



TOWN OF THORSBY Council Meeting Notes

Regular Council Meeting - March 15, 2022

Municipal Borrowing Bylaw

The Town of Thorsby's \$1M line of credit is to be renewed annually. The purpose is for operating expenditures and for short-term capital borrowing. First and Second readings of the bylaw were passed in council. This line of credit will provide a buffer for any cash flow concerns. This is a historical line of credit which requires a bylaw and currently the line of credit has not been used.

Easter Egg Hunt

Mercedes King was a delegate and requested \$250 for the Easter Egg Hunt on Saturday April 16 for the hotdogs, candy and hot chocolate at the Artic Spa Recreation Complex on April 16. It is an indoor event from 11am - 1pm and free to participants.

Thorsby Seniors Centre

The Senior Centre representative Phyliss Madiuk asked Council for \$5000 to help purchase a much-needed Bingo machine. The Seniors applied for and received a \$25,000 grant for the machine but are \$5,000 short. Phylis discussed the benefits of upgrading the bingo machine and encouraged everyone to come out to play bingo. The request will be taken to the budget meeting in the middle of April.

"Water for Life" Grant Application

Good News – There is a 100% fully funded grant for a feasibility study and at no risk to the Town of Thorsby. This grant was only discovered recently and already due but because of the hard work of our administration, Thorsby has been given a 3 week extension to complete this grant. The "Water for Life" Grant is just the first step of many in utilizing our large water plant to its potential. This initial study funded by the Alberta Government is to evaluate potential new regional systems. Our engineering company will provide the necessary information for a proposal to supply water to the region. Mayor Hostyn and Interim CAO Donna Tona have contacted many communities in the region, asked for letters of

support and it looks promising. This has potential to open a new source of revenue for Thorsby and build regional partnerships. By working together with the watershed groups, it helps our neighbors and will benefit the whole region, a shared prosperity. MLA Mark Smith has also been very helpful in this process.

The next Regular Council Meeting of Council will be on Tuesday, April 5 at 7pm.

PROVIDING RELIEF FOR FUEL AND UTILITY COSTS

Albertans will see lower fuel and utility bills through action to address rising costs.

Alberta's government will stop the collection of the provincial fuel tax to offer Albertans relief from current high fuel prices. Currently, Albertans pay 13 cents per litre in fuel tax. This change will come into effect April 1.

The federal carbon tax rate on gasoline is set to increase again on April 1, from just under nine cents per litre to just over 11 cents per litre.

"We've heard Albertans' concerns about the rising cost of living loud and clear. While the federal government is set to increase the carbon tax April 1, Alberta's government is taking the opposite approach and stepping up to offer relief. Stopping the provincial fuel tax puts money back in the pockets of Albertans when they need it most." Jason Kenney, Premier

Alberta's government will also provide \$150 electricity rebates to help Albertans pay for the high bills they faced this winter. More than one million homes, farms and businesses are expected to receive a \$50 monthly rebate for three months. These retroactive rebates will help defray the high costs that many families and businesses paid in recent months.

Alberta's government will work with utilities and regulators to determine exact details, including rebate timing. This includes working to have the rebates applied directly to consumers' bills.

This rebate will combine with the Natural Gas Rebate program announced in Budget 2022 to provide real relief for Albertans.

Collection of the fuel tax will be paused for:

gasoline – \$0.13 per litre
diesel – \$0.13 per litre
marked gasoline and marked diesel – \$0.04
Because the GST also applies to provincial fuel taxes,
the 13-cent reduction will also reduce the GST by 0.65
cents per litre, for total tax savings of about 13.6 cents per
litre of gasoline and diesel.

The government will review the collection of the fuel tax on a quarterly basis and, if required, consider reinstating collection in stages, based on the average price of West Texas Intermediate (WTI) over a number of weeks. The government will not start to reinstate collection before July 1.

Alberta's fuel tax is reported and remitted by refiners and large wholesalers and included in the price Albertans pay at the pump. The government will provide information for stakeholders, including fuel retailers, on the fuel tax pause.





LEDUC RCMP TACKLE VEHICLE THEFT WITH EDUCATION AND TARGETED ENFORCEMENT

Leduc, Alta. – Last month Leduc RCMP officers conducted Operation Cold Start patrols in conjunction with police forces across Alberta. In an effort to educate the community about preventing vehicle theft, members would look for unattended, idling vehicles and determine if the keys were in the ignition.

