have the rebates applied directly to consumers' bills.

This rebate will combine with the Natural Gas Rebate program announced in Budget 2022 to provide real relief for Albertans.

Collection of the fuel tax will be paused for:

gasoline – \$0.13 per litre diesel – \$0.13 per litre

marked gasoline and marked diesel – \$0.04

Because the GST also applies to provincial fuel taxes, the 13-cent reduction will also reduce the GST by 0.65 cents per litre, for total tax savings of about 13.6 cents per litre of gasoline and diesel.

The government will review the collection of the fuel tax on a quarterly basis and, if required, consider reinstating collection in stages, based on the average price of West Texas Intermediate (WTI) over a number of weeks. The government will not start to reinstate collection before July 1.

Alberta's fuel tax is reported and remitted by refiners and large wholesalers and included in the price Albertans pay at the pump. The government will provide information for stakeholders, including fuel retailers, on the fuel tax pause.



BUDGET 2022: BOOSTING CONTINUING CARE FUNDING

Almost \$3.7 billion, a 6.3 per cent increase over last year, will expand continuing care programs and services for seniors and vulnerable Albertans

Budget 2022 also earmarks \$204 million in capital funding over three years to modernize existing continuing care facilities across the province and develop new continuing care spaces for Indigenous Peoples and in priority communities.

In addition, 1,515 new continuing care spaces will open across Alberta in 2022-23, with details to follow in the coming months. Many of these new spaces are pursuant to a no-capital request for expression of interest and qualifications process managed by AHS.

Strengthening the continuing care system

The government is providing almost \$3.7 billion in operating funds across the continuing care system for professional health care and support services provided in the following settings:

- \$1.7 billion for community care, an increase of \$122 million or 7.6 per cent from 2021-22
- \$1.2 billion for continuing care, an increase of \$16 million or 1.3 per cent from 2021-22
- \$750 million for home care, an increase of \$81 million or 12.1 per cent from 2021-22

To meet the rising needs of an aging population, the government is investing capital funding to modernize and increase continuing care capacity across the province. This includes:

- \$204 million over three years to modernize existing continuing care facilities and create additional continuing care spaces in Alberta, primarily through the Continuing Care Capital Program. Grant calls will follow later this year.
- \$91 million over three years to complete the Bridgeland-Riverside Continuing Care Centre in Calgary that will accommodate about 200 residents and deliver day programs and services for Calgaryarea seniors. Construction of the new centre will finish in late 2023 or early 2024.
- \$142 million over two years for the Gene Zwozdesky Centre in Edmonton will add 145 new spaces and renovate 205 existing spaces to accommodate 350 continuing care residents with complex needs. Construction of the main building is anticipated to be complete in late 2022, with renovation of the Angus McGugan building to follow.

One of the government's priorities is to transform the province's continuing care system to be more responsive to the needs of Albertans now and in the future. Government announced recommendations from the Facility-Based Continuing Care review in spring 2021. These initiatives will be implemented in the months and years ahead. New streamlined continuing care legislation is anticipated this spring.

For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved. He who believes in Him is not condemned. But he who does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God. This is the verdict, that light has come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil. For everyone who does evil hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his deeds should be exposed. But he who does the truth comes to the light, that it may be revealed that his deeds have been done in God" (Modern English Version John 3:14-21). I speak in human terms because of the weakness of your flesh, for just as you have yielded your members as slaves to impurity and iniquity leading to more iniquity, even so now yield your members as slaves to righteousness unto holiness. For when you were the slaves of sin, you were free from righteousness. What fruit did you have then from the things of which you are now ashamed? The result of those things is death. But now, having been freed from sin and having become slaves of God, you have fruit unto holiness, and the end is eternal life. For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord (Rom. 6:19-23). Jesus said to him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me" (John 14:6). Our God is a good God. He wants what is best for us. Every human has sinned, and that is why God implemented His dept forgiveness program, through the sacrifice of His own Son. The door is open. Just accept His offer and come in.

According to the Municipal Government Act (MGA), Section 197 (1) "Councils and Council committees must conduct their meetings in public ...": and Section 198 states that "Everyone has a right to be present at Council meetings..."

On March 1, 2022, some county residents were denied access/attendance to a "workshop" for road plans held at the county building.

This raises some questions. At the meeting, no motions were allowed, nor was the meeting advertised as it should have been.

Since the public was not allowed and no motions could be made to go into public or in camera, is this meeting "duly constituted"?

If the Act was not followed (see the first paragraph), should Councillors be allowed per diems?

Why is this Council so afraid of public participation? One would think that if what they are doing is legitimate and in the best interests of the county, Council would want the residents to know what is going on and be part of the proceedings. This is not the first time that "workshops" have been held and public attendance denied.

The regular council meeting of Tuesday, February 2022, ended at 1.51 p.m. Since Councillors are paid for the full day, why wasn't the rest of the day used for the "road planning/workshop"?

How does the above connect to the Mission Statement as provided in most agendas: "Our residents first . . ." or the Values Statement of "Transparency, Efficiency and Pragmatism" or the Policy Statement of "clear expectations"?

If Councillors are not prepared to follow the ACT and their own policy, then perhaps they should consider resigning

The sooner Mr. McIvor (Minister of Municipal Affairs) gets involved, the better.

It seems the County Council does not seem to think you and I and the rest of the County residents are on a need-to-know basis.

During Arbitration, I wonder if Council put in a

After doing some research, I see that an excess of 100 million dollars were spent in 4 years! The County used to be prosperous and now we sit on the border of depending on loans to operate! I'm concerned, as all county residents should be.

I am hopeful that more of our county population pay attention, call your councillors, and ask why the transparency is lost. Why is the County broke? How can we believe the Reeve when he states the money was spent as an investment? Does not an investment have potential and expectation of creating more wealth? I'm sorry, but pavement areas that are fragmented, or within near distance to another pavement, does not look to me as an investment that will benefit the whole of the County or create a sizable increase in value, especially when we won't be able to afford maintaining the roads we have. Are we at the point we need new council? I think so! I do not blame the new councillors as they were not there when the spending was done they now are tasked with trying to help sort things out. With this situation folks, the next step is higher taxes and no more "freebies". The small tax breaks you've benefitted for the exchange of your vote, is coming to an end.
