

BRETON RCMP INVESTIGATING RECOVERED WATERCRAFT

Buck Lake, Alta - On Feb.13, 2022, Breton RCMP were called to an isolated lease site where two watercraft and an aluminum trailer were recovered. The two watercraft and trailer were identified as the following:

- Trailer: Single axle, dual watercraft unit. Currently Black but appears it may have been White originally.


The TOPS Ten Things We Can Learn from Olympic Athletes

- 1. Fitness is not a destination. It's a journey. We see the Olympians when they're well down the road, but most of them have devoted many years to get where they are. Like them, we must start at the beginning.
- 2. Improvement is the goal. Olympic athletes are working hard all the time to shave a fraction of a second from their time, and the closer they get to their goal, the more difficult that becomes. They never settle.
- 3. Stay healthy. You can't win the game or finish the race if you're not healthy, so you have to take good care of your body in every respect.
- 4. Winning (or, in our case, losing) is as much about training the mind as it is about training the body. Mental discipline is key for athletes and for TOPS members. We must train our minds before our bodies can follow.
- 5. People will put forth a great amount of effort for a medal (or pin or pinette, or charm, or certificate). Awards and recognition matter -- not for what they are, but for what they represent.
- 6. You can't do it alone. Olympic athletes get lots of support from their teammates,

- family, friends, coaches, and others.
- 7. Great athletes don't always make the qualifying round. Just as a world-class spinter may miss a spot in the finals by 1/100th of a second, we may have days when the scale just doesn't reflect the hard work we've done.
- 8. Just as Olympians suffer sprains and strains, we may also run into problems. But, a surgery, pregnancy, or broken bone doesn't have to derail us long-term although, temporarily, it may mean sitting on the sidelines or scaling back our goals.
- 9. Even Olympians have off days...hurdlers trip, sprinters make false starts, and gymnasts fall off the beam. But they always get up and try again.
- 10. Olympians never give up on their dreams. Some want to win the gold medal, while others just strive to finish the race. But, whatever the goal, they give it all they've got.

PROVIDING MORE ACCESS TO SUICIDE PREVENTION SUPPORTS

Alberta's government is providing additional funding for community organizations supporting youth mental health and suicide prevention.

The new youth suicide prevention grant program is accepting applications from community organizations until April 8. Local youth-focused organizations know their communities well and do important work to support the mental health of Alberta's youth. These grants will build on the work they are already doing to support youth mental health.

"As young people continue to navigate the unique challenges caused by the pandemic, it is more important than ever that they feel heard, valued and supported. This funding will help youth community organizations continue to do the important work of supporting the mental health of at-risk young adults." Rebecca Schulz, Minister of Children's Services

Funding totalling \$3 million will focus on making sure young Albertans have access to effective suicide prevention supports and services, providing access to evidence-based training for those who support young people and reducing stigma through awareness campaigns so that youth and families are more likely to seek help related to suicide.

In 2019, the Government of Alberta launched Building Strength, Inspiring Hope: A Provincial Action Plan for Youth Suicide Prevention 2019-2024. This program will help advance the outcomes laid out in the plan and continue the work that has been achieved over the last two years.

Quick facts

Alberta's government is already taking steps to help children and youth navigate the past couple of years:

- The Child and Youth Well-being Review examined the impacts of COVID-19 on children and youth and provided recommendations to government to help create a cross-government action plan.
- The government committed \$7.3 million over three years to support the expansion of youth mental health hubs.
- Annual funding of \$1.25 million was allocated for a 12-week Youth Recovery Program at Hull Services.
- Jack.org's Alberta COVID-19 Youth Mental Health Resource Hub provides accurate mental health information and resources for youth.

The Bible Truth Page What About Job?