"Our goal was to educate Leduc residents and work with them to reduce vehicle thefts, ultimately making it tougher on would be thieves, as often vehicle thefts are a crime of opportunity," says Constable Cheri-Lee Smith, Leduc RCMP Community Policing.

Throughout the Cold Start patrols, Leduc officers found 58 unlocked, idling vehicles with the keys in the ignition. When possible, an officer would speak to the vehicle owner to provide vehicle theft prevention tips.

"Throughout Operation Cold Start, we used criminal analysis and hotspot targeting to assist us in patrolling areas in the community that were know to have recently been targeted for crime in an effort to education residence and reduce crime" says Inspector Jeff McBeth, Leduc RCMP Detachment commander.

In the month of January, Leduc RCMP recovered 10 stolen vehicles.

In January, Leduc RCMP experienced an increase of 36% in reports of motor vehicle theft than in January of 2021. Approximately 25% of all stolen vehicles in Alberta are stolen while idling, and increases are usually tied to cold snaps where more vehicles are left idling.

Leduc RCMP would like to offer Leduc residents some tips to help keep their vehicles safe:

- If possible, look into command start options as a means to warm your vehicle.
- Steering wheel locking devices are effective options that can help mitigate theft.
- When starting your car, or allowing the engine to warm up prior to driving, ensure that you are in the vehicle.
- Never leave valuable items like purses, wallets, keys or change in an unoccupied vehicle.
- Always place keys to vehicles in a safe place, out of plain sight and in a secure location.
- Lock vehicle doors all the time, even if you are parked in your driveway or garage at home.
- Never leave your vehicle unattended if it is running or the keys are in it.

THORSBY HISTORY

Mrs. Burgess Hospital Near Thorsby

In 1926 Mr. and Mrs. Edward Burgess and their 8 children moved onto the S.W. 23-49-1-W5 which was unimproved bush land. They established a home on the quarter and when the hamlet of Thorsby began after the C.P.R. railway came through, their home was only a mile north of it.

In 1930 Dr. M. Hankin came to the district to practise as a medical doctor. Realizing a desperate need for a facility where expectant mothers could await the birth of their babies, and, assessing Mrs. Burgess as a kind and efficient woman capable of managing such a home, he asked her to undertake the operation; she made room in their home for a bed and care for a person if the need should arise.

The first patient she had was the Burgess's own daughter, and a baby was delivered safely. The next case proved to be a tragedy. The patient, a young woman in labour, was brought to the Burgess home by team and sleigh in stormy weather. The birth was going to be difficult and Dr. Hankin had her taken on to an Edmonton hospital using the railway tracks as a road. Upon reaching the city hospital nothing could be done to save the patient and both she and the unborn baby died.

As the demand for more patient care arose, Edward, Mrs. Burgess's husband, built an addition 30 by 70 feet onto their log house. He followed the trade of stuccoing and plastering and was working in Edmonton, therefore, the work on the extension could only be done on weekends. It was finally finished and two rows of native spruce trees were set out along the winding drive way leading from the road to the house.

Patients increased and almost every week a new baby was born. Other patients also arrived, men who were hurt in sawmill accidents in the western regions of the area and also people who were ill with pneumonia and other ailments. Since many families lived in small homes that were cold and drafty and very overcrowded, the sick recovered sooner if they could be placed in a warmer and less crowded home.


Mrs. Burgess had no medical training but had years of experience in caring for her own children and family. Local girls or women were hired to help with the housework and care of the patients.

A baby was born prematurely once and an incubator was improvised by lining a grape basket with hot water bottles and keeping the baby warm in it. The infant weighed only about 3 lbs at birth but survived and grew up to become a pharmacist.

The days were long and the work very hard for Mrs. Burgess and in 1938 a typhoid fever epidemic hit the district. She was then 56 years of age and she too caught the fever from a patient. The illness confined her to an Edmonton hospital for 7 long months.

During this period of time her son Harry and his wife looked after the hospital. It remained in service to the area until 1941 when Dr. Hankin joined the Canadian Armed Forces and went overseas.

The little hospital was then closed down and Mr. and Mrs. Burgess moved into Edmonton where they retired. Their daughter and son-in-law Ida and Bernard Barager took the farm over and used the empty hospital building for a barn for their stock for 5 years. It was later torn down and the debris of it removed from view. There is today, in 1979, only a depression where the basement was once upon-a-time and the tree lined drive way, which has been abandoned, to remind local people of the hospital. There are many men and women living in the area who were born in the hospital and were ministered to by the kind Irish woman or her helpers in the decade and more the hospital was in existence.

