

MATCHING DONATIONS FOR SPORT, RECREATION PROGRAMS

Alberta's government is matching up to \$350,000 in donations to eligible provincial sport, physical activity and recreation programs beginning April 1.

This donation-matching campaign is part of *Creative Partnerships Alberta*, an initiative to find new ways to support non-profits. It will leverage private donations to help boost revenue for sport, physical activity and recreation organizations during this time of recovery and growth.

Albertans can make their gift through the new Sport, Physical Activity and Recreation (SPAR) Donation Fund Program online portal from April 1 to Aug. 30.

Albertans rely on the essential services sport, physical activity and recreation programs provide for their physical and mental health, and their quality of life. The sector's access to timely revenue increases the ability of sector organizations to adapt and respond to organizational and community issues.

Quick facts

- Individual donations up to \$1,000 will be accepted for matching from April 1 to Aug. 30, 2022, or until the \$350,000 commitment is spent.
- Eligible donation recipients may receive up to \$10,000 in matching funds.
- Creative Partnerships Alberta is a bold initiative to build a thriving non-profit sector by sparking private investment in non-profits, growing social enterprises and increasing collaboration to find new solutions to social challenges. This initiative will:
- Increase private funding and support to nonprofits and arts organizations through new

- funding approaches.
- Grow social innovation and social finance.
- Provide non-profits with mentorship and coaching.
- More Creative Partnerships Alberta programs and collaborations will be announced in the coming months.
- Creative Partnerships is part of the government's commitment to grow creative and cultural industries in the province by 25 per cent over the next 10 years and is an important part of Alberta's Recovery Plan.

Just a Reminder...

As per Bylaw 177-21

- When an Alarm System generates more than one False Alarm within a 12 month period, the Village may charge the owner or occupant of the Premises a fee relating to the Response as set out in the Fee Schedule "A".
- The Village may recover the fee as per Schedule "A" as a debt due and owing to the Village, or in the case of action taken by the Fire Department in respect of land within the Village, where the fee is not paid upon demand by the Village, then in default of payment, such fee may be charged against the land as taxes due and owing in respect of that land.

The following fees and charges are established in accordance with the False Alarms Bylaw 177-21: 1. For the second false alarm \$500

2. For the third false alarm \$1,500

3. For the fourth false alarm and any subsequent response to a false alarm\$3,000



Walter Bruce Carstairs

September 11, 1925 – March 12, 2022

On March 12, 2022 Walter Bruce Carstairs, formerly of Warburg, passed away at the age of 96 after years of battling numerous infections. Wally managed his illnesses with strength and grace, and never once complained about the pain.

Wally was born to Walter and Alma Carstairs on a farm near Glenevis. The second child in a family of four, Wally didn't have the opportunity for much formal education. He enlisted in the army prior to his 18th birthday. He ultimately ended up on the front lines in Europe until the end of the war. Wally didn't widely share his WWII experience but was always a proud veteran and earned a lifetime membership to the Royal Canadian Legion.

At the end of the war, Wally returned home and married Grace Tookey in 1948. Together they raised six children. They farmed in the Cherhill area until 1964 and then moved to the village of Warburg where Wally lived until he entered Salem Manor nursing home in the summer of 2018.

Wally is predeceased by his wife Grace and sons Bruce, Dwayne, Randy and Darcy; granddaughter Mary; sister Belle (Art); and brothers Doug (Marjorie) and George (Patricia). Secure your cargo

As a driver, you are responsible for making sure the cargo you are carrying is secured to your vehicle.

- ▶ Use tie-down straps to properly secure objects.
- ▶ Place light objects lower in the container instead of on the top, to prevent them from exiting the container.
- ▶ Tie large items, like mattresses and construction equipment, directly to your vehicle with appropriate tie-down straps.
- ▶ Put loose items, like garbage and yard waste, in a covered container so they are easier to secure.
- Attach a safety flag to any items that extend beyond the back of your vehicle so they are more visible to other motorists.
- ▶ Place a tarp over loose items or those that billow in the wind to ensure they don't fall from your vehicle.
- ▶ If you are transporting earth, sand, gravel or other loose material, it must be at least 75 millimetres below the top of the container or your truck's box, and must be completely covered at all times.

