

Volunteer Income Tax Program

The Community Volunteer Income Tax Program (CVITP) is now completing 2021 income taxes free-of-charge for people with low to modest income and a simple tax situation. This can include seniors, students, social assistance recipients and newcomers to Canada. The volunteer program does not complete returns for people who are deceased, bankrupt, or have business, farming or rental income. Assistance to complete past year tax returns is also available.

In order to be eligible to receive the **Guaranteed Income Supplement**, **GST Tax Credit**, **Canada Child Benefit**, **Canada Workers Benefit or the Climate Action Incentive**, your 2021 tax return must be filed. Income taxes are due by April 30.



PROVIDING MORE ACCESS TO SUICIDE PREVENTION **SUPPORTS**

Alberta's government is providing additional funding for community organizations supporting youth mental health and suicide prevention.

The new youth suicide prevention grant program is accepting applications from community organizations until April 8. Local youth-focused organizations know their communities well and do important work to support the mental health of Alberta's youth. These grants will build on the work they are already doing to support youth mental health.

"As young people continue to navigate the unique challenges caused by the pandemic, it is more important than ever that they feel heard, valued and supported. This funding will help youth community organizations continue to do the important work of supporting the mental health of at-risk young adults." Rebecca Schulz, Minister of Children's Services

Funding totalling \$3 million will focus on making sure young Albertans have access to effective suicide prevention supports and services, providing access to evidence-based training for those who support young people and reducing stigma through awareness campaigns so that youth and families are more likely to seek help related to suicide.

In 2019, the Government of Alberta launched Building Strength, Inspiring Hope: A Provincial Action Plan for Youth Suicide Prevention 2019-2024. This program will help advance the outcomes laid out in the plan and continue the work that has been achieved over the last two years.

Quick facts

Alberta's government is already taking steps to help children and youth navigate the past couple of vears:

- The Child and Youth Well-being Review examined the impacts of COVID-19 on children and youth and provided recommendations to government to help create a cross-government action plan.
- The government committed \$7.3 million over three years to support the expansion of youth mental health hubs.
- Annual funding of \$1.25 million was allocated for a 12-week Youth Recovery Program at Hull Services.
- Jack.org's Alberta COVID-19 Youth Mental Health Resource Hub provides accurate mental health information and resources for youth.

He's originally from Calgary, AB and has been playing hockey since he was 6 years old. He played Jr A hockey for the Medicine Hat Tigers and then received an invite to try out for Boston University's hockey team. If he made the team, he'd have all expenses and tuition taken care of. He didn't have enough money to get to Boston, so he began a journey of hitchhiking across the country. It took him 10 days to get there but he made the team, became Captain, and graduated with a Commerce degree (1956-59). While at Boston University, he also played for their baseball team for 2 years.

After Graduation, Larry moved to Edmonton and continued his education becoming a lawyer. He continued to play senior men's hockey throughout his entire life and these last 2 Covid years are the first time he has missed a season since he was 6 years old!

He is now training for a men's tournament in Kamloops where he'll be playing in the 45+ division...not the 70+ or 80+ division. Crazy!!

Larry's stats from BU are: 46 games, 43 goals, 51 assists, 94 total points. For comparison to current days, Jack Eichel also went to BU and his stats are 40 games, 26 goals, 45 assists, 71 total points. Larry was and still is an

amazing player!

Larry was born May 11, 1935 (87 yrs old) and currently resides in Westerose, AB.



MLA REPORT

from The Office of MLA Mark Smith, Member of the Legislative Assembly for Drayton Valley - Devon

More than 350,000 Albertans are of Ukrainian descent, including several in the Alberta Legislature. When fighting in Ukraine began, the government wasted no time in acting to support the people of Ukraine, by contributing a total \$10.3 million to support aid in Ukraine. This included \$5 million donated through the Ukrainian World Congress to equip 5,000 members of the Ukrainian Territorial Defence Force with defensive equipment, including flak jackets, helmets, bulletproof vests, first-aid kits, night-vision goggles, communications equipment, and essential fuel.

Ukrainian Albertans have contributed so much to our province's communities, culture, and economy, so I'm glad we could contribute to the effort in Ukraine at a time when support is most needed.