RED DEER RCMP WARN COMMUNITY OF SCAM TARGETING SENIORS

Red Deer, Alta. - Red Deer RCMP are warning citizens of a fraud specifically targeted at grandparents. On Mar. 3 Red Deer RCMP received a report of a bail scam targeted at a Red Deer senior. The fraud was very similar to occurrences that have been reported across Canada in the last few weeks.

In the Red Deer incident, the suspect contacted a senior pretending to be their grandchild. The suspect stated that he had been arrested in the United States and needed bail money. The suspect warned the victim that there was a "gag order" posted on the bond and that they must not tell anyone about the money.

The scam became more elaborate as the victim received calls from persons impersonating both American and Canadian police officers. The victim was instructed to withdraw cash and informed a courier would pick it up from their residence later that day. Over the course of several days, the victim was contacted multiple times and instructed to withdraw more money to assist their grandson with his legal costs. Ultimately, the victim was defrauded of \$50,000.

"These fraudsters are highly-skilled at manipulation and use fear, panic, guilt and empathy to prey on people," says Cst. Nadeau of the Red Deer RCMP. "Their techniques are elaborate and quite convincing. They often search social media for information to enhance their credibility and knowledge of their victim."

Red Deer RCMP provide the following tips to recognize impersonation fraud and avoid becoming a victim:

- Don't be afraid to say no. Fraudsters use highpressure tactics like creating a sense of urgency or secrecy to cloud your judgement.
- Verify the caller. Hang up and call the person or business that the caller is claiming to be – even when the caller is claiming to be a police officer.
- Don't be secretive. Fraudsters will pressure you to lie to your bank, the police or family about what is happening. Financial institutions will often intervene if customers withdraw large quantities of cash to ensure they are not being victimized. Fraudsters often coach their victims to say they are doing home renovations, purchasing a used car, or provide other legitimate reasons for the large cash withdrawals. This is a big red flag.
- Do your research. New scams are invented daily, but likely someone has already experienced it and reported it. Call or visit the Canadian Antifraud Centre website to read up on what scams are currently "trending".
- Never give out personal information. Beware of calls where you are asked to provide your name, address, birthdate, Social Insurance Number,

- credit card or banking information, and other personal family details.
- Be careful about what you share on social media. Even limited information on profiles can provide a wealth of opportunity for fraudsters. Be wary of how sharing pictures, connecting with family members or joining groups may make you more vulnerable.

If you believe you have been defrauded or know someone who has, contact the Red Deer RCMP at 403-343-5575 or your local police service. You should also report it to the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre (CAFC). The CAFC collects information on fraud and identity theft across Canada.

What About Job?

I have been told that God allows evil things to happen to people, so if we are sick and poor, we should just be thankful that God loves us enough to train us. This false teaching I heard, was supposedly supported by the story of Job. However, if we read Job with an understanding of who God is and what he has done for us, it is obvious that God is not permitting evil things to happen on earth. As I explained in a previous article: "Who Is In Control," (January 21st in The Thorsby Target and January 26th in The Breton Booster), God gave control of the earth to mankind; then mankind gave his authority and control to Satan. God created the Heavens and Earth, and His creation was very good, but man handed the earth over to the enemy of God. The story of Job takes place in this very setting, where Satan, who wants to destroy mankind has authority on earth where mankind lives. Job was a very prosperous man who feared God, and God had placed a special hedge of protection around Job. Then the Adversary answered the LORD, saying, "Has Job feared God for nothing? Have You not made a hedge around him, around his household, and around all that he has on every side? He blotted out the handwriting of ordinances that was against us and contrary to us, and He took it out of the way, nailing it to the cross. And having disarmed authorities and powers, He made a show of them openly, triumphing over them by the cross (Col. 2:13-15). Satan has been disarmed by Jesus. All authority in Heaven and on Earth has now been given to Jesus. Then Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Amen (Mat. 28:18-20). Jesus gave us the use of His authority on earth. One of Jesus' commandments to His disciples was to heal the sick and cast out devils (Mark 16:15-18). He said to them, "I saw Satan as lightning fall from heaven. Look, I give you authority to trample on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy. And nothing shall by any means hurt you (Luke 10:18-19).