ALBERTA RCMP WARN OF SCAM TARGETING GRANDPARENTS

The Alberta RCMP Federal Serious & Organized Crime Branch is warning the public of a fraudulent scam that is circulating throughout Alberta and Canada. These are referred to as "Grandparent" or "Grandchild" scams.

These scams often involve a phone call being placed to the victim claiming their grandchild is in trouble with the courts or law enforcement and a payment of cash is needed to help them. The suspects will often pretend to be police or a judge and caution the victims not to tell anyone about the transaction and a courier will be sent to the house to pick up the cash in person or have it sent in the mail.

This month alone, Alberta RCMP have received five complaints of this type of scam with a total loss of over \$100,000 to the victims. Not only is there a concern for the amount of money being lost, but a great concern for these couriers showing up in person to collect the cash.

With March being Fraud Prevention month, the Alberta RCMP want to remind residents of Alberta to:

- Never withdraw or send money to anyone you don't know:
- If the person is saying a family member is in trouble, confirm with that family member first prior to taking any action;
- If the person claims to be police or a judge, call that police service or court house directly to confirm that situation – police and courts will never demand cash be picked up in person or mailed; and
- Never give out personal information over the phone or online to someone you don't know—the police or courts will not ask for personal information over the phone.

Should you have fallen victim to this or any other scam, please call your local RCMP or police of jurisdiction.

2022 Dust Control Program

Leduc County is currently accepting applications for our 2022 dust control program. There are two product choices available:

1. Calcium chloride

- Calcium chloride is a top shoot dust control product that is applied by spraying over the gravel surface.
- Two applications of product will be completed for every residence applying for this dust control product. The second application will be automatically applied approximately six-to-eight weeks after the first application (weather permitting).
- Residents desiring a calcium chloride dust control product on the County road adjacent to their residence will be required to complete an application form and must prepay a fee of \$381.50 for the first 122 metres (400 feet).
 Dust control requested beyond 122 metres (400 feet) will be charged an additional \$8.93/metre.

2. Incorporated petroleum

- Incorporated dust control is a petroleum-based product that is applied to the road surface and mixed in and packed by graders.
- It is warrantied for one year from the date of application.
- Residents desiring an incorporated dust control product on the County road adjacent to their residence will be required to complete an application form and must prepay a fee of \$3,791.50 for the first 122 metres (400 feet). Dust control beyond 122 metress (400 feet) will be charged an additional \$36.89/metre.

Other information

- GST will be added to all prices listed above.
- The prices listed are after receiving a Leduc County subsidy of \$708.50 per strip.
- This subsidy is provided to County residents living in permanent residences along a county gravel road.
- Businesses will be charged the full rate without subsidy.
- The dust control program begins as soon as possible after seasonal road bans have been lifted.

How to apply

- NEW THIS YEAR, dust control applications can be filled out and paid for online. To apply and pay for dust control online, visit www.leduc-county.com/dust-control. Apply online beginning April 1.
- Application forms are also available for pick up at our Road Operations department, located at 1103 5 Street in Nisku.
 - If you aren't applying online, applications with payment can be mailed to 1101 5 St., Nisku, AB T9E 2X3 or delivered in person to our Services Building, which is located at 1103 – 5 Street in Nisku.
- Applications are due on May 15.

Register. Tell your family. Be inspired.

The Humboldt Broncos bus crash occurred on April 6, 2018. 14 people were killed and 15 injured when a bus and semi-trailer truck collided near Armley, Saskatchewan. Logan Boulet passed away on April 7th. On April 11th Dayna Brons passed, bringing the total to 16 deaths and 13 injured, all of whom will bear physical and emotional scars for life. Most of the dead and injured were players from the Humboldt Broncos junior ice hockey team that plays in the Saskatchewan Junior Hockey League (SJHL).

Bernadine and Toby Boulet offered to donate Logan Boulet's organs and tissues so that lives could be saved. They did so because Logan had registered as an organ donor and had spoken to his parents about his wishes. Logan was inspired by one of his coaches, Ric Suggitt, who passed on June 27th, 2017 and became an organ donor.

Logan was able to donate his organs and tissues so that six lives can live on.