With European countries dependence on Russian oil and gas the war in Ukraine is proof that the world needs more Canadian oil and that our country must build energy infrastructure and boost oil exports. Alberta is a rights-respecting liberal democracy with the third largest energy reserves in the world. We can be a major force for global stability by displacing conflict oil from Russia and other dictatorships with Alberta oil. Albertans are some of the most generous people on earth. The situation in Ukraine has put a damper on the good economic news in Alberta, but I still want to update you on some exciting announcements that have happened in our province ever since the government tabled a landmark balanced budget.

The pandemic has highlighted a need to expand our healthcare system and increase capacity.

This past week, we announced that Budget 2022 will grow Alberta Health's total operating expense budget by \$600 million this year and by a total of \$1.8 billion by 2024-25. This will ensure we have the capacity we need to protect patient care and prepare for future health care demands.

We also announced this week that Budget 2022 contains an increase of more than \$700 million over the next three years to support teachers and to address cost pressures in schools, as well as \$110 million in new funding for the next three years to support the mental health and wellbeing of Alberta students.

We also found out this week that Budget 2022 includes about \$2.5 billion over three years in support of our new childcare agreement with the federal government. I am proud to report that since this agreement was announced, Drayton Valley- Devon families are experiencing lower costs for childcare, which remains on target to average \$10 per day by 2026.

Finally, earlier this week, we announced that Budget 2022 invests almost \$3.7 billion, a 6.3 per cent increase over last year, into continuing care programs and services for seniors and vulnerable Albertans. It also earmarks \$204 million in capital funding over three years to modernize existing continuing care facilities across the province and develop new continuing care spaces for Indigenous Peoples.



The TOPS Ten Things We Can Learn from Olympic Athletes

- 1. Fitness is not a destination. It's a journey. We see the Olympians when they're well down the road, but most of them have devoted many years to get where they are. Like them, we must start at the beginning.
- 2. Improvement is the goal. Olympic athletes are working hard all the time to shave a fraction of a second from their time, and the closer they get to their goal, the more difficult that becomes. They never settle.
- 3. Stay healthy. You can't win the game or finish the race if you're not healthy, so you have to take good care of your body in every respect.
- 4. Winning (or, in our case, losing) is as much about training the mind as it is about training the body. Mental discipline is key for athletes and for TOPS members. We must train our minds before our bodies can follow.
- 5. People will put forth a great amount of effort for a medal (or pin or pinette, or charm, or certificate). Awards and recognition matter -- not for what they are, but for what they represent.
- 6. You can't do it alone. Olympic athletes get lots of support from their teammates,

- family, friends, coaches, and others.
- 7. Great athletes don't always make the qualifying round. Just as a world-class spinter may miss a spot in the finals by 1/100th of a second, we may have days when the scale just doesn't reflect the hard work we've done.
- 8. Just as Olympians suffer sprains and strains, we may also run into problems. But, a surgery, pregnancy, or broken bone doesn't have to derail us long-term although, temporarily, it may mean sitting on the sidelines or scaling back our goals.
- 9. Even Olympians have off days...hurdlers trip, sprinters make false starts, and gymnasts fall off the beam. But they always get up and try again.
- 10. Olympians never give up on their dreams. Some want to win the gold medal, while others just strive to finish the race. But, whatever the goal, they give it all they've got.

Launch of the Canada Digital Adoption Program

OTTAWA: Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, wishes to advise the federal government's launch of the Canada Digital Adoption Program. The \$4-billion package of grants and loans is aimed at encouraging small and medium-sized businesses to expand their online presence. The program includes \$1.4 billion in grants and advisory services and up to \$2.6-billion in loans.

Applications for both grants and loans opened on March 3. 2022.

Smaller businesses with at least one employee can apply for a \$2,400 "micro-grant" to offset costs such as website development, search engine optimization, subscription fees for e-commerce platforms and social media advertising.

A larger "Boost Your Business Technology" grant worth up to \$15,000 will be available to companies with revenue between \$500,000 and \$100-million and fewer than 500 employees. The grant can be spent in areas like new customer software, digital inventory management systems, network security improvements and robotics.

In addition to the grant programs, companies can apply for an interest-free loan of up to \$100,000 from the Business Development Bank of Canada for digital adoption spending.

The government has partnered with Magnet, a not-forprofit organization, to place up to 16,800 students and young Canadians with businesses. The program involves a wage subsidy to employers of up to \$7,300 to retain a post-secondary student or recent postsecondary graduate.

His son was 18 years old now and able to make his own choices. The son would not come in. Immediately the wall of hail swept over the house and the young man. He was struck on the head and fell to the ground.