I have been told that God allows evil things to happen to people, so if we are sick and poor, we should just be thankful that God loves us enough to train us. This false teaching I heard, was supposedly supported by the story of Job. However, if we read Job with an understanding of who God is and what he has done for us, it is obvious that God is not permitting evil things to happen on earth. As I explained in a previous article: "Who Is In Control," (January 21st in The Thorsby Target and January 26th in The Breton Booster), God gave control of the earth to mankind; then mankind gave his authority and control to Satan. God created the Heavens and Earth, and His creation was very good, but man handed the earth over to the enemy of God. The story of Job takes place in this very setting, where Satan, who wants to destroy mankind has authority on earth where mankind lives. Job was a very prosperous man who feared God, and God had placed a special hedge of protection around Job. Then the Adversary answered the LORD, saying, "Has Job feared God for nothing? Have You not made a hedge around him, around his household, and around all that he has on every side? You have blessed the work of his hands, and his possessions have increased in the land (Modern English Version Job 1:9-10). God was protecting Job from Satan's oppression. When Satan came before God in Job chapter one, he asked God to remove that special hedge of protection. The LORD said to the Adversary, "Look, all that he has is in your power; only do not stretch out your hand against his person." So the Adversary departed from the presence of the LORD (Job 1:12). All that Job had was already in Satan's power. All God did was remove part of the hedge of protection; Satan was not allowed to take Job's life. In the end God gave Job twice as much as he had before. We are not at all in the same position as Job. On this side of the cross believers in Christ are not directly under Satan's rule. And you, being dead in your sins and the uncircumcision of your flesh, He has resurrected together with Him, having forgiven you all sins. He blotted out the handwriting of ordinances that was against us and contrary to us, and He took it out of the way, nailing it to the cross. And having disarmed authorities and powers, He made a show of them openly, triumphing over them by the cross (Col. 2:13-15). Satan has been disarmed by Jesus. All authority in Heaven and on Earth has now been given to Jesus. Then Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Amen (Mat. 28:18-20). Jesus gave us the use of His authority on earth. One of Jesus' commandments to His disciples was to heal the sick and cast out devils (Mark 16:15-18). He said to them, "I saw Satan as lightning fall from heaven. Look, I give you authority to trample on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy. And nothing shall by any means hurt you (Luke 10:18-19). Satan has been reduced to the position of a thief. He has no right or authority in the life of a believer in Jesus Christ. Like a thief he can't steal from you if there is a policeman on guard. In Christ Jesus you are the police! Tell him to leave in Jesus name!! He must obey!!

MLA REPORT

from The Office of MLA Mark Smith, Member of the Legislative Assembly for Drayton Valley - Devon

Alberta's economic recovery continues to move forward. That means more good jobs for Albertans.

The latest number from Statistics Canada are in, and February marked the fourth straight month of job gains for our province. The February increase of 8,200 jobs saw our unemployment rate fall to 6.8 per cent, the lowest rate we've seen since September 2019.

As our economy has started to boom, I have heard from employers in the Drayton Valley-Devon constituency who are concerned about their ability to fill positions. This is a very valid concern and something our United Conservative government is working hard to get ahead of.

Earlier in our term, we passed Bill 49, the Labour Mobility Act, which will address impending labour shortages, particularly in rural Alberta, by streamlining a consistent and transparent approach for recognizing the skills, education, and credentials of out-of-province workers.

We also recently announced the launch of the Rural Renewal Stream and the Rural Entrepreneur Stream. These streams will encourage skilled and talented professionals and entrepreneurs from around the world to settle in rural communities.

With many of our rural communities struggling to find qualified professionals to meet their current and future workforce needs, these new initiatives will help attract and retain newcomers who want to contribute to our rural communities.

Every job added means another Albertan receiving a regular pay cheque. Every drop in unemployment means more Albertans returning to the workforce. Our fast-improving job market is good news for job-creators across our province who are looking to fill positions.

Although our economy is improving, I have been hearing concerns from some families about rising energy costs this winter due, in part, to market conditions, the punishing federal carbon tax, and the long-term impacts of short-sighted NDP policies. Until these costs subside, I want to take this moment to tell you what our government is doing to address this issue for you.

Alberta's government will be providing \$150 in electricity rebates to nearly two million homes, farms, and businesses to help retroactively cover the high costs they faced this winter. Exact rebate criteria will be determined soon, but is expected to include most households, farms, and small businesses. Alberta's government will also be stopping the collection of the provincial fuel tax of 13.6 cents per litre starting April 1. This will apply to all gasoline and diesel, including marked farm fuel. Our government will review the collection of the fuel tax on a quarterly basis and, if required, consider reinstating collection in stages, based on the average price of West Texas Intermediate over several weeks. We will not start to reinstate collection before July 1.

Comparisons have been made between these initiatives and the NDP rate-cap. The NDP rate-cap cleverly hid the true cost of energy by shifting the burden from the ratepayer to the taxpayer, plus it only provided relief to about half of the ratepayers in Alberta. This was not a sustainable solution. The United Conservative electricity rebate is putting \$150 back in the pockets of ratepayers to account for high costs this winter, as we aggressively address the core problems behind prices. Albertans elected us on promises of fiscal accountability and that is exactly what we are doing.

Finally, my heart is with the people of Ukraine, as they fight for their freedom and sovereignty. I have been made aware of several fundraising efforts in the constituency that will be happening this March and early April. One will occur in Breton and the other I am aware of is in Drayton Valley. 