Quick facts

- Green Shirt Day is April 7 each year. People are encouraged to wear green. The purpose of the day is to encourage people to register as organ donors and to speak with their family about their wishes.
- In a phenomenon that has come to be known as the Logan Boulet Effect, almost 150,000 Canadians registered as organ donors in the weeks following the Humboldt crash in 2018.
- The next year, Green Shirt Day 2019 inspired another hundred thousand or more to register.
- Logan's legacy reminds us how important it is for Canadians to talk with their family about their organ donation wishes. It's suggested that for every person who registers their intent to donate, they speak with an average of four others about organ donation. That means that

- 100,000 new registrants equals approximately 400,000 conversations.
- 90 per cent of Canadians say they support organ and tissue donation, but only about 32 per cent have actually completed their registration.
- More than 4,100 people in Canada are waiting for an organ transplant.
- Every year, on average, 250 people in Canada die because they don't get the life-saving organ they need.
- One organ donor can save up to eight lives.
- A tissue donor can improve the lives of up to 75 patients.
- Anyone can be a potential donor regardless of age, medical condition or sexual orientation. Even individuals with serious illnesses may sometimes be donors. All potential donors are evaluated on an individual, medical, case-bycase basis.
- The oldest Canadian organ donor was 92 and the oldest tissue donor was 104. Don't rule yourself out.
- It takes 2 minutes to register your decision to become an organ donor

The Bible Truth Page Don't Judge

We are clearly instructed in the Word of God to refrain from judging people. The Bible was written in Greek and later translated into English. The Greek word often translated "judge" is Strong's number G2919, which means: condemn, try to punish, avenge, damn, or sentence. That is harsh, and it is not the place of any Christian to treat other people that way, nor decide what their fate will be. Even Jesus said, "If anyone hears My words and does not believe, I do not judge him. For I did not come to judge the world, but to save the world" (Modern English Version John 12:47). When Jesus was here, He didn't even judge people, and He lived a perfect life. So, it makes perfect sense for Him to tell us not to judge that way. Have a look at what else Jesus said, "Judge not, that you be not judged. For with what judgment you judge, you will be judged. And with the measure you use, it will be measured again for you. "And why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not consider the plank that is in your own eye? Or how will you say to your brother, 'Let me pull the speck out of your eye,' when a log is in your own eye? You hypocrite! First take the plank out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your brother's eye" (Matt. 7:1-5). He makes a good point. It seems when people want to judge others, they themselves are doing the same thing which they are accusing someone else of. Usually, the judgemental person is not trying to help, but to condemn. Jesus is saying that if you want to help someone with issues in their life, first you need to clean up the issues in your own life. He didn't say that you should never try to help anyone get onto the right track. Nor did He say you should never notice that another person is not on the right track. He is simply saying don't condemn people, and clean yourself up first. Refraining from judging (G2919) other people doesn't mean we have to live in ignorance. Jesus went on in chapter 7; "Beware of false prophets who come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravenous wolves. You will know them by their fruit. Do men gather grapes from thorns, or figs from thistles? Even so, every good tree bears good fruit. But a corrupt tree bears evil fruit. A good tree cannot bear evil fruit, nor can a corrupt tree bear good fruit. Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. Therefore, by their fruit you will know them" (Matt. 7:15-20). Jesus is even more specific in Chapter 12; "Either make the tree good and its fruit good, or else make the tree corrupt and its fruit corrupt. For the tree is known by its fruit. O generation of vipers, how can you, being evil, speak good things? For out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks. A good man out of the good treasure of his heart brings forth good things. And an evil man out of the evil treasure brings forth evil things. But I say to you that for every idle word that men speak, they will give an account on the Day of Judgment. For by your words you will be justified, and by your words you will be condemned" (Matt. 12:33-37). No doubt we need to be able to make good judgments in life, and we are even commanded to make certain kinds of judgements and recognize what kind of characters people have. Paul told his followers to know the people they were working with because he didn't want them to be easily led astray. "And we beseech you, brethren, to know them which labour among you, and are over you in the Lord, and admonish you" (KJV 1Thes. 5:12). You can't believe everything you hear. Paul said again; "Prove all things; hold fast that which is good" (KJV 1 Thes. 5:21). "Prove" in this verse means to test, examine, scrutinise. We must be able to know what a person is like before we decide to trust them. Recognizing sin in a person's life or even trying to help them find the right path in life is not judging and condemning them.
